In the meantime, the Synfuels board is continuing to spend large sums in anticipation of possible abolition of the Synthetic Fuels Corporation (SFC). There is great concern among many in the Administration that we have lost control of this agency. Moreover, recapturing the \$7 billion SFC controls will assist our budget deficit efforts. Accordingly, it is appropriate to address the future advisability of continuing this corporation.

As you will recall, this matter was discussed last Thursday at the DPC meeting which you chaired. Unfortunately, due to time constraints, we did not complete the discussion and have scheduled this meeting for that purpose.

Secretary Herrington will lead off, recapping his position at the previous meeting. Ed Noble, Chairman of the Synthetic Fuels Corporation, will then summarize his position. Randy Davis, Associate Director of OMB for Natural Resources, Energy, and Science, will present OMB's point of view and Legislative Affairs will provide an overview of the legislative status of this issue.

PRESIDENTIAL TAPING: SCRIPT FOR "AMERICA, YOU'RE TOO YOUNG TO DIE"
THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 26, 1985

Well over 200 years have passed since the gallant men that formed our Nation met in a carpenter's hall in Philadelphia.

They were men of many backgrounds, but all with one common denominator...their faith in God.

As Thomas Jefferson wrote, all men are "endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights." Those first Americans proclaimed their freedom because they believed God had granted freedom to all men.

For decades, America remained true to her beliefs, thanking God in peacetime and turning to Him in moments of crisis. During the Civil War, perhaps our Nation's darkest hour, Abraham Lincoln said, I would be the most foolish person on this footstool earth if I believed for one moment that I could perform the duties assigned to me without the help of one who is wiser than all.

I don't believe any man or woman can serve in this office without understanding exactly what Mr. Lincoln meant.

But in recent years, years not too distant in our past,

America did seem to be losing her religious and moral bearings.

Our social standards seemed to be dissolving, our economic and
governmental institutions were in disarray. Our defenses had
grown weak. All over the world, America was becoming known not
for strength and resolve, but for vacillation and self-doubt. It
seemed for a season as though our Nation was in permanent decline

and that any sense of justice, self-discipline and duty was ebbing out of public life.

But the God who has so richly blessed our land also gave us free will, the power to choose our own destiny. And that is what the American people are doing: after putting a stop to that long decline, we are today seeking a rebirth of freedom and faith -- a great national renewal. And, we've only just begun.

Together we can show the world that America is, and will always remain, one Nation under God.
