Dear Ms. Sherman:

I am replying to your letter to the President of December 2, 1986, concerning a member of the Israeli Defense Forces (IDF), Zachary Baumel, who has been missing in action (MIA) since the fighting in Lebanon in June 1982.

We fully share the concern of the families of those members of the IDF who remain missing in action. The U.S. Government continues to take an active interest in the status of the POWs and MIAs resulting from the conflict in Lebanon. Working with the ICRC and other organizations, we have made extensive efforts to locate those still unaccounted for.

Despite these efforts, however, the fate of Zachary Baumel and the other MIAs is still unknown. In pursuing all available leads, we have never received confirmation that Mr. Baumel or the other two MIAs are being held in Syria or anywhere else. Reports alluding to their possible whereabouts have never been substantiated.

I regret that we cannot be more optimistic regarding the fate of Zachary Baumel. Nevertheless, we continue to hope that his status will ultimately be favorably resolved.

Dear Jueis.

We would like to share the good news with you that progress is steadily being made in determining the disposition and location of our son, Zachary and the other MIA's from the Lebanon War.

My husband and our American-Israeli attorney, Newton Frohlich, recently returned frmm a country hostile to Israel where they met with an Arab who testified in front of U. S. diplomatic personnel that he had seen Zachary in captivity. The place was eastern Lebanon, very close to the Syrian border (an area constantly under Syrian control), and the time was December 1982. He also stated that, in May 1985 (time of the last prisoner exchange), he had verified that Zachary was still alive and well. When queried about the other prisoners, this witness maintained that there were one or two others being held with Zachary but refused to specify, claiming he was authorized to discuss our son alone.

This trip was only made possible by the active cooperation of Assistant Secretary of State Murphy, the approval of Defense Minister Rabin, and the tacit approval of the "host" country. And, frankly, this resulted safter we ourselves had personally enlisted some contacts in the U.S. to press for some positive action on the part of the State Department.

Due to the delicate nature of the behind-the-scenes negotiations, this information should not reach the media. However, we urgently require the continued support of the State Department. And so, we turn to you at this crucial time to utilize any and all influence you may have in political and diplomatic spheres (e. g., governors, mayors, Republican Party and community leaders) and request that the State Department expedite whatever activities are necessary, indicating that many U. S. citizens are interested and concerned about this matter.

Reports now continuously confirm that there are prisoners still being held hidden, despite Syrian disclaimers of knowledge. No matter who is actually is holding them, Syria is legally and morally responsible for the welfare of these prisoners of war, they last having been seen publicly in Damascus. The fact that prisoners were displayed there on June 11th, 1982 was announced by the media internationally, including Radio Monte Carlo. Syria must, therefore, be pressed by all civilized nations of the world to reveal their whereabouts to the Red Cross, as set out by the Geneva Convention of 1949. There are countries with close ties to Syria whom the U. S. could request to use their diplomatic and commercial conduits to influence better Syrian cooperation.

Any ideas or suggestions you may have would be most welcome. The families join me in thanking you for past and future endeavors on behalf of their loved ones. With best wishes to you and yours for the New Year,



Dear Mr. President:

I am writing to ask for your help and assistance in securing freedom for Zvi Feldman, Yehudah Katz, and Zachary Baumel.

As you know, these three young Israeli soldiers were captured during the Lebanese conflict and reportedly paraded through the streets of Damascus in June, 1982. In spite of this, the Syrian government denies having any knowledge about their whereabouts.

Recognizing our own limited influence with the Syrian government, I believe the United States should be actively pressing the Syrians to be more forthcoming about the fate of Feldman, Katz, and Baumel. For one thing, it is my understanding that Zachary Baumel is an American citizen. Moreover, just as you asked Israel for its help and assistance in securing the release of Americans held hostage in Lebanon, I believe our government should be prepared to do everything it can to help Israel secure the release of its own young men.

Consequently, I hope you will direct the State Department and other agencies of the United States government to lend all possible assistance in locating and securing the release of these young men, and to provide any information that we have about their fate to the Israeli government.

Your assistance in this matter will be deeply appreciated.

Dear Ms. Klein:

The President has asked me to respond to your letter dated July 21 appealing to him to use the U.S. Government's moral suasion with the Government of Syria to permit the emigration of its small remaining Jewish population and to release those Jews in prison due to their ethnicity.

As your letter correctly notes, the difficulty experienced by Syrian Jews obtaining permission to emigrate freely, in violation of international standards of human rights, is one regularly faced by members of that small community. With the exception of those Jews who have been arrested recently along with hundreds of other Syrians for violations of strict currency and trade laws, infractions of the harsh emigration restrictions accounts for many of the Jews we understand to be currently in Syrian prisons. The U.S. Government, well aware of this troubling situation, has made numerous representations to the Syrian Government, often at the highest level, urging the Syrians to abide by their international obligations not to impede travel or hinder the right of emigration. Dear Mr. President,

I have on this day conveyed the enclosed letter to Ambassador Murphy to protest his actions in Syria, whereby the U.S. position on the Lebanese election was totally abandoned and the Syrian position adopted in toto.

