POLITBURO SAYS ARMS TALKS MUST BE AGREED IN ALL PARTS (EDS: UPDATES WITH NEW LEAD GIVING POLITBURO VIEW OF TALKS)

MOSCOW, JAN 10, REUTER - THE SOVIET POLITBURO SAID TODAY PROGRESS AT FUTURE SUPERPOWER ARMS TALKS WOULD ONLY FOLLOW IF AGREEMENT WAS REACHED IN ALL AREAS THE NEGOTIATIONS COVER. 1

MOSCOW AND WASHINGTON AGREED TO NEGOTIATIONS ON SPACE WEAPONS AND STRAGETIC AND MEDIUM-RANGE NUCLEAR MISSILES AFTER INO DAYS OF TALKS IN GENEVA THIS WEEK.

A TASS NEWS AGENCY REPORT ON THE RULING POLITBURO'S WEEKLY MEETING SAID THE KREMLIN "STRESSED THAT ONLY THE STRICT OBSERVANCE DURING THE FORTHCOMING NEGOTIATIONS OF THE REACHED AGREEMENT IN ALL OF ITS PARTS CAN ENSURE REAL PROGRESS".

"SUCH IS THE PRINCIPLED, CONSTRUCTIVE APPROACH OF THE SOVIET UNION TO THE TALKS. IT EXPECTS THE SAME FROM THE UNITED STATES," TASS SAID.

IT SAID SOVIET FOREIGN MINISTER ANDREI GROMYKO HAD REPORTED TO THE POLITBURO ON HIS GENEVA TALKS WITH U.S. SECRETARY OF STATE GEORGE SHULTZ. IT GAVE NO OTHER DETAILS.

WASHINGTON'S ANTI-MISSILE SPACE DEFENSE PLAN MOST CONCERNS MOSCOW. PRESIDENT REAGAN HAS SAID RESEARCH WILL CONTINUE ON THE PROGRAMME DESPITE TALKS ABOUT SPACE ARMS.

EARLIER TASS SAID REAGAN CONFUSED NEWSMEN AT A PRESS CONFERENCE BY HIS INSISTENCE ON TALKING WITH NOSCOW ABOUT SPACE ARMS WHILE GOING AHEAD WITH RESEARCH INTO SUCH WEAPONS.

WHEN REPORTERS ASKED REAGAN IF HE WAS PREPARED TO SET LINITS TO HIS "STAR WARS" ANTI-MISSILE DEFENSE PLAN, HE TRIED TO EVADE THE QUESTIONS, IT SAID.

THE AGENCY QUOTED REAGAN AS SAYING THE NEW NEGOTIATIONS, AGREED ON AFTER THO DAYS OF SUPERPONER TALKS IN GENEVA THIS WEEK, HOULD NOT BE EASY BUT THAT BOTH SIDES SHOULD BE PREPARED TO WORK TOGETHER.

BUT TASS SAID THE REPORTERS AT REAGAN'S WASHINGTON NEWS CONFERENCE YESTERDAY NOTED HE WAS READY TO TALK TO NOSCOW ABOUT HIS STAR WARS PLAN YET STRESSED RESEARCH WOULD GO AHEAD.

"SUCH PRONOUNCEMENTS BY THE PRESIDENT CAUSED CONFUSION AMONG. THE NEWSMEN PRESENT,"" IT SAID. REAGAN WAS ALSO ASKED WHETHER HIS STANCE WOULD LEAD TO THE TALKS BREAKING DOWN, BUT STEERED ROUND THIS QUESTION TOO, IT ADDED.

