Your Meeting with Volker Ruehe Tuesday, April 28 -- 2:45 p.m.

You have agreed to meet briefly (15 minutes) with Volker Ruehe, a leading CDU Bundestag defense expert. Ruehe is a close personal associate of Chancellor Kohl, and is one of three prominent CDU figures, known collectively in Germany as the "Steel Helmets," who have announced publicly their opposition to a zero/zero SRINF outcome. (The other two are Manfred Woerner, the Defense Minister, and Alfred Dregger, leader of the CDU Bundestag group.)

Ruehe will want to explain to you why a zero/zero solution will make it impossible politically for the FRG to allow the modernization of nuclear weapons on its soil, and how a zero SRINF outcome could eventually lead to the strengthening of neutralism in his country.

We will join you with Bob Linhard for the meeting. Suggested talking points are attached at Tab A.

- -- We're aware that FRG faces especially difficult decisions with respect to SRINF. Germany's perception and insight on this issue deserve and will receive our most thoughtful consideration. We hope the FRG coalition will reach an early decision, but we will not push you.
- -- We want to consult closely, informally and thoroughly with all our key allies. Germany is on the top of our list.

 While we want to do this expeditiously, we do not want to put our friends under any artificial time pressure. We also want to be as sensitive as we can to the political views and requirements of our best friends in the FRG.

Your Meeting with Lothar Spaeth: Thursday, July 9

We understand that at Henry Kissinger's request you have agreed to meet with Lothar Spaeth, Minister-President of Baden-Wurttemberg, tomorrow at 10:30 a.m. Colin and Peter Sommer will also sit in. Spaeth plans to be accompanied by Ambassador Van Well and several aides, plus an interpreter.

Spaeth is in the US to promote US-German ties and US investment in Baden-Wurttemberg. IBM, who -- along with a number of other US companies -- is already heavily involved in Baden-Wurttemberg, has arranged a large portion of his US schedule.

Here in Washington, Spaeth is seeing Shultz, Baldridge, a host of other Administration officials, Senator Lugar, and Congressman Lantos. Spaeth is expected to focus on economic, trade and defense issues.

Baden-Wurttemberg has the highest economic growth rate of the German Federal States. There are a number of high tech firms located there. He has been an active player in the internal German debate over tax reform. You will recall that the USG, especially Secretary Baker, has been urging the Germans to stimulate their economy. Kohl has promised a tax reform program, but there is a debate over how to find revenues to replace lower taxes. You may wish to ask Spaeth about this program and his views.

On defense issues, he reportedly supported the double-zero INF option, and argued against the CDU/CSU right-wing position. You will have seen the reports that the Kohl government apparently believes Pershing modernization is no longer a possiblity. The Kohl government's resolve on retaining Pershing IAs also seems to be weakening. You will want to ask him about internal divisions within the CDU. It would be useful to give him a brief overview of US-Soviet relations and next steps.**

- -- We understand that you and other Christian Democrats fear the US will desert Chancellor Kohl on the exclusion of the FRG's Pershings from an INF agreement. We hear warnings that the Kohl government cannot stand alone in defense of the Pershings and thus be the sole obstacle to an agreement.
- -- While your fears are perhaps understandable, they are misplaced and your warnings are dangerous...because the Soviets are picking them up too and concluding that Bonn can be intimidated and that the Coalition can be further damaged.
- -- The exclusion of the Pershings is far from only a German issue. It is a NATO demand. The President feels strongly about it. Mrs. Thatcher feels strongly about it.
- -- The reason we must hold firm on the Pershings is fundamentally political. If the Soviets intimidate you or the rest of us on the Pershings, then they will conclude that they can interfere with every aspect of NATO's nuclear affairs by playing on negotiations and public opinion.

- -- As you know, the US warheads on German Pershings were brought up by the Soviets as an afterthought, well after Shultz left Moscow in April. Until a few weeks ago, Soviet military voices and other sources told us that these warheads were not a central issues to Moscow.
- -- Now, having detected Bonn's nervousness, the Soviets are digging in. They are trotting out emotional arguments about how the "Russian people, who suffered in World War II, would not understand the exclusion of these warheads."
- -- If the Soviets truly want an INF agreement, they will not sacrifice it for these Pershing warheads. If we hold firm, the Soviets will very probably drop the matter, after they've played on the propaganda opportunity to test us.
- -- If we show weakness, however, they will use the issue to further undermine the Bonn Coalition, to further demoralize the pro-defense forces in the FRG, to further advance their campaign for denuclearization of NATO.


