Dear Mr. Edwards:

I have been asked to respond to your letter to the President regarding Congressional approval in respect to possible U.S. responses to Libya's support of terrorism.

The announcements made by the President on January 7 and 8 were designed to eliminate any contribution by U.S. persons to the Libyan economy. The Administration has embarked on a policy designed to reduce Qadhafi's support for terrorism and other unacceptable policies. We are urging our allies to adopt similar peaceful measures which likewise will make clear to Qadhafi that he cannot continue his activities with impunity.

However, the President has explicitly not ruled out further actions, if these become necessary, to end Qachafi's acts of aggression against the U.S. and the international community. The shape of the actions which may be required is not known at this time.

Our Sixth Fleet will carry out routine military deployments and exercises in international waters as has been our standard practice.

The Administration understands your point with respect to the reservation of the power to declare war to the Congress. However, it is equally clear that the conduct of foreign policy and to command U.S. armed forces is within the sphere of the President. The Administration has engaged in thorough consultation with the Congress over a long period of time concerning the Libyan terrorist threat and possible U.S. response thereto. Indeed, Congress passed last year legislation expressly authorizing sanctions against Libya. We will continue to consult with the Congress as developments warrant.

Dear Mr. President:

During the past few days you have apparently ordered U.S. fleet movements towards the sea off Libya. Warplanes have been dispatched to the Middle East, and Administration spokesmen have stated that military actions including a naval blockade are under active consideration.

This letter is to remind you, respectfully, that a military attack or a blockade of Libya is an act of war and, pursuant to Article I of the U.S. Constitution, requires Congressional approval.

The Constitution is explicit and the history of the Constitutional Convention and the Federalist Papers makes it clear that Congress alone, except when we are actually attacked, is authorized to decide to go to war.

What our actions should be towards Libya will be an immensely important decision, very possibly affecting all the American people. The Western European nations, all our friends and allies, have rejected strong-arm threats and have other ideas as to how the criminal Qaddafi should be handled. A wise decision by the United States should be made only after indepth consultation with them and with the Congress, as required by the Constitution.

Dear Mr. Renaud:

I am replying to your telegram to President Reagan concerning Libya. The President deeplybappreciates your support on this issue.

Clearly, Libyan Leader Mu'ammar al-Qadhafi has supported terrorism at home and abroad, and attempted to destabilize Libya's neighbors. Relations between the United States and Libya have been severely strained since the early 1970s due to Libyan support for terrorism and subversion against moderate Arab and African nations. In recent years, Libya has been increasingly active in its support for terrorist organizations and their attacks worldwide.

Because foreign governments have not responded effectively to deter terrorism, Qadhafi has felt free to increase his support for terrorist organizations. Incidents in Rome and Vienna killed many innocent persons. These atrocities were committed by the Abu Nidal terrorist group, which has used Libyan bases and receives financial and other support,

including weapons and training, from Libya. These terrorists used Tunisian passports which had been confiscated in Libya.

The United States opposes terrorism. There is no moral ground, no political or religious grievance, that can justify terrorism. Those who support it are as responsible as those who commit it. Our first priority in Libya's case has been to expose Qadhafi's support for terrorism and to try to change his policies. Obviously, American efforts alone will not accomplish this. Thus, the Administration has sought agreement with other countries in our response to Libya's support for terrorism. We have urged action by allied and friendly governments, recognizing that special circumstances may cause them to take different kinds of action in each case. Beyond that, our larger goal is to strengthen international cooperation in combatting terrorism.

President Reagan's decision to impose further U.S. sanctions against Libya is not a confrontational action. While President Reagan carefully kept open the option of further steps if necessary, he deliberately has not discussed what these might be. The Administration appreciates the support Americans have already given in complying with earlier restrictions. We are confident they will understand, support, and comply with the new sanctions.

We appreciate the Legion's interest in this issue. I am taking the liberty of enclosing some material which I believe will interest your members.

on Libya and Terrorism

Director Wick thought you would want to see the following informal report from media consultant John O. Koehler. Until August of 1985, Mr. Koehler was Assistant General Manager of the Associated Press and Managing Director of the AP's World Services Division. In his 30 years as a journalist and AP executive, he travelled widely in Europe and the Middle East, working with senior media and government officials. Before beginning his journalistic career, he served with U.S. military intelligence in Europe.

Koehler is undertaking a study of USIA's worldwide Wireless File press service. An Agency officer telephoned him in Madrid on January 10, at the Director's request, and asked:

- a) What reactions have you been getting to the U.S. initiatives regarding Libya and terrorism?
- b) What suggestions do you have about USIA coverage, guidance and support?

In response, Koehler said that in Germany, Italy and Spain he'd been getting mixed reports, ranging all the way from people who thought the United States should have taken military action to those who were afraid that by doing or even saying anything bold, we'd "bring the whole house of cards down," disrupting the flow of needed oil and natural gas to Europe. In Germany and Italy those he talked to tended to be worried about their own economies. He said he was trying to get in touch with a senior European AP correspondent to see if he'd be interested in doing a story on the facts, testing the assumptions about dependence -- particularly perceptions in Italy of dependence on Libyan natural gas.



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Koehler said he had dinner in Madrid on January 9 with a Puerto Rican publisher who had met with a number of "present and former" military people. The talk in that group was about the United States being seen as a paper tiger, with possible disturbing effects on NATO and other relationships.

The majority of people Koehler talked to, though, cautioned restraint, and appeared to be relieved that nothing "military on our part" did happen.

He said he had picked up one "peculiar piece of information" from a newspaper colleague. British intelligence, he said, called in selected journalists last week and told them "on background" that they expected military action by the U.S., probably on the weekend.

As to the question of USIA coverage, Koehler said, "what's been happening is right on track." There should be, he urged, the quickest possible movement on the File of "whatever the President thinks is evidence" of Libyan complicity in terrorist acts. He believes the File should make every effort to move its stories so they don't lag behind the wire services, and that State should provide materials to the File on an embargoed basis before announcements or releases of white papers, chronologies and briefing materials.

Koehler urged repetition of key points, and said "don't be afraid to be gory" in emphasizing the results of terrorist acts.
