Dear Mr. President:

I fully agree with the words of State Department spokesman Dean Fischer, who yesterday labeled as "reprehensible" the involvement of U.S. citizens in the escalating and destabilizing activities of the Libyan government.

On October 22, 1981, during Senate consideration of the Foreign Assistance bill, I gained Senate approval for an amendment aimed at ensuring that Americans are prevented from acting in the service of terrorism or the proponents of terrorist activities. I made note at that time of your Administration's firm and active opposition to the spread of international terrorism and the special attention that has been given to the escalating and destabilizing activities of Colonel Qadaffi's government.

While the Foreign Assistance bill has not yet gained final Congressional approval, I write today to urge that the Administration begin at once to develop a program to ensure against the involvement of Americans in such terrorism by implementing the steps called for in my amendment.

That amendment requires, within six months of enactment, a report to include:

- a description of all legislation, currently in force, and of all administrative remedies, presently available, which can be employed to prevent the involvement, service, or participation by U.S. citizens in activities in support of international terrorism or terrorist leaders;
- an assessment of the adequacy of such legislation and remedies, and of the enforcement resources available to carry out such measures, to prevent the involvement, service, or participation by U.S. citizens in activities in support of international terrorism or terrorist leaders; and

(3) a description of available legislative and administrative alternatives, together with an assessment of their potential impact and effectiveness, which could be enacted or employed to put an end to the participation by U.S. citizens in activities in support of international terrorism or terrorist leaders.

Thank you for your mailgram to the President on Libva.

We appreciate your concern for this issue and your offer of assistance to mediate differences between the United States and Libya. As I am sure you will understand, we cannot accept your offer. There are many channels of communication available. The issue now is whether the Libyan Government will alter its behavior.

The problems the US Government has with Libya are caused by a pattern of actions by the Libyan Government which are contrary to international law and accepted standards of international behavior. The Libyan Government has supported international terrorism and has tried to undermine other governments, including many friendly to the United States. When there is a substantial and lasting change in the Libyan Government's behavior, the United States is prepared to seek improved relations between the two nations. The Libyans are well aware of this.



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

I was a member of the British group which

I was a member of the British group which visited Washington under the auspices of the Royal Institute of International Affairs. We had the privilege of meeting with you.

I raised the question of Libya's role in the troubled Middle East and the spread of Moslem fundamentalism and fanaticism, perhaps the greatest danger the United States, Western Europe and those countries in the Middle East which have relatively good ties with the West, face.

I believe Colonel Gaddafi continues to be the main paymaster for terrorist activities and of Moslem fanaticism which, unless it can be contained and defeated, will throw the Middle East into further confusion to the advantage of our enemies.

I attach two notes on Colonel Gaddafi's activities. I wrote the first in January 1974; I discussed it then with certain political leaders and suggested we should break off diplomatic relations, but nothing was done; appeasement continued. When I brought it up to date in May 1980 there was very little to change; Colonel Gaddafi has been very consistent.

.../...

Our contacts and activities in Egypt convince me that unless the mass of the Egyptians whose standard of living is very low, see a worthwhile increase in their standard within two to three years, Moslem fanaticism will become a growing problem in Egypt.

Number one priority is to increase food production and then housing. While the supply of arms and defence aid from the West is of great importance, Egypt should not appear to be a United States satellite.

I hope you find these remarks of interest. I am sending a copy to the Secretary of State, Mr. Haig, in case he also may be interested.