How, Mr. President, can the Administration point with pride to its various accomplishments in the area of foreign affairs while Lebanon and her people are allowed to be made the exceptions to the rule of international law and of simple human rights? How can we, with any degree of pride, point to our victory in Grenada, or the rising democratic tide in South America and China, or to the treaties with the Soviets, if we are willing to barter away the democracy and rights of self determination and freedom of the brave people of Lebanon?

Ambassador Murphy's sell out of the Lebanese at the bargaining table in Damascus is totally reprehensible and repugnant to all that America stands for. The Lebanese People, both Christian and Moslem are being locked out of their own presidential selection process by this Murphy/Assad accord. The Lebanese had trusted the Representative of the Leader of the Free World, the Champion of the under dog and the Champion of the human rights of people around the globe, to stand up to their occupier. They trusted the U.S. Representative to use the moral and material might of the United States to force the illegitimate occupier to let up from its strangle hold on the Lebanese body politic long enough to allow its constitutional process to work.

For their trust in the United States, what have the Lebanese received, Mr. President? The Champion of Freedom has used its might to bolster the demands of the foes to Lebanese freedom. The Champion of Freedom has not drowned out the Syrian demand of continued illicit domination of Lebanon, but has amplified it and made it the policy of the United States Government which you lead.

Ambassador Murphy should be reprimanded and removed from this position of responsibility before there is any further desertion and deviation from American policy and standards. His caving in to Syrian demands to dominate its neighbor deserve a Senate investigation.

In light of the fact that Syria has overseen the unprecedented expansion of heroin and hashish cultivation of the Bekaa Valley; in light of the fact that much of that product, which has a \$30 billion street value, reaches illegal American markets and is the object of gang wars that are turning U.S. cities into multiple West Beiruts, why is our Ambassador appeasing Syria? Why is our Ambassador contributing to the creation in Lebanon of another drug lord armed with the full authority of the State?

The Reagan Doctrine, implemented in Grenada, Afganistan and Nicaragua, states that the U.S. will come to the assistance of any people who request help in securing democratic rule and self determination for themselves and their country. Are the Lebanese not such a People? Is their fight for freedom from Syrian occupation any different than that of the Contra fight against the Sandinista's; the mujahadin struggle against the Soviet imposed puppet regime; or the struggle of the Grenadians against Cuban occupation?

Given the developments of the past 24 hours in Damascus, the Lebanese and Americans of Lebanese Heritage can only question whether the State Department takes the Reagan Doctrine seriously as the policy of the United States Government.

In 14 years of war, much has been taken from the Lebanese. Their symbol of hope, their symbol of national unity and the light that can lead them back from the chaos to sanity has been the continuity of the Office of the President of the Republic. He has always been theirs.

The Murphy/Assad accord threatens to removes this hope.

The likelihood of an election now is quite remote. The Lebanese are united in their conviction not to fill the sacred office of President of the Republic with a foreign imposed puppet. As Patriarch Sfeir told Ambassador Murphy, even during the days of the Ottoman Empire, before Lebanese Independence, the Turkish sultan did not try impose a ruler in the way that Ambassador Murphy has.

At this time of crisis, we ask for resolve, not from the State Department, but from you, Mr. President. As the the Leader of the Free World, we ask that you stand tall and walk tall on the side of right, not on the side of might.

We call upon you, Mr. President, to personally invoke and implement the Reagan Doctrine for the Lebanese Freedom Fighters. We ask you to publicly renounce the State Department doctrine of creating stability at all costs, even at the cost of freedom.

The Lebanese, as well as we American Lebanese, still consider the Office of the President of the United States, as the appeal of last resort for a people fighting the chains of an unwanted occupation in pursuit of freedom.

Dear Ambassador Murphy,

In light of the announced U.S. Policy regarding the Lebanese Presidential Elections, and statements made by Mr. Kattouf of your office, that the purpose of your mission to Damascus this past week was to "get the Syrians to back off", we are in a state of shock and dismay at the revelation of the outcome of your meetings with President Assad.

I had read your words that "The choice of the new President is for the Lebanese themselves to make . . . the new President must represent all of the Lebanese people", and he "must promote national reconciliation" in Lebanon. I can not square such statements with your action of not only accepting the Syrian selection, but also conveying that demand to the Lebanese and insisting that he, and he alone, be elected. Though you were to consult with the Lebanese, the Syrian choice was adopted without your having consulted with the Lebanese. This is an outrage. It is a 180 degree deviation from stated policy and assurances given from your office.

We are very deeply disappointed by your actions. We shall have our disappointment in you and in the State Department's handling of the entire election process in Lebanon made known to the President and to the Members of Congress.
