Dear Dr. Di Caprio:

The White House has asked that I reply to your mailgram to President Reagan of January 26, 1986 expressing your concern about the naval maneuvers near Libya.

Our Sixth Fleet carries out routine military deployments and exercises in international waters as a standard practice. We do not expect the present exercise in the Mediterranean, which is taking place in international waters, to provoke a hostile response from Libya. We do not believe it would be useful for the United States to submit this matter to the International Court of Justice.

The President, as you know, has invoked economic sanctions against Libya in the hope that Colonel Qadhafi will realize that his active support for terrorism comes at a price. It is these peaceful measures that are the present focus of our policy against Libya at this time.

I hope this response has addressed your concerns.



Dear Ms. Ivey:

I am replying to your message to President Reagan concerning Libya and the Palestinian question.

Clearly, Libyan Leader Mu'ammar al-Qadhafi has supported terrorism at home and abroad, and attempted to destabilize Libya's neighbors. Relations between the United States and Libya have been severely strained since the early 1970s due to Libyan support for terrorism and subversion against moderate Arab and African nations. In recent years, Libya has been increasingly active in its support for terrorist organizations and their attacks worldwide.

Because foreign governments have not responded effectively to deter terrorism, Qadhafi has felt free to increase his support for terrorist organizations. Incidents in Rome and Vienna killed many innocent persons. These atrocities were committed by the Abu Nidal terrorist group, which has used Libyan bases and receives financial and other support, including weapons and training, from Libya. These terrorists used Tunisian passports which had been confiscated in Libya.

The United States opposes terrorism. There is no moral ground, no political or religious grievance, that can justify terrorism. Those who support it are as responsible as those who commit it. Our first priority in Libya's case has been to expose Qadhafi's support for terrorism and to try to change his policies. Obviously, American efforts alone will not accomplish this. Thus, the Administration has sought agreement with other countries in our response to Libya's support for terrorism. We have urged action by allied and friendly governments, recognizing that special circumstances may cause them to take different kinds of action in each case. Beyond that, our larger goal is to strengthen international cooperation in combatting terrorism.

President Reagan's decision to impose further U.S. sanctions against Libya is not a confrontational action. While President Reagan carefully kept open the option of further steps if necessary, he deliberately has not discussed what these might be. The Administration appreciates the support Americans have already given in complying with earlier restrictions. We are confident they will understand, support, and comply with the new sanctions.

The Palestinian question is of great concern to the United States. For years, successive U.S. Administrations have sought a true and lasting Arab-Israeli peace, and worked to develop a fair and workable process to achieve that peace. Such a process would involve all those most affected by the conflict, including the Palestinians, an issue which involves more than the question of refugees. The Camp David Framework of September 1978 recognized this when it spoke of the legitimate rights of the Palestinians and their just requirements. At the same time, Palestinian political aspirations are inextricably bound up with Israel's right to a secure future.

President Reagan's September 1, 1982 Middle East Peace initiative, which is based on UN Security Council Resolution 242 and is fully consistent with the Camp David Framework, seeks to involve the parties directly concerned in a workable basis for peace. We believe it is possible to achieve a peaceful settlement that reconciles the legitimate rights of the Palestinians and Israel's legitimate security concerns.

It is only through the process of negotiations that all the peoples of the Middle East can achieve a secure peace. The United States is committed to attaining such a peace.





 $\Box$  Congress went home, but celebrations are premature. It may come back.

□ The best thing to be said about the farm bill cobbled together by the congressional agriculture committees-that is to say, by the farm lobbies-and signed by President Reagan is that it slightly lowers the price supports for major grains. The worst thing-and the worst embraces most of the bill-is that the political price of this modest gain was an enormous increase in the amount Washington pays farmers not to grow. The new bill (partly under the disguise of a phony conservation reserve) will subsidize seventy million idle acres. The House admits that this will cost \$17 billion; the true figure is more likely to be \$20 to \$22 billion. Farmers, with congressional encouragement, took out huge loans at a time of galloping inflation. They took, in other words, an economic risk. Inflation didn't last forever; now we all are paying the bill. This was one Reagan threatened to veto, and should have vetoed.