USSR--UKRAINIAN "SAMIZDAT" JOURNAL GIVES DETAILS OF CASUAALTIES IN AFGHANISTAM

MUNICH, JANUARY 10, 1985 (RLR/NAHAYLO)

FOR THE FIRST TIME AN UNOFFICIAL SOVIET PUBLICATION HAS PRESENTED PRECISE DETAILS OF CASUALTIES SUFFERED BY SOVIET TROOPS IN THE WAR IN AFGHANISTAL. ISSUE NO. 7 OF THE NEW UKRAINIAN "SAMIZDAT" JOURNAL "A CHRONICLE OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH IN THE UKRAINE", (1) WHICH APEARED LAST SUMMER, BUT HAS CONLY RECENTLY REACHED THE WEST, (2) PROVIDES A BREAKDOWN OF CASUALTIES SUSTAINED IN AFGHANISTAN BY SOLDIER'S FROM THREE RAIONS OF THE TRANSCARPATHIAN (ZAKARPATSKAYA) OBLAST IN THE SOUTH-WEST OF THE UKRAINE.

THE FOLLOWING IS A FULL TRANSLATION OF THE RELEVANT SECTION: GAINS FOR MOGCOW - LOSSES FOR THE UKRAINE, THAT IS HOW_THE "UNION" OF THESE TWO REPUBLICS WITH EQUAL RIGHTS APPEARS IN THE AFGHAN WAR. RECENTLY, THERE HAVE BEEN MORE AND MORE FUNERALS OF TRANSCARPATHIANS WHO HAVE FALLEN IN AFGHANISTAN. FOR ISTANCE, ON JUNE 3, FUNERALS TOOK PLACE IN THE VILLAGES OF IL'NITSA AND BILKA. ALONGSIDE THE CROSSES, THE AUTHORITIES PLACED MARKERS WITH RED STARS ON THEM. THAT NIGHT, AN OFFICER WHO HAD DELIVERED THE COFFINS, LET SLIP WHILE IN A DRUNKEN STATE, THAT HE DID NOT KNOW WHAT WAS IN WHICH COFFIN ... IN SOME THERE WAS ONLY A LEG, OR A BIT OF CHARRED BODY, AND IT WAS NOT ALWAYS FROM THE BODY OF THE DECEASED. THAT IS WHY, HE SAID, THE COFFINS CANNOT BE OPENED.

CONSIDERING THE SIZE OF THE POPULATION OF THE THREE RAISONS IN QUESTION - IRSHAVSKII RAION: 94,200 IN 1978. (3) SVALYAVSKII RAION: 52,300 IN 1933. (4) MUKACHEVSKII RAION: 103,100 IN 1981 (5) - THE CASUALTY FIGURES GIVEN BY THE "CHRONICLE OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH IN THE UKRAINE" SEEM REMARKABLY HIGH. WHILE THEY CANNOT, OF COURSE, BE VERIFIED, THEY SUPPORT OTHER UNCONFIRMED REPORTS OVER THE YEARS THAT A DISPROPORTIONATELY LARGE NUMBER OF YOUNG MEN FROM THE SOVIET UNION'S WESTERN BORDERLANDS - THE BALTIC REPUBLICS AND THE WESTERN UKRAINE -HAVE BEEN CALLED UP FOR SERVICE IN AFGHANSTAM. ALL THESE AREAS WERE FORCIBLY INCORPORATED IN THE USSR AFTER 1939 AND HAVE RESISTED SOVIETIZATION AND RUSSIEICATION.

THE TRANSCARPATHIAN REGION WAS RULED BY THE HUNGARIANS UNTIL THE DISINTEGRATION OF AUSTRIA-HUNGARY AND THEN PASSED UNDER THE CONTROL OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA. WITH THE DISMEMBERMENT OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA, A PART OF THRANCARPATHIA ENJOYED A BRIEF PERIOD OF AUTONOMY DEFORE BEING OVERRUN BY THE HUNGARIANS. THE REGION WAS INCORPORATED INTO THE UKRAINIAN SSR AT THE END OF THE SECOND, WORLD WAR. TODAY, WITH A POPULATION OF ABOUT 1.2 MILLION, (6) OF WHOM 76.5 PERCENT ARE UKRAINIANS, (7) IT IS STILL AN AREA OF STRONG ATTACHMENT TO UKRAINIAN MATIONAL AND RELIGIOUS TRADITIONS. ISSUE N. 2 OF THE "CHRONICLE"

