This is the source of his sense of purpose, the source from which Democracy draws its strength, a power beyond the reach of tyrants.

Today, the Western Democracies face challenges that, at times seem, overwhelming. Yet, we persevere and, in the end, freedom will triumph. Our victory will not be realized in the crossing of borders by well-equipped armies, certainly not in the launching of missiles or the occupation of other countries. Our victory will come, perhaps little by little, as walls are torn down, armies dismantled, and as people are freed.

Free peoples share this vision. The friendship and comradery of this visit is testimony that the world we seek is already being built. The days of tyranny are numbered.

Despotism cannot stand the confines of peace. The American, German, and other free people have done what was necessary to keep the peace, and we will continue to do so.

In a few short years, the world will not only enter a new century, but also a new millennium. I would ask you all to join me now in a toast to Chancellor Kohl and to the German people, who work are working with us to ensure that it will be an age of peace, prosperity, and freedom.
