

Mrs. Barbara Bush will be in Ghana November 20-23 where she will join Mrs. Loret Ruppe, the Director of the Peace Corps, to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the Peace Corps and to honor Ghana which was the first country to receive Peace Corps Volunteers.

The government of Ghana has supported the US on many international issues and views the US as a friend. BIOGRAPHY - Eric Kwamina Otoo

Republic of Ghana

Mr. Otoo was, at the time of his nomination as Ambassador to the United States, retired from public life. From 1974 to 1979, he had served as the senior principal secretary and head of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. A career civil servant, Mr. Otoo previously had been Ghana's Ambassador to the Federal Republic of Germany and High Commissioner to Kenya. In the government of the late Kwame Nkrumah he was the principal secretary in charge of security in the Office of the President and Chief of the Central Intelligence Board.

Mr. Otoo graduated in 1953 from the University of Gold Coast with a BA with honors in history. He is 56 years old and is married with five children.

A thorough search of U.S. Government sources reveals no grounds for objection to the request for agreement.

By memorandum of October 13, 1983 (Tab A), Paul Thompson, Staff Legal Counsel and Deputy Director of Legislative Affairs, National Security Council, indicated that "[t]he Department of State would like an opinion on whether" an October 6, 1983 letter from the President to Jerry Rawlings, Chairman of the Provisional National Defense Council of the Republic of Ghana (Tab B) "can be released here and abroad."


The letter, as indicated in the October 6 memorandum from William Clark to the President recommending that it be signed (Tab C), was intended "to respond to high level Ghanian requests for an improvement in relations [and] at the same time sternly warn Rawlings against crediting anti-American forgeries and disinformation." The latter refers to a forged document, initially accepted by the Ghanian government, which alleged U.S. culpability in local coup plotting, and which led last spring to our retaliatory termination of all U.S. bilateral assistance.

I initially contacted Thompson to determine (1) whether he sought a memorandum from you directly to State, or simply a memorandum from you to him, which he could use to notify State, and (2) whether we should assume that the letter had already been released by the Ghanians.

This afternoon Paul notified me that State simply wants to know whether we would have any objection should they, at some future date, decide to release the document as part of a package intended to demonstrate our improved relations with Ghana. Paul referred the question to you simply because the letter is signed by the President rather than being an NSC document.

Paul responded to my second question by indicating that the United States has no control over what the Ghanians do with a letter such as this, and we, therefore, should assume it has been released by them.

I indicated that it was my preliminary view that from a purely legal standpoint, we have no objection to the letter being released. I advised him that I would confirm that view with you and we would provide him with a memorandum to that effect. Attached for your review and signature is a draft of same (Tab D).

Dear Mr. Chairman:

I was pleased to read, in your letter of June 22, of your interest in renewing the mutual confidence and trust which have traditionally characterized United States-Ghanaian relations. As you noted, the spurious document of March 31, and its initial treatment by your Government, resulted in certain tensions in our relations. I trust that on the basis of representations by former Ambassador Thomas Smith and Ambassador Robert Fritts, the fraudulent nature of this document is clear.

It is an unfortunate fact that enemies of the United States deliberately engage in such forgeries and disinformation; it is incumbent on all parties to investigate carefully and consult closely prior to giving credence to such hostile endeavors. We must not permit them to succeed in disrupting cordial relations.

I have been informed of the very cordial reception you and your associates have accorded Ambassador Robert Fritts since his arrival in July, and of the measures you have taken to improve our dialogue on matters of mutual concern. I welcome these and future efforts to restore with Ghana the close and cooperative relationship which our two countries enjoyed for the past 25 years.