THE INFORMATION ABOUT TRANSCARPATHIAN CASUALTIES CONTAINED IN THE UKRAINIAN CATHOLIC "CHRONICLE" IS REMINISCENT OF A COMMENTARY ENTITLED "OUR BOYS ARE PERISHING IN AFGHANISTAN" THAT APPEARED IN THE LITHUANIAN "SAMIZDAT" JOURNAL "AUSRA", DATED MARCH 1982. (9) EXPRESSING OUTRAGE THAT REPRESENTATIVES OF "OPPRESSED" NATIONALITIES - "UKRAINIANS, ESTONIANS, LATVIANS, AND LITHUANIANS" - WERE BEING FORCED TO PARTICIPATE IN MOSCOW'S SUBJUGATION OF AGHANISTAN, "AUSRA" REPORTED THAT

MORE AND MORE TRAGIC NEWS IS REACHING US ABOUT LITHUANIANS WHO HAVE FALLEN IN AFGHANISTAN. THE DEAD ARE BROUGHT IN ZINC-COATED COFFINS AND BURIED SECRETLY. MOTHERS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO SEE THEIR FALLEN SONS... THE COFFINS ARE BROUGHT TO VILNIUS, KLAIPEDA, ALYTUS, PANEVEZYS, SIAULIAI, DRUSKININKAI, AND OTHER CITIES. THEY ARE BROUGHT TO ALL THE RAISONS AND TO THE VILLAGES. (10)

"AUSRA" ALSO REPORTED A CASE IN VILNIUS IN WHICH BEREAVED PARENTS PERSUADED DRUNKEN SOLDIERS TO OPEN THE SEALED COFFIN SUPPOSEDLY CONTAINING THE BODY OF THEIR SON, ONLY TO FIND THAT THE CORPSES HAD BEEN MIXED UP, AND THAT INSTEAD OF THEIR SON, THE COFFIN CONTAINED AN ASIAN. (11)

FINALLY, IT IS WORTH NOTING THAT THE "CHRONICLE OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH IN THE UKRAINE" IS NOT THE FIRST TO DRAW ATTENTION TO THE SHABBY TREATMENT OF WOUNDED OR DISABLED VETERANS OF THE WAR IN AFCHANISTAN. ON FEBRUARY 26, 1984, "KOMSOMOLS'KAYA PRAVDA" PUBLISHED AN ACCOUNT OF THE BUREAUCRATIC INDIFFERENCE ENCOUNTERED BY A PARALYZED 23-YEAR OLD SOLDIER ON RETURNING TO HIS HOMETOWN OF NIKOPOL. THE ARTICLE ELICITED A PROMPT RESPONSE FROM THE FIRST SECRETARY OF THE DNEPROPETROVSK OBKOM OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY OF THE UKRAINE IN WHICH HE GAVE ASSURANCES THAT "THOSE AT FAULT HAVE BEEN SEVERELY PUNISHED." (12) CLEARLY, THE PROBLEM IS NOT LIMITED TO ANYONE AREA OF THE SOVIET UNION.

