

#### I. PURPOSE

To reaffirm U.S. support for national reconciliation in Lebanon and encourage the Patriarch to play an active moderating role in this summer's Lebanese Presidential elections.

#### II. BACKGROUND

Patriarch Sfeir hopes his visit to the United States will help give him the stature to mediate in Lebanon's upcoming Presidential campaign. By virtue of his office, the Patriarch remains the only Lebanese leader currently maintaining a dialogue with all elements of the Christian community, from which the Lebanese President traditionally is chosen. As he did in his meetings earlier this week with the Vice President and Secretary Shultz, the Patriarch is likely to urge continued U.S. support for political reform in Lebanon and additional humanitarian aid.

Your brief meeting provides a good opportunity to highlight U.S. concern about Lebanon and enhance the Patriarch's moderating influence. We continue to make that concern clear through humanitarian assistance (\$23 million in food aid for 135,000 Lebanese families in FY 88) and active diplomacy in support of political reform.

Patriarch Sfeir will present you with a Lebanese cedar seedling. A similar seedling was presented to President Kennedy by Patriarch Meouchi in 1962, and was planted on White House grounds.

#### WHITE HOUSE STATEMENT ON LEBANON

The President was pleased to meet today with Maronite Catholic Patriarch Nasrallah Sfeir of Lebanon. The Vice President also met separately with Patriarch Sfeir. The President and the Vice President reaffirmed U.S. support for the restoration of Lebanon's unity, sovereignty, and territorial integrity, and the withdrawal of all foreign forces from Lebanon. Both emphasized that the suffering of the Lebanese people must end, and that a process of national reconciliation is urgently needed, including agreement on political and security reform. They also recognized that durable peace and security for Lebanon can best be assured by a comprehensive peace settlement for the Middle East, and pledged the continued efforts by this Administration on the peace process.

The United States considers the upcoming Lebanese presidential election to be very important for Lebanon's unity and stability. The election should proceed constitutionally, with a new President taking office as scheduled on September 23. It should also be orderly, so that a smooth, legitimate transition can occur. The election provides an excellent opportunity for national reconciliation and should be seen in that light.

In this context, the United States has responded to the request of Lebanese leaders to help Lebanese Moslems and Christians devise and agree upon a new arrangement for sharing political power. We are convinced by our conversations with these leaders that responsible Lebanese want to find fair guidelines for a process to establish a central government that exercises full authority over a unified, sovereign state. In that state, all Lebanese would enjoy comparable opportunities for advancement. The United States believes an agreement on such guidelines is possible and ought to be achieved as soon as possible.

The United States is particularly concerned about the plight of innocent civilians in Lebanon. The tragic casualties from the recent fighting between rival militias in Beirut's southern suburbs and from terrorist bombings and the continued taking and detention of hostages -- both Lebanese and foreign -- demonstrate the urgent need to restore the authority of the central government throughout the country. Only the central government has the clear, unencumbered right and responsibility to maintain law and order. The continued existence of armed militias and terrorist groups frustrates the desire of the vast majority of the Lebanese people to have the legal order and authority re-established. The Lebanese and American peoples have had a long and close relationship. Out of that friendship emerges both our deep concern about Lebanon's future and our enduring commitment to help the Lebanese ease their suffering, and achieve national reconciliation. To those ends, the United States pledges both continuing humanitarian assistance and political support.

#### Memorandum

On the Occasion of the Visit with President Ronald Reagan Friday, June 24, 1988 By His Beatitude Maronite Patriarch Nasrallah Peter Sfeir

