Dear Mr. Lindholm:

I am replying to your letter to President Reagan concerning the status of the Reverend Benjamin Weir, who was kidnapped in Beirut in May 1984. I regret the long delay in this response.

We are very concerned about the continuing terrorist attacks on Americans in Beirut, of which Mr. Weir's kidnapping is another tragic example. Although an organization calling itself "Islamic Jihad" has claimed responsibility for the kidnapping, virtually nothing is known about the group.

The Department of State and our Embassy in Beirut are following every possible avenue to effect Mr. Weir's safe release. We continue to be in contact with a variety of parties in the region and are pursuing all possible avenues of inquiry. We have carefully questioned escaped hostage Jeremy Levin for clues that might be helpful and are following up on all leads. We also remain in close consultation with the Weir family.

Let me assure you we will continue our efforts on Mr. Weir's behalf. As President Reagan said, we have not forgotten those who are being held.

Dear Mr. Abourezk:

I am responding to your letter of March 5 to the President concerning the situation in south Lebanon.

Let me assure you that the Administration shares your concern over the recent escalation of violence in south Lebanon. We have pursued every available diplomatic channel in an effort to avert this tragic situation, and we continue to urge all parties to exercise restraint and to end the violent cycle of attack and counter-attack.

We believe that agreed-upon security arrangements offer the best opportunity for an orderly Israeli withdrawal. Regrettably, Lebanon and Israel were unable to reach agreement on such arrangements at the UN-sponsored talks at Naqura, and Israel subsequently decided to withdraw unilaterally. We support the speedy and complete withdrawal of Israeli forces to the international border. To achieve this, we believe that practical military coordination between Lebanon and Israel would be more useful than inflammatory rhetoric about national resistance, which can only incite more violence.

Our goals in Lebanon remain constant: complete withdrawal of all foreign forces; a sovereign, independent, united Lebanon; and a stable and secure Lebanese-Israeli border. The best hope for peace and security for the people of south Lebanon is a rapid and coordinated Israeli withdrawal resulting in the restoration of central Lebanese government sovereignty and control over the region. We will continue to do everything possible to assist in progress toward these goals.

I hope that this is helpful in addressing your concerns.



Dear Dr. Di Caprio:

I am responding on behalf of President Reagan to your letter of March 20 regarding the safety of the kidnapped Americans in Lebanon and the actions of the Israeli Defense Forces in southern Lebanon.

We sincerely appreciate your concern regarding the well-being of the American citizens being held hostage in Lebanon, and your willingness to make an appeal to their captors. We encourage you to do so. We believe that such an appeal could be successfully addressed through any responsible Muslim cleric in Lebanon or through the Iranian Government.

The continuing cycle of violence in southern Lebanon is disturbing to all Americans. We have been assured by the Government of Israel that it intends to withdraw fully from Lebanon in an orderly manner, and believe that they would do so more rapidly in the absence of continued violence against their forces. We have seen the allegations of acts on both sides that we abhor. We are convinced that acts of desecration, if true, are contrary to the policies and instructions of the Israeli Government, and are due solely to individuals acting irresponsibly in an atmosphere of fear.

The Administration is deeply committed to peace in Lebanon and the sovereignty of Lebanon; we have worked hard to secure the withdrawal of occupation forces from Lebanon, and were prepared to accept a consensus statement in the United Nations Security Council that would have respected the rights of all parties. However, we believed that the resolution that was presented on March 12 by the Lebanese Government was unbalanced and would not contribute to an end to the agony of south Lebanon, and therefore voted against it.

I hope this information is of assistance to you, and am greatful for your concern for the fate of the captive Americans.

Dear Mr. President:

I am writing to express the concerns of the American Muslim community that we represent concerning the situation in Lebanon. For the present, I shall focus on two main areas of concern:

- 1. The safety and well-being of American citizens, including those who have been kidnapped.
- 2. The "iron fist" operations of the Israeli military forces. Raids have been conducted on villages with the loss of innocent lives and destruction of homes. In addition, it was reported in The "ew York Times(March 3, 1985, page 10, columns 3,4) that "In some villages, according to local residents, the Israeli troops have ripped up the Koran, the Moslem holy book in the mosques." One resident from the village of Mansouri related that ' "They went to the mosque, and first they cut the pages out of the Koran and then they put their boots on it".'

As regards the kidnapped Americans, our Executive Committee would consider an appeal to the captors if you can provide the means of communication.

As regards the actions of the Israeli military forces in southern Lebanon, we feel, and we hope you do as well, a degree of responsibility in view of the assistance we provide Israel. On March 12, 1985, Ambassador Kirkpatrick vetoed the United Nations Security Council resolution condemning Israeli practices in southern Lebanon. Does this veto indicate that our government condones and approves of the actions taken by Israeli military forces? If this interpretation is not correct, what is the position of your administration in this regard? With regard to the alleged acts of desecration of the Koran, are you willing to request the Israeli government to investigate the matter?

