

Attachment: Key Points

To date, Congressional responses to the drought have been characterized by restraint and caution. Up to now, there has been nearly unanimous agreement with your Administration's view that we must wait and assess the damage caused by the drought before taking legislative action to provide relief. However, with ho significant rain expected in the near future, a bipartisan consensus in Congress has formed that action must begin now so that legislation may be passed to provide relief in a timely fashion.

Today, the Chairmen and Ranking Republicans on the Agriculture Committees in the House and the Senate are introducing a legislative package for drought relief. Senate Chairman Leahy (D-VT) and Senator lugar (R-IN) will begin hearings tomorrow morning in the Agriculture Committee, and will begin markup of legislation in the afternoon. We expect the Committee to complete markup before Congress recesses Friday for the Democrat Convention.

A drought relief legislative package is inevitable. Our priority should be to insure that it is targeted to those farmers and ranchers who truly have suffered a significant loss as a result of the drought, and to prevent other farmers and ranchers from reaping a windfall from this crisis. We also must keep the cost of the legislation as low as possible.
