

Bettino Craxi, former Italian Prime Minister and current leader of the Italian Socialist Party, has requested a brief "farewell" meeting and photo opportunity with the President during his October 20-22 visit to Washington. Craxi will be in Washington primarily to receive an award from the National Italian-American Foundation. He will be the guest of honor at an October 21 luncheon hosted by Secretary Shultz and also hopes to meet with the Vice President.

Craxi is widely considered the strongest figure in Italian politics today. He is the major contender to succeed Prime Minister De Mita should the Christian Democrats leave office.

Craxi's support could prove to be a strong asset to the U.S. in achieving major international objectives. The State Department endorses this request for a photo opportunity and brief meeting if the President's schedule permits.

Craxi last met with the President during his state visit to Washington in March of 1985.

Issue

Whether to sign the attached letter to Italian Prime Minister Ciriaco De Mita.

Fact

Prime Minister De Mita must soon decide whether to approve a joint-venture arrangement between AT&T and ITATEL, a major Italian firm, to upgrade telecommunications in that country. stakes are considerable: \$200 million a year, and a strong foothold in the European telecommunications market. French President Mitterrand and German Chancellor Kohl have already pressed De Mita personally to turn down AT&T and to accept one of their firms instead.

Discussion

You will be seeing Prime Minister De Mita in Washington December 15. De Mita has yet to decide on the AT&T proposal, aware of the pressures coming from his fellow European allies. Ambassador Rabb believes a letter from you to De Mita prior to the December 15 meeting could help tilt the scales back in favor of AT&T, which has made the superior technical proposal. The Departments of State and Commerce and the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative recommend that you send a letter as well.



Dear Ciriaco:

I am delighted that we will have another opportunity to meet in Washington December 15. The meeting will give us a chance to catch up on the progress we have made on East-West relations -- including my meeting in New York with President Gorbachev -- and to discuss the challenges that lie ahead for the West.

As you and I discussed in our last meeting in Washington, we face two challenges. The first is to maintain Allied unity in forging a common approach to the Soviet Union; one that preserves our strength but also tests Mr. Gorbachev's readiness to negotiate the resolution of outstanding differences.

The second challenge is to ensure that our markets remain open, and that we avoid protectionist pressures. In this context, I am pleased to learn that you are considering a proposal by AT&T to enter into a partnership with ITATEL. A decision on your part to approve this partnership between a major U.S. firm and an Italian firm would send a strong signal that, as Europe prepares to implement the Single European Act, the open and free trading system we have worked hard to support will be maintained.



I look forward to seeing you next week in Washington.

The 'Dino Ferrari Centre' for the prevention, diagnosis and therapy of neuromuscular diseases offers a wide range of medical services besides its clinical research program and participates in hospital programs which involve both clinical health care and research.

The role of the "Dino Ferrari Centre" is to offer a service of high scientific level, that comprises the latest methods of diagnostic research which makes it one of the leading centres specializing in neuromuscular pathology in Italy.

Besides its diagnostic service and research, thanks to its affiliation with the University of Milan, the Centre also runs a training program for hospital personnel, a program which in indispensable to a society that wants to offer the public a health service which is able to improve the quality of life.

As support system to the Centre, the "Friends of the 'Dino Ferrari Centre' Associations" was created with the aim of financing the Centre's programs with special reference to scientific research.

The association, which is presided over by Mrs Anna Craxi and whose honorary president is Enzo Ferrari, also organizes various events, such as cultural evenings, concerts, shows and an annual ball with a rally of vintage Ferrari cars, the proceeds of which are then donated to the Centre together with other public and private funding.

These funds go towards expanding the expensive equipment which is so essential for research, and to offering study grants to our young researchers who are constantly updating studies in some of the most prestigious American and European research centres which include: Colombia University in New York, the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota, Pennsylvania University, l'Hôpital de la Salpetrière in Paris and Queens Hospital in London.

At present the "Friends of the 'Dino Ferrari Centre' Association" together with the MDA presided over by Jerry Lewis is organizing a grand Gala benefit in Los Angeles next spring. Aimed at a select sector of the public, this benefit will take place in a magnificent setting and will feature an elegant candle-light dinner, an orchestra and ball and the guest appearance of some famous stars. All this will be enlivened by a show of the famous vintage Ferrari cars.

Well aware of the American public's deep sensitivity towards such distressing problems as neuromuscular diseases, we are hoping for considerable public partecdsipation and a highly successful benefit.
