





Dear Mr. President:

Your decision to designate 1983 as the Year of the German-American Tricentennial was a most important one, and as this year of festive celebration draws to a close, I thought it might be appropriate to draw to your attention the splendid role played by USIA in assuring a successful commemoration.

Although the preparations had a somewhat belated start, Charlie Wick took the reins and gave the project momentum. During the period of my Chairmanship of the Commission, I came to know of the splendid work that the dedicated USIA staff performed on behalf of this year of celebration, and I take the liberty of making specific mention of Mr. Vic Olason, a USIA employee who served also as Executive Director of the Tricentennial Commission.

Mr. Olason assembled a competent team of professionals, performed splendid liaison work with Charlie Wick's office, and marshalled his troops for the very busy period highlighted by the visit of President Carstens to the United States.
