This communication is from an executive officer of the Southwire Company in Carrollton, Georgia and it outlines the background of Southwire's business dealings in the Middle East. This official would like very much to set up a very private meeting with you and the Emissary of Libya.

I do not wish to comment on the content of this letter any further, other than to say that Herb Brown of the Southwire Company contacted me concerning the wishes of Colonel Qadhaf of Libya to make contact with the Reagan Administration through the Vice President, using Southwire as the go-between.

I advised Mr. Brown and through him, the executives of Southwire that I would see that the letter was delivered to you. I also informed them that I in no way want to be connected with either the letter, its contents, or the intent of the Company in this matter. want to express to you unequivocally that I do not, in any manner support, or condone what is being sought by the Country of Libya through the American Company of Southwire.

This is only for your information as a clarification of my position on this matter. No response is necessary.

Mr. Vice President:

First, I would like to give you a brief background about our company and the involvement we have had for the past four (4) years in the Middle East.

Our company, is National-Southwire Aluminum Company (NSA), a 50/50 joint venture between the National Steel Corporation in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and Southwire Company in Carrollton, Georgia. Our company is a specialist in the production of primary aluminum and as such is asked from time to time to supply aluminum making technology to others.

NSA, for the past four (4) years has supplied the Know-How, License, Design, Basic Engineering Services and Technical Assistance required to complete the new 135,000 tonne aluminum reduction plant (Dubal) in Dubai, United Arab Emirates.

This plant in Dubai is very successful and as such has enhanced NSA's reputation as a U. S. company which can render outstanding performance in the Arab World.

Because of the success of the Dubai smelter we were asked by the Secretariat of Heavy Industry, Socialist Peoples Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, in Tripoli, Libya to come to Tripoli in October 1980 for discussions about the new aluminum smelter they were considering building at Zwara, Libya. The results of these discussions are that the Secretariat of Heavy Industry on March 24 awarded a contract to NSA for the Know-How, License, Design, Basic Engineering Services and Technical Assistance for the implementation of a new 120,000 tonne aluminum smelter to be constructed at Zwara.

I hope the previous paragraphs have established the background for the request I have been asked to review with you.

During the course of the past five (5) months of negotiations in Libya we have had numerous discussions with many Libyan people, both private citizens and members of the government. Almost without exception the message comes through to us that the Libyan Government would like closer ties to the United States Government, both diplomatically and commercially.

The final purpose of this letter is to make the request which has been given to us.

We have been informed that the leader of the Socialist Peoples Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Colonel M. Qaddafi wishes to send a personal message to President Reagan via a short meeting with you. We understand the message will convey the need for better relations between the two countries and try to lay the groundwork for a greater degree of cooperation in the future. It is Colonel Qaddafi's wish that the meeting be held in the strictest confidence with no publicity whatsoever. We also understand that, if you agree, the message will be brought to you privately, by Colonel Qaddafi's close personal friend and brother-in-law, Mr. Saleh F. El-Haddad, who is not a formal member of the Libyan Government. We also understand that Mr. El Haddad would be available in this country to meet with you anytime convenient during the week of 12-17 April 1981.

It is our hope that relations with <u>all</u> countries can be improved and we sincerely request you seriously consider receiving Mr. Saleh F. El Haddad during the week of 12-17 April at whatever location is convenient for you.

We will appreciate your very careful consideration of the above request.
