I. PURPOSE

To receive the report of the White House Conference for a Drug-Free America, as mandated in the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1986 (P.L. 99-570).

II. BACKGROUND

The White House Conference for a Drug-Free America was created in the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1986 (P.L. 99-570). The establishment and identification of the functions of the Conference were done in Executive Order #12595, on May 5, 1987. Also on May 5, 1987, Mrs. Lois Haight Herrington was appointed Chairman and Executive Director of the Conference.

The Conference was asked to bring together concerned individuals from the public and private sector who are knowledgeable about drug abuse education, prevention, and treatment as well as the production, trafficking and distribution of illicit drugs.

The Conference was to report to the President and to the Congress the findings and recommendations of the Conference to achieve a drug-free America. The President is to report to the Congress annually, for a period of three years, on the status and implementation of the findings and recommendations of the Conference.

A distinguished group of Conferees, appointed by the President, consisted of notables, consultants and experts. These Conferees were asked to participate in the preliminary activities and to ensure the broadest possible public involvement in the Conference.

To provide a forum for input from the grassroots level, six regional meetings were held -- in Omaha, Nebraska; in Los Angeles, California; in Cincinnati, Ohio; in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida; in Albuquerque, New Mexico; and in New York, New York. These regional meetings culminated with a National

Conference, at which the Conferees interacted with ~~representatives from each geographic region to identify the issues and recommendations.~~

At each regional meeting, as well as the National Conference, concurrent workshops were held to facilitate discussion of the following subjects: prevention; education; drug-Free Workplaces; treatment; drug-free Workplaces; role of Professional Athletes and Sports; drug-free transportation; drug-free public housing; role of the media; and, law enforcement.

Through the regional meetings, the Conference tapped the experience of a broad segment of society by working with existing groups and by stimulating new activities. The Conference provided a unique opportunity for individuals from all walks of life to directly address the drug issue and make recommendations on ways to eliminate illegal drug use in the United States.

To brief you on a recommendation from the Domestic Policy Council relating to licensing of nuclear power plants.

II. BACKGROUND

The Domestic Policy Council met on June 22 to discuss a proposal by the Secretary of Energy relating to the licensing of nuclear power plants.

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) licenses nuclear power plants. Before a license can be issued, a plant must have an adequate emergency plan. The refusal of state and local governments to cooperate with emergency plans has impeded the licensing of two nuclear power plants. Secretary Herrington has recommended that you issue an executive order directing the Federal Emergency Management Agency to take necessary action to ensure the establishment and maintenance of emergency preparedness plans necessary to meet NRC safety requirements.

The members of the Domestic Policy Council, with the exception of EPA Administrator Lee Thomas, support Secretary Herrington's recommendation. Attached is a discussion memo from the Council on this issue.

There is intense interest in this matter in the Congress and several senators and Members of Congress have requested an opportunity to talk with you before you render a decision. Therefore, a decision memo from the DPC will come to you at a later date.
