Attorney General Smith has raised with you the possibility of discussing the establishment of a "U.S.-Italian Working Group on International Drug Trafficking" with Prime Minister Craxi during the AG's visit to Rome next week. Smith would like to hand-carry a letter to Craxi from President Reagan, endorsing the initiation of discussions on fighting organized crime - specifically, narcotics trafficking. Combatting organized crime is one of the main points of Craxi's governmental programs. Embassy Rome has strongly endorsed this proposal and State and Justice concur. However, we are concerned about:

- -- The extent to which the new Italian government is interested in the concept and, given its heavy domestic and foreign policy agenda, the degree to which it could meaningfully commit itself to cooperation in this area.
- -- Raising the working-group concept specifically as part of the Reagan-Craxi meetings on October 20. There may not be sufficient time to properly prepare the groundwork for raising this proposal at the Chief Executives level.

Therefore, we have proposed a brief, general letter from the President to Craxi that endorses the initiation of discussions, but avoids strong commitments at this time. AG Smith should hand-carry the letter to Craxi, and State will provide detailed instructions to Embassy Rome in support of the concept. Raising the issue in the context of a Reagan-Craxi meeting will depend on the outcome of AG Smith's discussions in Rome.

Phil Hughes of the Office of the Vice-President concurs in this initiative. The letter has been cleared with speechwriters.

UNOFFICIAL TRANSLATION OF THE MESSAGE ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT FROM THE ITALIAN PRIME MINISTER

Mr. President:

I am referring to your letter of August 19th, recalling the dialogue you started with my predecessor on the issue of nuclear non proliferation, to which also the Italian Government attaches a great importance.

You will be certainly aware of the consistency with which Italy has implemented the spirit and the letter of the most advanced rules on non proliferation and the active contribution given by us through multi - lateral and bilateral concertation and coordination, to all the necessary reviews aimed at defining a new basis for an international consensus on the matter.

I also want to confirm to you that the objective of nuclear non proliferation is still considered by Italy as a top priority, due to its serious and complex geo-political implications to which you rightly refer in your letter. Therefore I fully agree on the opportunity of a more and more active and diversified commitment, aimed at realizing new developments for a more effective system of global safeguards.

However, I believe that a strengthened process of bilateral and multilateral consultation and cooperation among exporting countries — to be possibly extended to the nuclear exporters of the so called new generations — should be more based on pragmatic criteria and quite diplomacy.

It is also important that consultations be considered by importing countries and emerging exporters as an effort to improve the present
system in the interest of peace and not as a way to consolidate positions
of privilege.

In this spirit, I believe that the meeting you proposed can be a further and useful contribution to which Italy is ready to offer its own constructive participation. Because of the extreme complexity of the pro-


blems and the difference of approaches, the meeting should be well arranged also in view of assuring the largest possible participation of exporting countries.



Dear Mr. President and Friend:

I appreciated the message you sent me very much, and I would like to share some of my thoughts with you concerning the relaunching of the East-West dialogue on the eve of your important meeting with Soviet Foreign Minister Gromyko.

I especially want to express my satisfaction with the emphasis you put on the search and the need for peace in your speech before the United Nations and for your constructive approach to East-West relations which might facilitate an improvement. At a time when elements of uncertainty and distrust prevail, any attempt to re-establish an atmosphere and a framework for a dialogue which might favor and stimulate substantive negotiations takes on great significance. I believe that your speech before the United Nations was a valid contribution to this end. Now it must be hoped that the offer of conciliation and of a serious and committed search for points of convergence on problems of such great importance for mankind will en-

courage reasonableness and moderation and provide an impetus for movement towards that spirit of openmindedness and fundamental compromise in order to pursue tangible and mutually acceptable results.

What I find especially interesting and conducive to our common objectives is the flexibility of the proposals on arms control and reduction which you are about to submit to Foreign Minister Gromyko. I believe that along these flexible lines we must redefine in strict consultation the objectives and strategies for a new platform which, while respecting maximum mutual security, will offer sufficient margins for negotiation with respect to the Soviet positions.

However, I agree with you that at this stage, the first move is up to the Soviets, i.e. that they should give up their unrealistic preconditions for the renewal of the INF negotiations and show a clear willingness to negotiate. But I consider it opportune and appropriate to take care from now on that the necessary connections between the various negotiating tables are assured since all the arms systems together, regardless of their nature and characteristics, combine in determining the global level of military threat, and therefore it is to that level that the balanced and verifiable measures of arms control and disarmament must necessarily refer.

I furthermore agree to, and in fact want to encourage, the initiation of a dialogue with the Soviet Union in order to reduce the elements of East-West confrontation in regional crises, which must be resolved by giving ever more weight to the role of the countries and parties directly involved, fully respecting their legitimate aspirations and needs. To such efforts we could certainly give our





wholehearted and constructive cooperation.

I shall be very interested in hearing about the impressions you will carry away from your talks with Foreign Minister Gromyko, and I expect to remain in close contact with you for an ever more profound exchange of evaluations.
