ARMS CONTROL

WASHINGTON (AP) -- THIRTY-FOUR REPUBLICAN SENATORS -- ENOUGH TO BLOCK ANY ARMS CONTROL TREATY -- ARE TELLING PRESIDENT REAGAN THAT CONGRESS AND THE PUBLIC "HAVE A RIGHT TO KNOW" IF THE SOVIETS ARE VIOLATING SUCH AGREEMENTS.

IN A LETTER RELEASED THURSDAY BY SEN. JAMES MCCLURE, R-IDAH, HE AND THE OTHER SENATORS URGED REAGAN TO CONTINUE EFFORTS "TO THOROUGHLY STUDY THE PROBLEM OF SOVIET COMPLIANCE WITH ARMS CONTROL TREATIES."

MCCLURE SAID THE LETTER WAS "IMPORTANT BECAUSE IT SHOWS THE POTENTIAL FOR BLOCKING RATIFICATION" OF THE PROPOSED THRESHOLD TEST BAN TREATY OF 1976 OR ANY OTHER ARMS CONTROL AGREEMENT SUBMITTED TO THE SENATE.

RATIFICATION REQUIRES A TWO-THIRDS MAJORITY OF THE 100-MEMBER SENATE, OR 67 VOTES. THUS, 34 OPPOSING VOTES WOULD BE SUFFICIENT TO BLOCK RATIFICATION.

THE THRESHOLD TREATY WOULD LIMIT NUCLEAR WEAPONS TESTS TO DEVICES WITH AN EXPLOSIVE FORCE OF 150 KILOTONS OR LESS. THE TREATY HAS NEVER BEEN RATIFIED, ALTHOUGH BOTH THE UNITED STATES AND THE SOVIET UNION HAVE SAID THEY WILL ABIDE BY THE LIMIT IF THE OTHER SIDE DOES.

MCCLURE SAID THERE HAVE BEEN 14 SOVIET UNDERGROUND NUCLEAR WEAPONS TESTS SINCE 1978 THAT ARE ESTIMATED TO EXCEED 150 KILOTONS. THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION SAYS THE EVIDENCE IS AMBIGUOUS AS TO WHETHER THERE HAVE BEEN TREATY VIOLATIONS.

SEN. CHARLES W. PERCY, R-ILL., CHAIRMAN OF THE FOREIGN RELATIONS COMMITTEE, HAS URGED SUBMITTING THE TREATY FOR RATIFICATION. THE ADMINISTRATION SAYS VERIFICATION PROVISIONS NEED TO BE TIGHTENED BEFORE THIS IS DONE.

MCCLURE SAID HE COULD NOT IMAGINE VOTING TO RATIFY THE TREATY, "NOT WHEN I SEE THIS EVIDENCE, AND I BELIEVE THIS EVIDENCE."

THE SAME SENATORS WROTE TO REAGAN ON MAY 12 QUESTIONING SOVIET COMPLIANCE WITH THE SALT I ANTIBALLISTIC MISSILE TREATY, AND SAID THURSDAY THERE HAD BEEN MANY REPORTS OF NEW VIOLATIONS AND EVASIONS SINCE THEN.

"WE ARE SURE THAT YOU AGREE THAT THE CONGRESS AND THE AMERICAN PEOPLE HAVE A RIGHT TO KNOW IF THE SOVIETS ARE VIOLATING OR CIRCUMVENTING SALT TREATIES," THEY SAID.

SOVIET UNION APPEARS READY FOR COMPROMISE AT MADRID TALKS

MADRID, JUNE 30, REUTER - THE SOVIET UNION APPEARED TODAY TO BE READY TO STRIKE A BARGAIN TO BRING THE NEARLY THREE-YEARS-OLD EUROPEAN SECURITY REVIEW CONFERENCE HERE TO A SUCCESSFUL CONCLUSION, DIPLOMATIC SOURCES SAID.

THE SOURCES SAID THEY EXPECTED THE SOVIET UNION TO SPELL OUT THEIR TERMS AT TOMORROW'S CLOSED-DOOR PLENARY SESSION OF THE 35-NATION CONFERENCE THAT IS REVIEWING AND UPDATING THE 1975 HELSINKI ACCORDS ON EUROPEAN SECURITY AND COOPERATION (OSCE).

