SUBJECT:

Establishment of a Working Group on the Multifiber Arrangement (MFA)

At its May 16 meeting the Economic Policy Council decided to establish a task force under USTR's chairmanship on renewal of the Multifiber Arrangement. Pursuant to that decision, I have asked Ambassador Richard Imus, the present Chief Textile Negotiator, and Ambassador Charles Carlisle, expected to be his successor, to chair an interagency working group which would, among other things:

- 1. Identify issues arising out of the expiration of the present MFA on July 31, 1986, and negotiations to establish a possible new arrangement.
- 2. Consider ways to address each of the major issues.
- 3. Make arrangements to collect information and data that will assist the policy-making process.
- 4. Recommend a U.S. position on MFA renewal to Cabinet officers.

I would appreciate each agency's designating a senior person to serve on the Working Group and notifying my office by this

Friday, May 24 of its selection. We plan to hold a first meeting late in the week of May 27.

Active negotiations on a new MFA probably will not commence until sometime this fall. Thus, the Group's work is likely to continue for a number of months.
