Dear Mr. President,

Permit me on the occasion of our celebration of Christmas to offer to your gracious wife, your family and yourself, the good wishes and prayers of the Assembly of Catholic Patriarchs and Bishops in Lebanon of which I am President.

It is now fourteen months since you so warmly received me with His Eminence, Terence Cardinal Cooke, at your Official Residence. On that occasion we visited you in the hope of future, courageous action on the part of your Government in favour of troubled Lebanon. You have not failed us.

Finally, let me say that our Assembly greatly appreciates the warm welcome extended to our young President, Cheikh Amine Gemayel, when he visited you recently. It heartens us to know that he has the backing and good-will of your Government. He will need it to withstand the pressures from within the Arab World and pressures from our neighbour, Israel, – pressures which would put him unwisely in the position of having to resist the one to please the other, when what we need is the opportunity to live in peace with all our neighbours.

We pray that, during these coming Holy Days, the year ahead will be a wise one for all of us; that the Wisdom of the Almighty guide us, so that the Peace of the Lord of Justice and Love reigns all round us. We pray, especially, Mr. President, that your own good endeavours be blessed with abundant success.

Dear Mr. Secretary General:

I greatly appreciated your letter of June 24 in which you reiterated your deep concern about the situation in Lebanon. Your decision to send a letter to Prime Minister Begin of Israel, which you quoted, and a separate letter to President al-Assad of Syria was an important contribution to the continuing international effort to end the hostilities.

As you know, Ambassador Philip Habib has worked unstintingly on the scene in Beirut, as my personal representative, to bring about a ceasefire and a withdrawal of all foreign armed forces from Lebanon. At this moment, Ambassador Habib's efforts seem close to success, though in a situation of such gravity we must continue to ensure that there is no miscalculation which could undermine the progress he has made. I can assure you that the United States will continue to do all in its power to achieve the goals of Security Council Resolutions 508, 509 and 516 at the earliest possible time and to restore fully the

Dear Mr. President,

I recall our recent conversation and in particular our discussion of the situation in Lebanon. I know that you share my own very great concern about developments in that country and the fact that the situation has deteriorated further since we met.

I have today addressed the following message to Prime Minister Begin of Israel:

"I recall our recent conversation about the situation in Lebanon. Since that time there would appear to have been a renewed escalation of hostilities and a situation in which the cease-fires announced are no longer effective.

"You are certainly aware of the resolutions of the Security Council relating to this matter. I am deeply concerned at the present situation and all the possibilities and dangers inherent in it if the fighting continues. I have particularly in mind the enormous hazards which inevitably threaten the civilian population. I know that you too are deeply concerned with this aspect of the present situation.

"I therefore appeal to you to do everything in your power to bring about an urgent end to the present hostilities so that solutions to current problems can be negotiated. You will understand, I am sure, why I have felt obliged to communicate with you in the present extremely ominous situation, which also has serious implications for world peace."

I have also addressed a message to President Al-Assad of Syria on the present situation in Lebanon.

Reports now being received indicate that the matter is of the greatest possible urgency. I would therefore hope very much that you would see fit to support my appeal in any way that you can. I would also like to recall that the United Nations has Military Observers in the Middle East who, subject to the agreement of the Security Council, would be immediately available to assist in implementing a cease-fire if one could be brought about. I have already made this suggestion on 13 June to the Security Council.
