Christian Democrat Party leader Ciriaco De Mita will be in Washington on May 31 with a group of Italian political scientists. Rinaldo Petrignani has written (Tab A), requesting that you meet briefly with De Mita to receive a personal assessment of the domestic political situation after the recent elections -- in which the five-party democratic coalition did quite well and the Communists faltered.

Your schedule is relatively open that day, and a brief visit by De Mita would serve as a further boost to the Christian Democrats. However, you did see him in January and we don't want to open the door to another round of visits by Italian political figures. Therefore, I recommend that you decline this request, and have prepared a letter from you to Rinaldo.

### RECOMMENDATION

That you sign the letter to Petrignani at Tab I, regretting that vou will not be able to meet with De Mita.
