We need your immediate help. I will make the story short.

My Father, Josef Werwein and we 3 children rented the upstairs of a townowned house in <u>Habach</u> (between Munich and Garmisch, 7 km from Murnau).
When the US occupation troups moved into Bavaria they chose as one of their
quarters our house, and we were promptly evicted. My Father did no know where
to take us 3 children, my Mother died of lockjaw in 1942, and so he was
alone with us 3, with bombs and horrors all around us. The Mayor of Habach
Mr Sonner (now deceased) came to our rescue and advised my father to go out
1 mile from town where Papa owned a 1 1/2 acre strip of land, and build himself
a shelter, a little house for the 4 of us. So Papa did. He got nothing in
writing from the Mayor, just the word and permission to build a place for
in that time of tumult no one thought that later things would be questioned.
My Father remembers the US officials to also consent & give this permission.
The US soldiers used our former place of abode for kitchen and mess hall.

Now after 40 years the people who give permits for building (Land register) found out that our little humble house exists, and all that without the proper permits!!! My Dad improved it gradually and slowly and now it is a liveable but humble home where my Father still lives alone at age 82. Now we are informed that the house has to be torn down at our expense, unless we can come up with proof before Oct. 1, 1985 that indeed the US Army occupied our former house, and that we were forced under those circumstances, and that with the consent of the Mayor, to build a place, and the US govt. approval.

I know you are a great President and man who feels the hurts and concerns of people and I know you will be able to help us. My husband and I are planning shortly to move back to my Father to care for him in his old age.

But they want to take away the roof from over his and our heads! Please provide us with such statement to the effect that the US troups were in HABACH, to save our home. I contacted the Archives of Modern Military, they will try their best but gave me little hope. If such proof can not be found with the Archives, I beg of you to come to our rescue, because it was due to the US that this happened to us (but not blaming you at all) The time is short, PLEASE HELP!! You will recall that in your meeting with him, Ambassador van Well urged that the President meet briefly with Foreign Minister Genscher in mid-April. State has now endorsed Genscher's request (Tab II). I am struck, however, that State's endorsement is couched in terms of "the Department" rather then "Shultz personally." Given the overall constraints on the President's schedule and fact that the President did not meet with FDP leader, Economics Minister Bangemann during his recent visit, you may wish to double-check to ensure that the Secretary really wishes to push this meeting.

From a scheduling perspective, a meeting seems possible. Moreover, the President does from time-to-time meet with Foreign Ministers from leading Allied countries; and the timing is such that it offers us a chance to plug our East-West agenda, both with the Germans and publicly. Should you decide to move ahead, I have attached a schedule proposal.

Subject: Appointment Request: FRG Foreign Minister Hans-Dietrich Genscher

Foreign Minister Genscher wishes to make an official visit to Washington April 14-16 and has requested a brief appointment with the President. The Department of State believes it would be useful for the President to see Genscher.

Genscher would be calling on the President not only in his capacity as foreign minister but as a leading figure in the Free Democratic Party. The FDP will almost certainly play a crucial role in the formation of the next FRG government in January 1987. While Genscher has stepped down from the post of FDP Chairman, he continues to play a central role in party decisions on domestic and foreign policy issues.

Genscher shows no signs of flagging or losing influence within the coalition. Indeed, in recent months his influence on FRG foreign policy has appeared to increase, leading to occasional friction with Chancellor Kohl and periodic differences with Washington on issues such as the nature of FRG participation in SDI. A meeting with the President during this important FRG pre-election period would give us the opportunity to impress upon Genscher at the highest level our views on U.S.-FRG and East-West relations.



You have agreed to meet with the German Ambassador, Guenther van Well, on Tuesday, February 25. Van Well (who will be accompanied by Embassy Political Counselor, Gerhard Henze) will be seeking a State visit by Chancellor Kohl in October. You will recall that Horst Teltschik mentioned this to you personally; he has now also sent you a privacy channel message (Tab A) about Kohl's request. An upbeat reply to Teltschik is at Tab I.

Van Well made the official German request in a meeting with Whitehead on February 21. I recommend that you outline for van Well the procedure for handling such requests, note the President's high esteem for and close working relationship with Kohl, and predict that a meeting will take place -- I don't think we can turn Kohl down. You may also wish to promise a relatively early answer, but lament that the process will inevitably take time. I will submit the Schedule Proposal as soon as State sends its endorsing memo. As a footnote, Gahl Hodges has or will certainly be laying the groundwork with Mrs. Reagan to make the Kohl visit one of the social events of the fall season.

Van Well will also be pushing for a Genscher meeting with the President in mid-April. It is unclear whether Shultz will endorse Genscher's request. While we must always take into consideration coalition politics, Economics Minister Bangemann -- who is head of the FDP -- did not see the President. This, and the usual scheduling constraints, would argue against a Presidential meeting with Genscher. I suspect van Well will push hard because after so many years as Foreign Minister, most German Ambassadors live in fear of Genscher. I recommend that you simply say we will give the request full consideration.