Dear Assemblyman Stirling:

I am replying further to your letter to President Reagan concerning the status of the Reverend Benjamin Weir, who was kidnapped in Beirut in May 1984. I regret the delay in this response.

The U.S. Government is very concerned about the terrorist attacks on Americans in Beirut, of which Mr. Weir's kidnapping is a tragic example. As you may know, an organization calling itself "Islamic Jihad" has claimed responsibility for the kidnapping, but very little is known about the group.

The Department of State and our Embassies overseas are following every possible lead to effect Mr. Weir's safe release. We continue to be in contact with a variety of parties in the region and are pursuing all possible avenues of inquiry. We also remain in close consultation with the Weir family.

We understand your concern for Mr. Weir's safe return, and share your impatience, but believe we should not comment specifically on our ongoing, intensive efforts. Throughout Mr. Weir's captivity, it has been our policy not to discuss the details of our efforts to secure his release or that of the other kidnapped Americans. Such publicity would not be helpful. We believe it only offers continued incentive for the captors to retain their hostages, and ultimately could prove harmful to the efforts to secure their release.

Let me assure you we will continue our efforts on Mr. Weir's behalf. As President Reagan said, we have not forgotten those who are being held.

Kidnaped U.S. Cleric's Letters Ask Church Aid

SAN DIEGO (A)—A Presbyterian minister kidnaped by terrorists in Beirul last year has written two letters asking church superiors to prod the U.S. government into taking decisive action to win his release, relatives said Monday.

The letters, written in longhand and addressed to two church leaders, were "definitely" from the Rev. Benjamin Weir, who was abducted May 8 by three men while walking to work in West Beirut, said his son, John Weir.

"It's definitely his writing but not his composition," John Weir said. The style and types of statements were certainly not what he would include in a letter. Obviously, someone else told him what to

A radical group known as Islamic Jihad (Islamic Holy War) is believed to be behind the kidnaping of Weir and four other Americans last year, including Jeremy Levin, Beirut bureau chief for Cable News Network. Levin, reporting that he

escaped his captors, surfaced last month after 11 months.

The group also is believed responsible for the recent abductions of Terry A. Anderson, chief Middle East correspondent for the Associated Press, and two Britons.

Meanwhile, the 3.1 millionmember Presbyterian church has been asked to begin a postcard campaign as part of the effort to win Weir's release, church spokesman Allen Kratz said.

The request was made by Dr. Oscar McCloud, head of the church's Program Agency, which does missionary work for the church throughout the United States and overseas. One of Weir's letters was addressed to McCloud.

"Dr. McCloud has asked Presbyterians to send a million postcards to President Reagan asking the President to do what he needs to do to get Benjamin Weir released," said Kratz, who was in San Diego on Monday for a two-day meeting of the church's Presbyterian General Assembly Council.

Church officials also are considering appeals to key elected officials who may be able to use their influence to win Weir's release, Kratz said.

John Weir said the general theme of the letters—which were identical in content but addressed to different people—was that "the U.S. government take strong effective action to get these men out."

The elder Weir has done missionary work in the Middle East for the past 30 years.

In Amsterdam, meanwhile, the Dutch news agency ANP said a Dutch Roman Catholic priest has apparently been kidnaped in Lebanon.

The Dutch agency quoted Dutch church sources as saying the priest—identified as N. Kluiters, 43, a Jesuit who has worked in Lebanon for the last 10 years—disappeared last Thursday when traveling near his parish in the Bekaa Valley in eastern Lebanon.



Dear Ms. Smith:

Thank you for your letter of March 21 to President Reagan regarding the continuing captivity of your niece's husband, Reverend Benjamin Weir. I have been asked to respond on the President's behalf.

The President is extremely concerned about the terrorist attacks on Americans in Lebanon and the fate of Reverend Weir and the other four Americans who were abducted in Beirut. This is a problem in which he takes a deep personal interest. The protection of American citizens overseas is a priority concern of our government and it is entirely appropriate, as you suggest, that we work for the release of these innocent Americans. This would be true, however, regardless of the motive of the kidnappers.

I can assure you that the lack of success so far does not reflect a lack of effort. The State Department as well as other agencies and our Embassies overseas are following every lead to ensure the safe release of Reverend Weir and the other Americans. Intensive diplomatic contacts are continuing and we are pursuing all possible avenues of inquiry. Not much has been said publicly about our efforts on behalf of the captive Americans because we believe that their release can best be accomplished through quiet, discreet diplomacy.

It is certainly true that the Arab-Israeli conflict was one of a number of factors underlying the civil strife that has plagued Lebanon over the last ten years and that the continuing violence in Lebanon has contributed to the rise of terrorism. Fortunately, the release of the American captives does not depend on the the achievement of the longer-term and still elusive goals of peace and harmony in Lebanon.

