Dear Count von Finkenstein:

Thank you for your letter of June 1 concerning the application of the death penalty in cases of crimes committed by juveniles.

We are sympathetic, as any compassionate person must be, to your appeal for mercy for those young people who have received such sentences. However, in the cases to which you refer, the sentences were imposed by State courts for offenses against State law. Under our system of government, neither the President nor anyone else in the Federal Government has the authority to commute those sentences.

At the moment, there is no constitutionally applicable death penalty under Federal law, with the exception of aircraft piracy resulting in death. It has been the policy of this Administration to seek to reinstate capital punishment for certain crimes under U.S. Federal law, and a bill to that effect has been submitted to Congress. However, with respect to juveniles, the bill would specifically preclude the imposition of the death penalty in cases when the offender was less than eighteen years old when the crime was committed.

We appreciate your taking the time to write.

Dear Mr. President:

I was appalled to learn that in your country there are 32 young people on death row awaiting their officially decreed execution because they committed murder when they were juveniles.

All over the world, the United States is known as the country with an extraordinary appreciation of freedom, where life in general is lived along more generous lines than in any other country on earth. This cannot be true if the death sentences of these 32 prisoners are actually to be carried out.

I do not think that it is less cruel to let a 17-year-old boy wait in prison for six years to "lawfully kill" him at 23, than to rape and kill a woman at 17.

If America were to stick to the letter of obsolete laws in these instances, it would mean that this marvellous country is not only cruel, irrational, and unforgiving, but utterly uncivilized.

Some time ago, I wrote to your ambassador concerning this matter, telling him what I think of this. However, the embassy's press office confined itself to reciting to me the facts and to stating that you consider them right and proper.

I appeal to you as a Christian and a man, in the face of the horror perpetrated daily in the world, to show mercy and to spare the life of these young people and children who have already been punished enough by their own deeds.

While I can understand to some extent the intentions of the OFM, the Federal Republic currently has only 38 consular representatives in the U.S. whereas France has 64, Costa Rica 59, and countries like Denmark, Italy, Mexico, Norway and Panama all have more representatives than the Federal Republic.

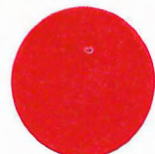

Waigel, chairman of the CSU Bundestag group and first deputy chairman of the combined CDU/CSU caucus, will visit Washington October 20-22, together with CSU Parliamentary Whip Boetsch and CSU Press Spokesman Aschenbrenner.

Strongly pro-American, Waigel plays an important role for the CSU in Bonn. He often serves as a discreet intermediary between Franz Josef Strauss and Chancellor Kohl -- a key task particularly given current squabbles between the sister CDU/CSU parties over Kohl's handling of the FRG Pershing 1As and other coalition issues. Waigel also has recently consolidated his own power base, improving his chances of succeeding Franz Josef Strauss as CSU Party Chairman and Minister-President in Bavaria.

In light of growing restiveness among FRG conservatives over NATO arms control and security policies, the visit by the Waigel CSU group provides a timely opportunity to reassure the German right of the United States' commitment to the security of the FRG and Europe, especially as we move forward on an INF agreement and a U.S.-Soviet Summit.

The Department therefore recommends granting Waigel's request for a brief photo opportunity with the President. Coming literally on the eve of Secretary Shultz' talks in Moscow, FRG media coverage of Waigel with the President would help assuage unease among West German conservatives by visibly demonstrating our concern for their views.

Waigel also has pending appointment requests with the Vice President, Acting Secretary Whitehead, Secretary Weinberger, Attorney General Meese, Senator Lugar and Richard Allen.

Relations, who is due to arrive in Bonn on October 2.  
If he does, Genscher presumably will wish to convey the  
importance of his exchange with Gorbachev.

Genscher is touring here in Washington on October 2-4  
en route to St. Paul, Minnesota, where he will take part in an  
international conference sponsored by the Institute for  
East-West Security Studies. He understands he will give an  
address on October 3 on "The Implications of Soviet New  
Thinking." This topic may not be very new on his mind.

If the President schedules a meeting, it might be useful to  
see the VRS Foreign Minister during his stop in Washington.  
However, there would not appear to be a pressing need to  
schedule a meeting at this time. An appointment with Secretary  
Shultz has been arranged for 2:15 on October 2. Genscher is  
also asked to see the Vice President.