THE LIBERAL GUARDIAN'S MOSCOW CORRESPONDENT FILED THIS REPORT: "THERE WAS A PRIVATE EXCHANGE OF LETTERS BETWEEN PRESIDENT REAGANA AND THE SOVIET LEADER, MR. CHERNENKO, DURING THE NEGOTIATIONS LEADING UP TO THE GENEVA ACCORDS, OFFICIAL SOVIET SOURCES HAVE CONFIRMED. "THE SOURCES WOULD NOT COMMENT ON THE CONTENTS OF THE LETTERS, BUT STRESSED THAT THEY HAD PLAYED A VITAL ROLE IN THE OVERALL STRUCTURE OF THE NEGOTIATIONS. 'WHENEVER YOU HAVE DIRECT COMMUNICATKONS BETWEEN HEADS OF STATE, IT IS GOING TO BE IMPORTANT, ' ONE SOVIET OFFICIAL SAID. "WESTERN DIPLOMATS IN MOSCOW ADDED THAT THEY HAD KNOWN THAT U.S.-SOVIET TALKS HAD BEEN TAKING PLACE ON MIDDLE EAST PROBLEMS, AFGHANISTAN, AND SOUTHERN AFRICA. THE TALKS, AT A SENIOR DIPLOMATIC LEVEL, BEGAN AFTER THE MEETING BETWEEN PRESIDENT REAGAN AND THE SOVIET FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. GROMYKO, IN WASHINGTON LAST SEPTEMBER.

"THEY WERE AIMED AT ENSURING THAT REGIONAL CRISES DID NOT GET OUT OF HAND FOR LACK OF SUPERPOWER COMMUNICATION. BUT THERE ARE INDICATIONS THAT THE SECRET DIPLOMACY WENT FURTHER, WITH THE UNITED STATES NOW ACCEPTING FOR THE FIRST TIME IN YEARS THAT THE SOVIET UNION HAS A LEGITIMATE AND USEFUL ROLE IN THE MIDDLE EAST; AND THE SOVIET UNION AT LEAST IS DISCUSSING THE AMERICAN VIEW ON AFGHANISTAN.

"THE CORRESPONDENCE BETWEEN THE SOVIET UNION AND AMERICAN LEADERS, AND THE TALKS ON REGIONAL MATTERS, SUGGESTS THAT SUPERPOWER RELATIONS ARE RATHER WARMER THAN EVEN THE HOPEFUL ACCORD REACHED IN GENEVA WOULD SUGGEST..." THE LIBERAL GUARDIAN'S WASHINGTON CORRESPONDENT ALEX BRUMMER REPORTED: "THE RECEIVED WISDOM HAS LONG BEEN THAT THE THIRD WORLD WAR WILL START IN SOME REMOTE CORNER OF THE GLOBE RATHER THAN IN THE MORE OBVIOUS EUROPEAN AND ASIAN THEATRES. IT IS THEREFORE ENCOURAGING TO DISCOVER THAT EVEN IN THE CURRENT FROSTY ERA OF U.S.-SOVIET RELATIONS THE SUPERPOWERS HAVE EMBARKED ON A DIALOGUE WHICH GOES BEYOND THE MUCH PUBLICISED ARMS CONTROL AND SPACE WEAPONS AGENDA...

"U.S. OFFICIALS ARE GENERALLY AGREED HOWEVER THAT ALTHOUGH THERE HAVE BEEN USEFUL CONVERSATIONS ABOUT THREE IMPORTANT AREAS OF THIRD WORLD TENSION--THE GULF, SOUTHERN AFRICA AND CENTRAL AMERICA--THE MOST DIFFICULT PROBLEM REMAINS AFGHANISTAN WHICH PRESIDENT REAGAN RECENTLY CITED AS A

'SERIOUS IMPEDIMENT' TO IMPROVED RELATIONS WITH THE KREMLIN. THE SECRETARY OF STATE, MR. GEORGE SHULTZ, SOUGHT TO RAISE THE MATTER IN THE 'FRINGES' OF GENEVA, AROUND THE COCKTAIL TABLE, BUT RECEIVED VERY LITTLE CHANGE.

"DESPITE THIS CONTINUED BARRIER TO IMPROVED RELATIONS BETWEEN THE SUPERPOWERS THE MESSAGE FROM FOGGY BOTTOM IS BROADLY HOPEFUL. THE STATE DEPARTMENT IS CLEARLY TAKING SERIOUSLY PRESIDENT REAGAN'S INSTRUCTIONS TO ENGAGE THE BT
