SUBJECT: Appointment Request: Italian Prime Minister Fanfani

Amintore Fanfani, Prime Minister of Italy, has requested a meeting with the President either Monday, May 4 or Tuesday, May 5 to finalize preparations for the Venice Summit. He hopes to visit Ottawa, Washington, and Tokyo during the first week of May and to confer also with the other European Summit leaders.

Fanfani, an experienced, respected Italian politician, will be in charge of the Italian government at the time of the President's state visit to Rome and will chair the Economic Summit this June. He will then lead the country until elections, possibly June 14, and the formation of a new government.

We have important objectives at the Venice Summit concerning agriculture, international monetary and trade policy, East-West relations and arms control, terrorism, and South Africa. We do not yet have agreement to all of our major initiatives. Fanfani wants to take a leadership role at the Summit and we believe he will be responsive to our goals. The Department of State strongly endorses this request for an appointment with the President in the interest of a successful Summit.

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

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
