Thank you for your letter of February 26, 1981, and your views on the situation in Liberia. Your statement suggesting that instability in Liberia benefits forces in the world inimical to the best interests of both the United States and Liberia is shared and appreciated by many of us. I also fully appreciate the historical and real associations between Liberia and the United States, and can assure you that we are giving priority attention to helping Liberia in its quest for stability and progress.

You noted the United States Government's positive record in regard to stressing the importance of an early release of political prisoners. Let me assure you that this Administration gives full importance to human rights in its foreign policies, and we do not plan to desist from applying what pressure we realistically can to improve the human rights performance of foreign governments.

While I appreciate your offer to meet with me personally, I regret such a meeting is not possible at this time. It would seem that there is little to gain and much to lose in you seeing any Tolbert since this family is viewed by the current Doe Government of Liberia as a major cause of all Liberia's ills. We are, you recall, expending much effort and treasure trying to keep the very erratic Doe Government afloat. Parker Borg of State agrees to play the lightning rod for any Tolbert visit or contact, if you approve. (C)

The Tolbert clan has extensive contacts with Black American society so I hope I phrased the reply gently and sympathetically.

Dear Mr. Allen:

First, thank you for acknowledging on January 6, 1981 the letter which I sent to Mr. Reagan in December 1980.

Knowing your busy schedule in the first month of the new Administration, I refrained from contacting you sooner. However, the situation in my country, Liberia, has continued to deteriorate and I believe it is important that your new Administration has a proper perspective on this situation as it begins to review U.S. foreign policy.

Since my letter of December 16, 1980, there have been some releases of political prisoners including two sons of the late President and his widow Mrs. Victoria Tolbert who is now in the United States. These releases were, I am sure, largely due to continued external pressure by the U.S. and other friendly nations and I strongly urge your Government to continue to stress to the Liberian regime the necessity for a complete release of the hundreds of political prisoners as a minimum prerequisite for a resumption of full economic and diplomatic ties.

This is not merely an humanitarian appeal but a very pragmatic one as well. For as long as the society is divided along class lines of so-called "Americo-Liberians" versus so called "Indigenous Liberians", the country will deteriorate and remain unstable with the continuing threat of counter-coups or insurgency from within or without.

The only benefactors from this situation will be the radical and socialist elements within the present regime and those outside the country who are watching the developing social and economic chaos for a chance to step in and take over fully.

There cannot be a return to the status-quo ante, but neither can the regime of April 12 survive. The only hope for a viable Government and long term stability in Liberia is a Government of National Unity consisting of a coalition of all progressive, moderate segments of the population.

Although this small West African nation may not rank high in the United States' list of strategic priorities, I do not believe it can be in the best interest of the United States to see continuing instability in this part of the world, or worse an anti-U.S. base in Liberia. For besides the historical ties and the present U.S. economic and strategic investments in Liberia, I and many other Liberians believe that our two countries in the past only very superficially tapped the real economic and strategic possibilities which could have been immensely mutually beneficial.

Therefore, I and several other prominent Liberians would welcome the opportunity of meeting with you to discuss in greater depth the Liberian situation. We would welcome such a meeting either in a formal or informal setting at a time and place of your choosing.

Response to the Liberian Head of State's Request to SUBJECT: the President for Assistance in Obtaining Overseas Private Investment Corporation (OPIC) Insurance for the National Iron Ore Company, Ltd. (NIOC)

As discussed with Fred Wettering of your staff, the Department of State believes the issue of insurance for prospective lenders to the National Iron Ore Company, Ltd. of Liberia should be handled through the American Ambassador in Liberia rather than by a letter from President Reagan. Efforts to gain adequate insurance and financing for NIOC's recapitalization scheme are likely to take some time.

The Department has discussed this issue with AID and OPIC officials, and OPIC has suggested means by which its opposition to providing insurance (because of NIOC's questionable commercial viability) could be overcome. At the same time, NIOC's US representatives are seeking to obtain insurance from private sources which would obviate the need for OPIC participation. In the interim, we intend to report progress on this matter to our Embassy in Monrovia so it may keep the Government of Liberia informed.