□ Does anyone remember the time, back in 1979, when Joseph Lowery, head of Martin Luther King Jr.'s Southern Christian Leadership Conference, led a delegation that included Benjamin Hooks and Julian Bond to Libya and bestowed on the bloodsoaked Qaddafi an award of appreciation from American blacks called "The Decoration of Martin Luther King"? Aaaarrrggghhh!

D President Reagan, in an interview with a Mexican newspaper, discussed some of the hemisphere's troubles and their causes. Reagan said that "the hand of the Soviet Union and its Cuban surrogates can be found behind terrorist movements such as the M-19 in Colombia . . . [and] the FMLN in El Salvador . . . It is behind the Nicaraguan government's subversion of its democratic neighbors. And the link between the governments of such Soviet allies as Cuba and Nicaragua and international narcotics trafficking and terrorism is becoming increasingly clear." All true; obvious, even. The Monroe Doctrine was the relevant instrument for preventing such things; for over a hundred years, a Monroe Doctrine sensibility actually did so. America turned in its sleep, and Maximilian fell in Mexico. We imposed arbitration on Great Britain and Venezuela; got into World War I in part because of the Zimmermann note; worried about German agents in Latin America during World War II. Now a hostile superpower has not one but two client states within spitting distance, and is actively looking to pick up two more. Why is Mr. Reagan's reaction considered newsworthy?

□ In announcing that she won't run for the Senate this year, Gerry Ferraro added that she expects "full vindication" from a federal investigation into her finances. It's more likely that if she expected vindication she'd go ahead and run. In 1984 she charged that the only reason there were any questions about her business life was that her name ended in a vowel; Sidney Blumenthal, in The New Republic, has taken care of that one with an eye-popping report on some of her family's many-voweled business associates, e.g., the late Aniello Dellacroce, whose recent death may have precipitated the slightly more recent death of mobster Paul Castellano. A tip of the hat to the New York Tribune, the Wall Street Journal, and various publications owned by Rupert Murdoch (except for the Village Voice), which braved abuse for trying to give the public the lowdown on Mrs. Ferraro during the '84 campaign.

□ Back in the Sixties one of the many things that everyone knew was that the police department of Oakland, California, the Black Panthers' home town, was "out to get" the Panthers, which explained why the cops and the Panthers had such violent confrontations. Now former Panther leader Eldridge Cleaver,

# U. S. Blacks, on Visit, Said to Honor Qaddafi

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LONDON, Sept. 16 (Reuters) — A delegation of black Americans visiting Libya today gave what they called "the decoration of Martin Luther King" to Col. Muammar el-Qaddafi, the Libyan leader, the Libyan press agency Jana reported.

Colonel Qaddafi promised Libya's support for the struggle by black Americans "to end racial discrimination and achieve freedom and equality between them and other men," Jana said. MIDDLE EAST

- Schieffer: The Israeli cabinet endorsed the army's stepped-up anti-guerrilla campaign in southern Lebanon.
- CBS's Larry Pintak reports Israel's anti-guerrilla campaign has heightened feelings of fear and resentment among Moslem villagers. (CBS-5)
- ABC's Bob Zelnick reports from Tel Aviv: Israeli government officials dismissed the joint Jordanian-PLO framework for peace as unacceptable. Israelis note that Arafat has yet to recognize Israel or specifically accept U.N. Security Council Resolution 242. With Washington's blessing, Peres rejects Hussein's demand for a U.N.-sponsored international conference on the Middle East, saying the Soviet Union and their radical Arab colleagues would gang up on Israel. Privately, Israelis acknowledge the Hussein-Arafat deal does break some new ground. It delegates to Hussein negotiating authority previously held exclusively by the PLO and it talks only about a PLO state on land taken by Israel in 1967. Arab leaders now want Washington to pressure Israel into matching their own new flexibility, but the Israelis are confident that so long as they are willing to meet with Hussein without preconditions, Washington will ask no more. (ABC-2)
- NBC's Phil Bremman: Israeli FM Shamir spelled it out today: No talks with the PLO, no Soviets at the peace table, no creation of a Palestinian state. There are serious differences within Israel, as in the Arab world. Both sides are still a long way from getting together.
- Palmer: Saudi Arabia had nothing to say about the Jordanian-PLO agreement, but it immediately gave nearly \$28M to the PLO. Syria and Libya accused the PLO and Jordan of plotting terror tactics against their interests in Lebanon and in Europe. Most editorial writers in moderate Arab countries didn't take a direct stand. (NBC-10)

#### FARRAKHAN

NBC's Jim Cummins: This was the annual Savior's Day of the black Muslim religious sect led by Louis Farrakhan, who advocates the establishment of a separate black nation in the U.S. Today he got an offer of some help in doing that from Col. Khadaffy, who spoke to the convention by satellite from Libya.