The United States has played an intensive diplomatic role in Lebanon during the past three years aimed at helping the Lebanese people to restore their country's unity, sovereignty and stability. We believe that this can only come about through a people united behind a common central government and committed to resolving differences by political means. In this

regard, we have continually urged all parties to support the central Lebanese government and encouraged them to engage in a political dialogue. The United States will continue to do what it can to assist Lebanese reconciliation efforts. The central responsibility, however, rests with Lebanon's leaders and its various militias.

The President clearly appreciates what an ordeal this must be for you and the other families. As you may know, Secretary Shultz met with Mrs. Weir on March 22 to reassure her that the release of Reverend Weir and the other Americans was a top priority for the Administration. Let me assure you that we will continue our intensive efforts on behalf of the missing Americans. They have not been forgotten.

Although I did not become personally acquainted with Ben Weir during the time I served in Beirut, I have met in my office with his children, John and Susan. I was also in the congregation of the National Presbyterian Church when Mrs. Weir spoke so movingly about her husband. They are all fine human beings, and I am sure that their faith provides them with strength to help meet this ordeal.

Dear Mr. President:

It has been thirty years since my niece, Carol Weir and her husband, Benjamin Weir, boarded a plane for Beirut, Lebanon. Both are Presbyterian ministers. They grew fond of the picturesque and lovely city. Their work was inspiring and rewarding. Life was a happy experience. They loved the people so they made this their real home and raised their four children there.

Exactly 318 days ago Ben was snatched from a Beirut street. Carol was pushed aside. When Ben resisted he was hit over the head with a pistol and shoved into the kidnappers' car. There has been no official word of him since.

Because Ben is a fine gentleman whose whole life has been one of everything that is good, his abduction was not personal. Rather it was a political move just as the other Americans were captured for political reasons. Because of this situation isn't it proper for our government to get these innocent men released?

People who have lived in Lebanon for some time feel that the root of the present confusion, hanging over Lebanon, was caused mainly by the Arab-Israeli conflict, though other factors have developed. These people state, "The Arabs must be included in negotiations."

Many who have lived in this foreign region believe that those who were taken as hostages will never be released until peace settles over Lebanon.

Mr. President, I know your position requires constant demand on your time. In my opinion your results as the leader of our country, are getting us gradually out of the tremendous national debt, eliminating government waste, clearing up dishonest business practices, handling toxic wastes, working to conquer the terrible contageous drug problems, cracking down on illegal aliens, pursuing difficult foreign relationships and the

successful handling of many undesirable developments which have expanded over the years. The load you carry is tremendous. It is greater than any other president has ever had.

I'm writing because I hope you can spare the time to instigate a meeting which will encompass all the factions concerned with the Lebanon crisis, including the Arabs and including the expertise of our United States representatives.

If peace and harmony can be brought to Lebanon it should follow that those being held will be released from captivity. Our family is waiting patiently for Ben Weir to be freed.

I know our government is pursuing means to bring home those who are now being held. In a recent speech at the San Francisco Commonwealth Club Secretary of State, George Shultz, stated, "The efforts of the government are increasing and untiring." I'm hoping those effort will very soon evolve into some type of negotiations as mentioned above. I feel desperately that we must get Ben Weir released immediately.

Dear Senator Hurley:

I am replying further to your letter to President Reagan concerning the Reverend Benjamin Weir, who was kidnapped in Beirut in May 1984. I regret the delay in this response.

The Department of State, our Embassies, and other U.S. Government agencies overseas are following every lead to effect Mr. Weir's safe release. Regrettably, we know very little about the self-titled "Islamic Jihad," which has claimed responsibility for kidnapping Mr. Weir and other Americans. This group has demanded the release of terrorists convicted and imprisoned in Kuwait for the 1983 bombings of the American and French Embassies (for which the organization also claimed responsibility), in which 6 persons died and over 80 others were injured.

The Administration is deeply concerned about the Americans still missing in Lebanon, and had hoped to secure their freedom when the hostages from TWA flight 847 were released. Unfortunately, this proved impossible. The Administration is continuing its intensive diplomatic contacts, as we pursue all plausible avenues of inquiry. We also remain in close consultation with the Weir family.

We understand your concern for Mr. Weir's safe return, and share your impatience, but cannot comment more specifically on our ongoing, intensive efforts. Throughout Mr. Weir's captivity, it has been our policy not to discuss the details of our efforts to secure his release and that of the other kidnapped Americans. Such publicity would not be helpful. We believe it only offers continued incentive for the captors to retain their hostages, and ultimately could prove harmful to the efforts to secure their release.

Mr. Weir's kidnapping and the hijacking of TWA flight 847 are tragic examples of the continuing terrorist attacks on Americans. Because of our concern for Americans' safety, the Department has issued several travel advisories recommending against any travel to Lebanon and urging Americans in Lebanon to take advantage of opportunities to leave. We have vigorously condemned such terrorist acts, and called on the world community to take steps to end such lawless behavior.

The U.S. Government intends to continue its intensive efforts on Mr. Weir's behalf. President Reagan is deeply concerned for the safety of all the kidnapped Americans, and is kept fully briefed. As he has said, we have not forgotten those who are being held.