Subject: Presidential Message for Liberian Head of State Doe

In late July, Liberian Head of State Samuel Doe requested a meeting with President Reagan. In line with White House instructions to keep Presidential appointments to a minimum, we did not ask the President to receive Doe at this time, but sought and obtained an appointment for him with Vice President Bush. Doe was deeply disappointed that the President would not see him, declined our offer of an appointment with the Vice President, and cancelled his planned visit to the U.S.

Since the 1980 coup, we have substantially increased our bilateral aid levels and invested a great deal of effort to protect our interests in Liberia and turn the Doe government away from Soviet and Libyan blandishments. Doe has been responsive, but in view of his reaction, we are concerned that he may be misreading our decision as a rejection of him and his policies.

We must avoid conveying the impression that Liberia is not important or that we do not approve of Doe. He closed the Libyan People's Bureau, reduced the size of the Soviet Embassy, announced plans to return to civilian rule and has recently released additional political prisoners and taken a number of decisions designed to promote economic recovery and end harassment of businessmen.

The Embassy has recommended and we agree that an early personal message from the President to Doe would not only ease his disappointment at not seeing the President, but would demonstrate our approval of the positive steps he has taken and reassure him of our continued support. A draft Presidential message is attached for your approval. We would cable the message to Monrovia for delivery; there would be no signed original.

The Department of State requests that the Vice President meet with Liberian Head of State (his preferred title) Samuel Doe between September 21-30, 1981. General Doe places great stock in his American connection and is determined to visit the United States in September in order to address the UN General Assembly and to meet with senior US Government officials.

Given the extensive investment we have in Liberia and the good relationship which the Embassy has developed with General Doe, it would be helpful if the Vice President could receive him for 30 minutes in an office visit during the requested time frame. General Doe has shown he listens to our advice and it is believed the Vice President could reinforce several lines of guidance and advice we have been giving Doe on more effective government.

A brief biographic sketch is attached. Detailed talking points will be submitted on receipt of your approval of the meeting.

RECOMMENDATION: That you see Liberian Head of State Doe between 21 and 30 September, 1981. (C)

Samuel Doe, Liberian Head of State (his preferred title, rather than General) plans to visit the United States in September to address the UN General Assembly. A previous request for him to call on the Vice President between 15-18 September had been ruled out due to the Vice President's planned absence from Washington at that time. (5)

State, in consultation with the Liberian Government, now proposes that Doe call on the Vice President between 21-30 September. The Vice President's Office advises me that he will be in Washington during that time frame.

My preference would have been that Doe remain in Liberia to further consolidate his rule. Travelling abroad is not a healthy activity for African leaders. But since he seems determined to come I believe that we highlight the importance we place in our good relations with Liberia by requesting the Vice President to see him for an office visit. A memo from you to the Vice President is attached reflecting this. 467

RECOMMENDATION: Sign your memo to the Vice President at Tab I endorsing State's request for a Vice Presidential meeting with Liberian leader Doe between 21-30 September.

In view of the Vice President's scheduled absence from Washington between September 15 and 18, the dates originally requested by Liberian Head of State Samuel Doe for a meeting with the President, the Liberian Embassy has ascertained that Doe could reschedule his UNGA visit any time between September 21 and 30. While we cannot recommend that the President receive Doe, we strongly recommend that the Vice President see him in view of our special relationship with, and our heavy investments and interests in Liberia. We believe Doe would welcome the opportunity to meet with the Vice President.

Liberia, which has enjoyed a close and special relationship with the United States for over a century, has the only airport in Africa to which our military has unquestioned access and is the site of major American communication and navigation installations valued at over \$300 million. Those facilities initially appeared jeopardized by Soviet and Libyan influence following a coup in 1980, but Doe acted firmly, expelling the Libyans and reducing Soviet presence in Liberia.