- 1. We come to plead the cause of Lebanon, not only for the Maronites, but for all Lebanese, especially those who have been most hurt by the conflict.
- 2. We wish to thank the government of the United States for its continuing concern and interest in Lebanon. Since the outbreak of hostilities in 1975, it has often sent highly responsible officials to deal with the problem. At the present time, it is offering to mediate between Lebanon and Syria with the aim of resolving the Lebanese conflict.
- 3. There exist numerous ties between the United States and Lebanon.
  - a) They share the same values: love for freedom, democracy and religious pluralism, and respect for human rights.
  - b) Lebanese began emigrating to the United States in the middle of the last century and now number in the hundreds of thousands. The Maronites, for example, have a diocese with two bishops and sixty parishes throughout the United States. American-Lebanese play a prominent role in American life, contributing significantly to the fields of science, business, government, literature and entertainment. Many American-Lebanese have given their lives in the service of their country, the United States, and what it represents. Today nearly every family in Lebanon has a relative who is a citizen of the United States.
  - c) The United States has sacrificed much for the sake of Lebanon. We cannot forget the more than three hundred Marines who have fallen in the line of duty in Lebanon; the killing of the American Ambassador; and today we are still living the tragedy of the hostages on Lebanese territory.
  - d) For over a century the American University of Beirut has strengthened the bonds between the United States and Lebanon; and today thousands of Lebanese students are enrolled in universities in the United States.

- 4. Lebanon must remain a sovereign and independent state with its internationally recognized borders.
  - a) It is a constitutional democracy.
  - b) It is a land where all religious believers, particularly Christian, Moslem, and Jewish can co-exist.
  - c) It serves as a meeting-ground between East and West.
  - d) The disappearance of Lebanon would cause endless dissension among the nations in the area and would be a threat to the Middle East and the world.
- 5. The United States could support the following actions:
  - a) Negotiate the establishment of an international peace conference for the Middle East at which Lebanon would be a participant. (It would be helpful to recall that at critical moments in Lebanese history, the Lebanese question was resolved through agreement of the European powers. This was the case in 1860, 1920, and 1943.)
  - b) Facilitate the fomation of a Lebanese government which would work for the solution of issues of vital concern to the people, for example, Lebanon's present grave economic crisis.
  - c) Ensure an atmosphere favorable for the election of a president of the Republic of Lebanon, and thereby avoid a constitutional crisis which would lead to a definitive fragmentation of the country.
  - d) Help in the re-establishment of the over half million Lebanese refugees back in their own villages and cities.
  - e) Help to implement all the resolutions of the United Nations concerning Lebanon.
  - f) Intervene on behalf of Lebanon with states and organizations in the Middle East, with the goal of convincing them not to interfere in Lebanese affairs and not to trample on Lebanese sovereignty.
  - g) Help free Lebanon from foreign forces
  - h) Help stop the flow of arms and ammunition to the militant forcess in Lebanon.





'YOUR CONTINUING CONCERN IN LEBANON IS VITAL,'' O'CONNOR SAID. ''THE WORLD MUST KNOW UNCONDITIONALLY THAT THE UNITED STATES WILL NEVER ABANDON LEBANON. I CAN UNDERSTAND THAT YOUR OPTIONS ARE LIMITED AND I WILL BE PRAYING FOR THE DIVINE GUIDANCE YOU NEED TO HELP YOU MAKE THE RIGHT DECISION.''

LEBANESE PRESIDENT AMIN GEMAYEL AND HIS SYRIAN COUNTERPART, HAFEZ ASSAD, HELD TALKS IN DAMASCUS WEDNESDAY ON STALLED PRESIDENTIAL ELECTIONS IN LEBANON, BUT FAILED TO BREAK A DEADLOCK OVER THE CHOICE OF A CANDIDATE, OFFICIALS SAID.

HIS SURPRISE TRIP TO SYRIA CAME AS FRANCE AND THE UNITED STATES WARNED THAT OBSTRUCTING THE ELECTIONS WOULD LEAD TO DISINTEGRATION WITHIN THE COUNTRY, AND U.S. DIPLOMATS ATTEMPTED TO PERSUADE CHRISTIAN LEADERS TO WITHDRAW THEIR REJECTION OF THE COMPROMISE CANDIDATE BACKED BY SYRIA AND THE UNITED STATES.

REAGAN RESPONDED TO THE CARDINAL'S MESSAGE BY SAYING THE UNITED STATES ''ATTACHES GREAT IMPORTANCE'' TO THE ELECTIONS AND ADDED, ''WE REMAIN STRONGLY COMMITTED TO HELPING RESTORE LEBANON'S UNITY, SOVREIGNTY AND TERRITORIAL INTEGRITY AND WILL CONTINUE TO EXERT EVERY EFFORT TOWARD THOSE ENDS.''
