With Italian Prime Minister De Mita

Introductory

- Pleased to see you again and to welcome you on your first Washington visit as Prime Minister; recall our meetings in 1984 and 1986 when you came as head of the Christian Democratic Party.
- Your visit comes at an important time for the Alliance; we have made great progress on arms control; Italy has made an extraordinary contribution to this progress, with your initial acceptance of INF deployments in Sicily and your willingness now to consider accepting the 401st Wing from Spain.
- We greatly value our close ties with Italy; look forward to continuing our excellent cooperation with your government on many areas of key importance to both our countries.
- Pleased to have Max Rabb, our Ambassador to Italy, here again today; as the longest-serving Ambassador to Italy, he has made an extraordinary contribution by enhancing the ties between our two governments, and our two peoples.

Transfer of the 401st Tactical Fighter Wing

- ~~(If Italian Parliament has formally decided to accept the 401st Tactical Fighter Wing) We greatly appreciate Italy's decision to take the Wing; once again, you have shown what a staunch and dedicated ally your country is.~~
- (If not announced yet) > We appreciate your efforts to get Parliamentary approval to take the Wing; understand your political sensitivities, hope that you will be able to gain approval soon.
- NATO is strong today because individual Allies have taken on responsibilities for our common defense; the INF Agreement shows the success of these efforts; Italy's contribution, most recently on the 401st, is that of a true, exemplary Ally.

-- Pleased that you and your Cabinet agreed unanimously June 7 to accept the 401st; understand your Parliament will discuss issue June 16-17 and that the coalition parties ~~are~~ remain in agreement to take the wing

East-West and Arms Control Issues

- The Moscow Summit was an unqualified success; clear the Soviets are seriously engaged; they want to continue to work with us; this success shows the NATO approach to East-West dialogue was right on target.
- I want to continue this work; hope to leave solid progress, a stepping-off place for my successor.
- Human rights were very much on our minds in Moscow, given recent events: the Vienna CSCE end-game, publication of the CPSU Conference themes; we must look for concrete results, but are pleased joint statement's references to human rights goes well beyond any previous document subscribed to by Soviets.
- Bilateral topics: signed a number of agreements at Summit, e.g. cooperation on transportation, science and technology; implementation on cultural exchanges.
- On arms control, pleased INF Agreement was ratified before Summit; appreciate the quick work of your Parliament in ratifying Country Basing Agreement; we still have full arms control agenda; will build on progress in START; must maintain Allied unity as we work on chemical weapons, conventional arms control.
- In START discussions, we focussed particularly on ALCMS issues and verification of mobile ICBMs, should they be allowed; made substantial progress, though we ran into problems on SLCMs and space; we are moving forward step by step.
- Secretary Shultz and Minister Shevardnadze signed joint verification experiment (JVE) agreement; have reached new levels of on-site presence for verification, more than 50 people now at each other's nuclear testing sites; first time any foreigners, including East Europeans, visit Soviet weapons site.
- We agreed on substantial work program on all four areas of U.S. Soviet agenda; both sides remain determined to conclude a START treaty; we should be able to implement the JVE and proceed with ratification of the testing treaties; in the event of a START agreement, another summit would be appropriate, but do not want to get locked into a deadline psychology.

Middle East Issues

- (Talking points on the Secretary's trip to the region to be provided once trip is completed)
- On Persian Gulf, we appreciate your continued participation in the Gulf naval force; hope you will continue as long as the situation warrants our presence there.
- We are concerned that U.N. Resolution 598 remains unimplemented; we fully support Secretary General's efforts to negotiate implementation of 598; both sides must show more flexibility, but basic problem remains Iranian refusal to accept 598.
- We continue to believe that enforcement measures are necessary to bring pressure on Iran to negotiate in good faith; Soviet opposition to early adoption of an enforcement resolution remains the principal obstacle; we must all try to convince Soviets that delay is dangerous, will prolong war.
- On Libya, we remain concerned about Qadhafi's support for terrorism; continue our economic and diplomatic pressure on him; hope you will do the same.

Toronto Summit: Economic Issues

- This will be your first Summit, my seventh; the Summit countries have made great progress together in this framework.
- I have been struck by the remarkable progress made in the international economy over these years; Summit countries are now more in agreement on fundamental economic issues than they ever have been; the economic outlook is good.
- We must address agriculture; agricultural subsidies bankrupt our economies, cause trade frictions among us, injure developing countries; hope Summit can endorse urgent need for tangible progress towards market-oriented long-term reform at the Uruguay Round mid-term review this December.

Toronto Summit: Political Issues

- We expect leaders will want to discuss our common approach to East-West relations, review success to date, prospects for future.
- At Toronto I will also propose calling for strengthened actions against narcotics supply and continued cooperation in the fight against terrorism.
- Must also discuss terrorism; not to do so would suggest we are letting down our guard.
- On your proposal to strengthen international environmental protection activities, we agree with the general thrust; particularly important that all Summit countries ratify the Montreal Protocol on ozone and endorse the work now underway on key issues of global climate change; we will support your initiative that these points be noted at the Summit.

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with the mandate received from the Venice Summit, Italy is pleased to host the Fifth Conference of the Economic Summit Countries on the ethical, legal, and social aspects connected with the developments in the biological sciences. The theme of the conference will be "The Sequencing of Human Genomes - Ethical Issues". This conference will take place in Rome from April 11 to 15, 1988.

All the industrialized nations are involved to various degrees and in different ways in the research on the sequencing of human genomes. It is to be expected that greater knowledge of the individual genetic inheritance will open up enormous scientific possibilities in the field of forecasting, diagnosis, and treatment of hereditary diseases, but at the same time it will raise a series of sensitive problems connected with the possible abuse of the acquired information.

I hope that the proposed conference will permit a useful discussion of these problems which involve personal, interpersonal, and social aspects. Given the ground-breaking nature of this problem, we do not expect that the conference will generate recommendations to the governments involved, but we hope that the concepts of some key points will be thoroughly examined with a view to furthering the subsequent development of common attitudes and conceptions.

I would be grateful if you would appoint a national delegation of three persons who could contribute to the clarification of the scientific, ethical, and legal aspects of this matter. The office of the Minister for Scientific Research and Technology is organizing the conference with the support of the National Research Council (CNR). It will transmit further details and information through diplomatic channels to each of the governments involved. In keeping with tradition, we also hope to welcome representatives of the International Council of Scientific Unions, the European Science Foundation, and the World Health Organization in addition to those of the Summit countries and Commission of the European Communities to the conference.

The final report of this conference can then be discussed in the course of the next Economic Summit in Toronto, thus laying the basis for a fruitful international cooperation in this important sector.