(Farrakhan: "...Brothers and sisters, it is with great honor and privilege that I present to you the leader of...Libya, our brother Muammar el Khadaffy.")

The Libyan leader charged white people are trying to destroy blacks and he called on black people to take up arms and create a separate nation. Khadaffy even offered to provide weapons for a separate black army of 400,000 soldiers in the U.S. Farrakhan described Khadaffy as a brilliant visionary who is often misunderstood.

Dear Mr. Bouhafi:

Thank you for your message to the President concerning recent events involving the United States and Libya.

Maneuvers such as those of the U.S. Navy in the central Mediterranean are a normal, lawful exercise of the nigh seas freedoms of navigation and overflight. Libya's claim to control navigation and overflight throughout the vast area of the Mediterranean known as the Gulf of Sidra has no basis in international law, is inconsistent with traditional freedoms of the seas, and is not recognized by the maritime nations.

It has been the long standing position of the United States that our security depends on maintenance of freedom of the high seas. Accordingly, the United States does not acquiesce in unilateral acts of other states designed to restrict the rights and freedoms of the international community in navigation and overflight and related ocean uses.

The United States has steadfastly sought to avoid the use of force, and we regret any loss of innocent life caused by our actions. Over the years, we have sought to have good relations with the Libyan people, and to resolve our differences peacefully. We have tried to resolve our differences through various means, including diplomatic channels, public statements, and our most recent economic measures, to no avail. Despite these efforts, under the leadership of Mu'ammer al-Qadhafi Libya has become a major supporter and perpetrator of terrorism. With conclusive proof of direct Libyan involvement in recent terrorist acts and their plans for more attacks against Americans, it was clear the United States had to take direct military action.



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U.S. military force has been used against Libya, not to humiliate, but to demonstrate that terrorists and their supporters will be held responsible for their acts. We cannot let fear become the ruler of international relations or dictator of national policy. The Administration hopes that Qadhafi will turn away from support of terrorism and will recognize our sincerity in our willingness to defend the right of all people to live and travel in peace. We will continue to work with our European allies and friendly Arab governments to deter the scourge of terrorism.

The President is dedicated to the welfare of all citizens regardless of their ethnic origin. In a White House statement following the killing of Mr. Odeh, the Administration deplored this tragic event and strongly condemned this act of terrorism and violence as a grave injustice to the principles of political freedom upon which this country was founded.

Dear Mr. President:

The American-Arab Anti-Discrimination Committee strongly objects to the provocative and unnecessary military activities of United States naval forces in the Gulf of Sidra. We urge that you immediately instruct those forces to withdraw from the disputed waters off the coast of Libya.

We are of the belief that the proper forum for the adjudication of matters concerning international law is the International Court of Justice and we request that you submit United States' claims regarding the Gulf of Sidra to that Court without delay.

Should you truly believe that the Libyan government poses a threat to the security of the United States, we ask that you present your case before Congress and seek a formal declaration of war.

Finally, we urgently ask that you consider the very real threat that irresponsible and inflammatory rhetoric about the Middle East poses to the safety of three million innocent American citizens of Arab descent.

As the largest organisation of Arab-Americans in the United States, we are genuinely concerned that our community will be victimized by groups and individuals who make no distinction when it comes to the Arab world, and who may feel encouraged to vent their hostilities against individuals who bear no responsibility for a political crisis thousands of miles away. We need not remind you, Mr. President, that explosive events in the Middle East have consistently resulted in acts of violence against us. The most tragic example of such violent behavior was the murder last November of our West Coast Regional Director, Alex Odeh.

As the elected leader of the American people with a responsibility for the welfare of all citizens, regardless of their ethnic origin, we ask you to issue a public statement that will effectively diffuse the rapidly escalating level of anti-Arab sentiment that is currently sweeping the nation.

We anxiously await your response to our very serious and immediate concerns
