Subject: Visit to the United States by the King and Queen of Sweden

During an April 10 call on the Chief of Protocol, Swedish Ambassador Wachtmeister notified the Department that King Carl XVI Gustaf and Queen Silvia will be visiting the United States in November in connection with the 75th anniversary observance in New York of the Swedish-American Chamber of Commerce. The King and Queen will arrive in New York on Tuesday, November 17 and will depart for Sweden on Sunday, November 22 (copy of Swedish aide memoire attached).

Ambassador Wachtmeister noted that the King and Queen hope to arrange one day in Washington and, if agreeable to the President and Mrs. Reagan, would look forward to paying a call at the White House. Their New York schedule has not yet been firmed up, and, as of now, they would be free to come to Washington on any day during their stay.

Ambassador Wachtmeister suggested that their visit with the President and Mrs. Reagan might, in keeping with practice for private royal visits in the past, take the form of an office call, followed by luncheon. The Ambassador indicated their Washington schedule would probably also include sightseeing and a reception and dinner at the Swedish Embassy that evening.

Ambassador Annenberg explained that, with no idea yet what President and Mrs. Reagan's schedule might be for November, we could make no commitment, but that we would convey his request to the White House.

A list of recommended state and official visits and office calls on the President during the latter half of 1981 will be forwarded to the President shortly. You may wish to defer action on this request until a review of our recommendations can be made.



Dear Mr. Prime Minister:

On October 5 of this year I had the great privilege and honor of signing into law a Joint Resolution of the United States Congress making Raoul Wallenberg of Sweden an honorary citizen of the United States. It is with deep pride that I and my fellow countrymen welcome such a distinguished and courageous Swede into our own citizenry. I should point out that Sir Winston Churchill, another man of greatness and purpose, is the only other person who has received honorary United States citizenship.

Raoul Wallenberg personifies the ideal of uncompromising determination in the furtherance of human dignity and freedom. As he strived to obtain freedom for so many others during the dark days of Nazi Germany, it is only right that free people everywhere work to obtain his freedom. I have thus directed that my Administration take all possible steps to ascertain his whereabouts and secure his release.

During the signing ceremony at the White House I said about Raoul Wallenberg that "wherever he is, his humanity burns like a torch." We must ensure that this torch of freedom continues to burn brightly and that it will be passed on from one generation to another.

Therefore, I propose that the peoples of Sweden and the United States join together to create the Raoul Wallenberg Award for Human Freedom. If you agree, we would explore together the formation of a joint Swedish-U.S. commission of prominent citizens to administer the Award which would be given to an individual or group who had made an outstanding contribution to the advancement of human rights and

freedom. Like the Nobel Prize, an established amount of money could accompany the Award. I am certain the funds could be raised from private contributions. The Award could be given on an "as merited" basis rather than annually.


We face many challenges throughout the world which demand conviction and courage from all of us. The Raoul Wallenberg Award for Human Freedom could be an effective torch and beacon for the struggle for freedom everywhere. I would be pleased to explore this idea further with you and your Government.

Prince Bertil will be in Washington January 28 for a meeting of the Swedish Council of America, in which Secretaries Regan and Baldrige have been invited to participate.
