
It is with great enthusiasm that I extend an invitation to you to come to Washington, D.C. in the very near future to lead a crusade.


Dear Billy:

At the recent May 24th meeting, a representative group of community leaders addressed issues of concern and expressed their support for establishing an Invitation Committee. The purpose of an Invitation Committee is to reflect to the Billy Graham Team the broad representative support for a Crusade in our community.

The attendees of the last two meetings are presently inviting 150 key community leaders to write letters of support and invitation to Mr. Graham.