Van Well will likely also ask you about latest developments in the Philippines. You may wish to ask him about German reaction to our response to Gorbachev.

### ISSUE STOLTENBERG IS EXPECTED TO RAISE:

International Monetary Reform: Stoltenberg can be expected to emphasize strong German opposition to any fundamental reforms in the international monetary system, particularly adoption of "target zone" proposals for managing exchange rates. He will express concern that an international monetary conference could create unrealistic expectations, lead to LDC demands for financial concessions, and result in a political confrontation. The Germans are concerned that the United States is planning to spring such a major monetary initiative at the Tokyo Summit.

# Suggested Talking Points:

- o United States is approaching entire exchange rate question with an open mind.
- o No decisions have been taken concerning this question.
- o We look upon this week's meetings as best opportunity to hear views of others.
- o Expect that meetings will call for additional IMF study on key issues.
- o Will assess situation in light of what we hear.

#### ISSUE YOU MAY WISH TO RAISE:

Need for stronger growth abroad. In order to complement the exchange rate changes that have already taken place, key foreign economies, such as Germany, must assure continued stronger domestic growth in order to further reduce external imbalances.

# Suggested Talking Points:

- o Effective exchange rate change to date will have worked through the system by the end of 1987.
- o Lower oil prices and lower interest rates mean higher real growth and lower inflation.
- o Must take advantage of favorable economic circumstances to lay foundations for higher noninflationary, sustained growth.
- o This best accomplished through domestic policy measures that:
  - -- remove structural constraints in labor market that discourage employment creation and mobility;
  - -- reduce high marginal tax rates, which are a disincentive to extended work effort;
  - -- remove capital market taxes, which discourage new company formation, reduce the vitality of securities markets, and inhibit capital market liberalization.



# Bilateral Background

# Economic Setting

- o Modest three-year recovery strengthening in current year to forecast 4.1 percent (yr/yr) real growth, up from 2.4 percent in 1985. Investment and consumption are replacing exports as main sources of growth.
- o Aided by falling oil prices and Deutsche Mark appreciation, inflation fell to 2.2 percent in 1985, lowest levels since late 1960s; could be zero or below this year.
- o After three years at close to postwar peak, unemployment rate, 9.3 percent in 1985, is unresolved problem; with stronger growth, it is expected to decline to 8.3 percent in 1986.
- o Historic trade and current account surpluses reached in 1985. The latter is forecast to almost double to \$25 billion, 2.9 percent of GNP in 1986.
- o Monetary policy remains firm despite cosmetic increase in monetary target for 1986 and March 6 Discount Rate reduction. Belated central bank action decidely followed, rather than led, market rate movement and still leaves real interest rates at high levels. Recent monetary growth has been above target range; central bank is already indicating no further interest rate reductions are likely.

### Political Scene

- o Federal election in January 1987 dominant factor influencing government thinking. Despite embarrassing fumbles Kohl-led coalition is expected to win as in postwar era, with one exception, Germans have voted their pocketbook.
- o Kohl is the subject of legal inquiries concerning extent of his knowledge of business payments to his political party (Flick affair), filing of charges against him could lead to his resignation and make election a "toss-up."

# Bilateral Issues

- o SDI technological cooperation.
- Overriding German concern with future potential inflation and budget deficit reduction has caused tighter than necessary monetary policy, little reduction in marginal tax rates and a reluctance to remove minor capital transactions taxes which impair operations of domestic financial market.



Johannes Rau, leader of the West Germany's Social Democratic Party and the Party's candidate for Chancellor in the January 1987 national elections would like to meet with the President anytime between mid-January and the end of February. Rau is considered a moderate, and it would be in keeping with our current practice for the President to meet with the leader of the opposition party from a major ally. State has strongly endorsed Rau's request (Tab II).

Request for Presidential Meeting with Johannes Rau, SPD Candidate for the FRG Chancellorship

Johannes Rau, Minister-President of North Rhine-Westphalia and SPD candidate for the FRG Chancellorship, plans to visit the U.S. in January or February of 1986. His principal reason for making the trip would be to call on the President and Secretary Shultz.

Rau, who is 54, has had little experience in foreign affairs, but is considered a political moderate and a supporter of NATO. Last spring, Rau won a stunning victory in North Rhine-Westphalia, the FRG's most populous state, gaining an unprecedented absolute majority for the SPD. In September, he became the Social Democratic Party's chancellor candidate for the January 1987 federal election.

Rau originally planned to visit Washington last summer, and a brief appointment with the President had already been agreed to in principle. However, Rau had to postpone the trip. We strongly recommend that Rau's meeting with the President be rescheduled both because he could become the next Chancellor of the FRG and in view of the important role he will play in German politics for the foreseeable future.

Rau is willing to travel to Washington at the convenience of the President at any time from January 17 through February.