THE CONFERENCE, WHICH GROUPS THE UNITED STATES AND CANADA AND ALL EUROPEAN STATES EXCEPT ALBANIA, HAS VIRTUALLY REACHED CONSENSUS ON A CONCLUDING DOCUMENT, BUT IS DEADLOCKED OVER HUMAN RIGHTS" ISSUES.

HOST COUNTRY SPAIN PROPOSED A COMPROMISE ON THE ISSUES TWO WEEKS AGO WHICH THE SOVIET UNION AT FIRST IMPLICITLY REJECTED.

BUT SENIOR SOVIET DELEGATES LATER TRAVELED TO MOSCOW FOR NEW INSTRUCTIONS AND ON THEIR RETURN LAST NIGHT HAD WHAT SOVIET AND SPANISH SOURCES DESCRIBED AS A "VERY CONSTRUCTIVE" DINNER MEETING WITH SPAIN'S FOREIGN MINISTER, FERNANDO MORAN.

NEW DELHI, INDIA (AP) -- THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION, RISKING A CLASH WITH CONGRESS, AGREED THURSDAY TO PROVIDE COMPONENTS FOR A NUCLEAR POWER PLANT NEAR BOMBAY IF INDIA IS UNABLE TO GET THE SPARE PARTS ELSEWHERE.

THE DECISION WAS TAKEN AT A MEETING BETWEEN SECRETARY OF STATE GEORGE A. SHULTZ AND INDIAN FOREIGN MINISTER P.V. NARASIMHA RAO, DESPITE A LAST-MINUTE APPEAL TO THE WHITE HOUSE BY FOUR DEMOCRATIC MEMBERS OF CONGRESS OPPOSING THE AGREEMENT.

STATE DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN JOHN HUGHES SAID THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF WORKERS AT THE TWIN TARPUR REACTORS AND OF RESIDENTS OF THE AREA COULD BE ENDANGERED IF THE PLANT WERE ALLOWED TO RUN DOWN.

INDIAN SPOKESMAN MANI SHANKER Aiyar TOLD REPORTERS: "WE BELIEVE THE PROBLEM HAS BEEN RESOLVED. I CAN SEE NO GREAT DIFFICULTY NOW."

BEFORE GOING TO THE UNITED STATES, THE INDIAN GOVERNMENT IS REQUIRED TO APPROACH OTHER POTENTIAL SUPPLIERS FOR ASSISTANCE. Aiyar SAID THE BULK OF THE PARTS WOULD COME FROM WESTERN EUROPE.

THE U.S. DECISION SHOULD ACCELERATE THE IMPROVEMENT IN RELATIONS WITH INDIA, WHICH HAVE BEEN ON THE UPSWING SINCE PRIME MINISTER INDIRA GANDHI VISITED WASHINGTON LAST SUMMER.

DURING HIS VISIT, SHULTZ ALSO INTENDS TO OFFER INDIA WEAPONS WORTH UP TO \$900 MILLION, BUT NOT JET FIGHTERS THAT THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION HAS SOLD PAKISTAN.

THE LARGE U.S. PROGRAM FOR PAKISTAN HAS STIRRED RESENTMENT IN INDIA, BUT HUGHES SAID "WE EXPECT AND WE HOPE THAT WE CAN MAINTAIN GOOD RELATIONS WITH BOTH INDIA AND PAKISTAN."

THE U.S.-BUILT ATOMIC POWER PLANT AT TARPUR PROVIDES ELECTRICITY TO BOMBAY. INDIA HAS OPENED TARPUR TO INTERNATIONAL INSPECTION, EVEN THOUGH THE COUNTRY HAS NOT SUBSCRIBED TO THE 1968 TREATY THAT IS DESIGNED TO STOP THE SPREAD OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS TECHNOLOGY, AND HAS DECLINED TO ALLOW INSPECTORS INTO OTHER PARTS OF ITS NUCLEAR PROGRAM.

CONGRESS IN 1978 BANNED FUEL AND SPARE PARTS FOR COUNTRIES THAT HAVE NOT SIGNED THE TREATY. DESPITE INDIA'S INSISTENCE THAT ITS PROGRAM HAS ONLY PEACEFUL PURPOSES, THE EXPLOSION OF A NUCLEAR DEVICE IN 1974 HAS LEFT DOUBTS ABOUT INDIA'S INTENTIONS.