- Colonel Gaddafi's policy is to:-
  - a. promote and encourage murder, airport massacre, hijacking, terrorism and bombing in the countries of Western Europe;
  - b. foment revolution in Arab countries to prevent a peace settlement in the Middle East;
  - c. blackmail western European countries into condoning murder and massacre.
- 2. TERRORISM AGAINST BRITAIN Colonel Gaddafi has been active against Britain:
  - a. In June 1972 he declared:

"We are making war on Great Britain and if the Irish revolutionaries want to liberate Ireland we will back them to the limit". (Page 3, para 1)

- b. He has sent the IRA £1,000,000 in military aid and training and has supplied at least one shipment of arms. (Page 3, paras 2 and 3)
- c. A Beirut newspaper, Al Liwa, reported on 2nd January 1974 that Palestine terrorists and the IRA have agreed to carry out joint acts of terrorism in Britain; these have started. (Page 3, para 4)
- 3. ECONOMIC HOSTILITY TO BRITAIN This too is increasing:
  - a. Colonel Gaddafi nationalised British oil interests in December 1971 in violation of international law; he has not paid compensation. (Page 3, paras 5 and 6)
  - Libyan oil prices have been quadrupled since October 1973. (Page 4, para 7)
  - c. Libya unilaterally banned the import of a wide range of British foodstuffs and consumer goods in December 1973. (Page 4, para 8)
- 4. INTERNATIONAL TERRORISM Colonel Gaddafi has used money and provided facilities to promote revolt, murder and terrorism in many countries; he has encouraged hijacking:
  - a. He has assisted Black September in every way possible and has made Libya a recruiting office and training camp for the Palestine terrorist movement. (Page 4, paras 9 to 11)
  - b. He has financed terrorism and revolt in Ireland, Ethiopia, Morocco, Yemen, the Philippines, Tunisia, Somalia, Syria, Chad and Thailand. (Page 4, para 12)

- c. His vast monetary support of Black September and other Fedayin groups is a threat to the Shah of Iran, President Sadat, King Faisal and King Hussein. (Page 4, para 12)
  - d. His speech praising the Japanese terrorists responsible for the Lod Airport massacre in May 1972 was reported in The Times. He was the only Arab leader not to disown the Rome Airport massacre where the terrorists came from Libya via Spain. (Page 5, para 13-15)
  - e. He supplied the SAM missiles which were found in Italy in September 1973. (Page 5, para 16)
- 5. APPEASEMENT DOES NOT PAY The Italian Government released the five terrorists who had been arrested in possession of SAM missiles. Two of them, missile experts, were sent to Libya on the tacit understanding that Italy would then be immune from terrorism and hijacking. The Rome massacre with the hijacking of the German plane and the murder of hostages shows that Italy's policy was useless.
- 6. ECONOMIC BLACKMAIL Colonel Gaddafi is trying to use Libya's stocks of oil to force the western European countries to supply him with arms. Until now, western countries have sought a friendly relationship with Libya, owing to her strong position as a supplier of oil. Her situation would be weakened if she were to be isolated from other oil producing countries, following her support of terrorist groups and Colonel Gaddafi's political machinations in the neighbouring countries. (Page 5, paras 17 and 18)
- 7. POLICY TOWARDS LIBYA Now seems an opportune moment for the Western powers to change their policy of handling terrorists with kid gloves. Such a policy could neutralise Colonel Gaddafi's influence and reverse the spread of terrorism, which is becoming increasingly harmful to western European countries. Although Colonel Gaddafi is not an ally of Russia and denies any affiliation with Russian communism, his activities encourage the progress of communist influence and Russian imperialism.
- 8. NATIONAL INTEREST For Britain to continue friendly relations towards Libya can only facilitate anti-British activities. A country which supported the Rome and Lod massacres would support a Heathrow massacre.

Libya is now an ally of Russia and contains the largest Russian arms dump outside Russia.

Egypt at one time was about to attempt the overthrow of Colonel Gaddafi's regime, but was actively discouraged from doing so by one or more of the Western powers. Today the Egyptians say they are nervous of Libya's intentions.

When it is pointed out that there are 40m Egyptians and less than 2m Libyans their reply is that the Libyans have substantial quantities of sophisticated armaments from Russia and the Eastern Block. When they are asked whether they think the Libyans can use such weapons effectively their reply is they doubt it, but they are concerned with the growing number of East Germans and Cubans reported to be in Libya whose numbers they believe exceed that required as advisers.

It is reported that the Libyans now have missiles with a range which brings them to the Southern areas of France.
