Dear President Reagan:

Two years ago, on the occasion of the ground-breaking ceremonies of the Detroit Holocaust Memorial Center, you and Mrs. Reagan were kind enough to extend your good wishes with the hope that these ".....notable and worthy plans be completed with Godspeed."

We are pleased to report, Mr. President, that we have now completed our task of establishing the first facility of its kind in the United States designed exclusively as a fitting memorial to the victims of the Holocaust, as a major research center, and as a primary educational institution.

We have achieved this noteworthy goal with the assistance of many dedicated people from all segments of the civic community, and with the encouragement of respected individuals from all walks of life. The Detroit Holocaust Memorial Center has already had an impact far beyond our local community. We are proud of this accomplishment and grateful to those who have offered their encouragement and support.

In addition to an extensive museum, multi-media theater, hall of Jewish culture, memorial flame and garden area dedicated to those known as the Righteous Gentiles, the Memorial Center will house a library, archive, conference facility and video-tape study area. While serving the general public in an important educational role, we will also engage in original research focusing on all aspects of the Holocaust including a special institute on genocidal studies. A comprehensive research project concerning the dynamics of Jewish communal, social, and educational life in pre-Holocaust Europe is now a vital and integral part of the Holocaust Memorial Center program.
