THE CHILDREN OF HOLOCAUST SURVIVORS HONOR...





Mr. Speaker, we in the United States cannot but have the deepest sympathy for the plight of the Jewish population in Nazidominated Europe.

Our State Department has suggested to the British Government that a meeting be held in Ottawa to consider means to alleviating the situation of these helpless people, to which a favorable reply has been received.

I call upon our Government and the British Government for speed in their study of this serious problem.

Those who are murdered in the immediate future cannot be brought back to life.

....Rep. Robert W. Kean, R-NJ, Friday, March 19, 1943, in the U.S. House of Representatives Unfortunately, little came of the late Rep. Kean's plea for speedy action. And, before World War II was over, six million people, whose only crime was that they were Jews, were brutally murdered men, women and even children.

That the toll was not even higher—the Nazi master plan called for total extermination—is a tribute to the indomitable spirit and courage of the Jewish people, of men and women like our mothers and fathers who endured and ultimately prevailed against an evil whose dimensions the world has yet to fully comprehend. Therefore, this night we honor them—the survivors—and pledge our everlasting efforts to make humanity safe against another such outrage.

A 15-foot bronze monument by world-renowned sculptor Nathan Rapoport will depict a compassionate American soldier carrying a concentration camp survivor. This monument will stand as testimony to the commitment of America, particularly of our armed forces, to the liberation of the Holocaust Survivors.

The commemorative monument will be erected in Liberty State Park, Jersey City, by Spring, 1985, the 40th anniversary of the end of World War II. As New Jersey Governor Thomas H. Kean, son of Rep. Kean, pointed out, "It will stand as a universal symbol of the American commitment to liberty for the oppressed and help for the suffering."
