That Conference was attended by a number of leading Italian and American business leaders (Gianni Agnelli, Carlo de Benedetti, Jim Robinson, John Phelan, etc.). As a result of the Conference, the Italians formed a National Task Force on Private Sector Initiatives.

The President is scheduled to meet with Italian Prime Minister Goria on December 16, 1987. In light of the developments in Italy and the President's strong interest in promoting Private Sector Initiatives, some type of Private Sector Initiatives event may be appropriate for that visit. This could range from simply adding it to the official discussion agenda to something on a larger scale such as a meeting of the Italian and American Private Sector Initiatives Committees.

I have discussed this with Ty Cobb and he is enthusiastic about the concept.

Could you please advise as to how you feel we should proceed.

Ciriaco De Mita, head of Italy's largest political party, the Christian Democrats, has requested a brief meeting with the President any time during the week of April 11. De Mita will be in Washington as part of the Alcide de Gasperi Foundation's program to commemorate the Marshall Plan with Christian Democratic leaders in four U.S. cities. De Mita plans to see the Secretary.

De Mita is currently expected to become Italy's next Prime Minister, possibly just before or after the April 26 Christian Democratic party congress.

The Italians are important allies and we will need their support this year on arms control and Persian Gulf questions. De Mita, as Secretary of Italy's largest party and likely next Prime Minister, could prove helpful to us in achieving our major international objectives. He had brief meetings with the President when he visited Washington in 1984 and 1986. The Department of State endorses this request for a brief meeting during the week of April 11 if the President's schedule permits.





MEMORANDUM FOR COLIN L. POWELL

SUBJECT: Appointment Request: Italian Christian Democratic Party Secretary De Mita

Ciriaco De Mita, head of Italy's largest political party, the Christian Democrats, has requested a brief meeting with the President any time during the week of April 11. De Mita will be in Washington as part of the Alcide de Gasperi Foundation's program to commemorate the Marshall Plan with Christian Democratic leaders in four U.S. cities. De Mita plans to see the Secretary.

THE WHITE HOUSE

De Mita is currently expected to become Italy's next Prime Minister, possibly just before or after the April 26 Christian Democratic party congress.

The Italians are important allies and we will need their support this year on arms control and Persian Gulf questions. De Mita, as Secretary of Italy's largest party and likely next Prime Minister, could prove helpful to us in achieving our major international objectives. He had brief meetings with the President when he visited Washington in 1984 and 1986. The Department of State endorses this request for a brief meeting during the week of April 11 if the President's schedule permits.
