Dear Mr. Reagan:

We submit the enclosed petitions of more than 400 names vehemently opposing your plan not to visit Dachau. We are shocked and dismayed that you would chose to visit a German military cemetery over paying tribute to the millions who were brutally murdered at the hands of the Nazis. We are also appalled that you would visit the graves of German soldiers instead of the graves of American and allied soldiers who fought so bravely for freedom.

We cannot believe that your plan advances a healthy reconciliation between our countries. It insults the feelings of all those who suffered at the hands of the Third Reich and fought it. And it sends the wrong message to generations too young to remember the Holocaust personally.

On behalf of the enclosed petitioners and the 35,000 Jews residing in the North Jersey area, plus the thousands of World War II veterans that reside here as well, I urge you to change your plans.

Dear Bill:

Thank you for sharing with us your views concerning the President's State Visit to the Federal Republic of Germany. We fully understand the depth of your concerns and assure you the President's feelings about the crimes against humanity perpetrated by the Nazi regime are no less deeply felt. President Reagan has attempted to make absolutely clear during his visit the revulsion all Americans feel for the horrors which were committed in the name of the German state and our determination not to forget them. As you know, his itinerary included a ceremony at Bergen-Belsen concentration camp in order to pay homage to all those who perished at the hands of the Nazis. As he said on the anniversary of the liberation of that camp April 21, there can and should be no absolution.

President Reagan is certain you agree that, as part of our efforts to learn from the experiences of this dark era, we must not reject opportunities for reconciliation. The President was asked by Chancellor Kohl to pay a visit to a German military cemetery in Bitburg, and he has honored that request.

For four decades, the Federal Republic of Germany has faced up to the guilt and responsibilities of its Nazi past and has, in countless ways, demonstrated concretely its commitment to democratic ideals and human rights, including standing shoulder to shoulder with us in the Alliance in defense of freedom. With particular regard to the younger generation in Germany, it is important to demonstrate that, while we continue to hold the nation responsible for its past, we do not consider them to bear individual responsibility for the crimes of Nazism.

Let me make clear that the President does not consider his appearance at Bitburg to represent an act of forgiveness for those crimes, but rather one of acknowledgment of the democratic society the German people have built. He considers this to be a positive gesture which in no way detracts from his full and heartfelt commitment to remember and honor the victims of the Holocaust and the American soldiers who gave their lives to defeat the Nazi regime and its crimes.

SUCH ACTIONS ARE NOT CONDUCTIVE TO RECONCILIATION, BUT INSTEAD WILL RESULT IN INCREASED FRUSTRATION AND ANGER AMONG OTHER GROUPS; HOLOCAUST SURVIVORS, VICTIMS OF THE MOST HEINOUS CRIME IN MANKIND'S HISTORY; JEWS OF ALL NATIONS; OTHER NATIONALITIES, CREEDS AND DEMOCRATIC IDEOLOGIES WHO WERE ALSO AMONG THE MILLIONS OF NON-JEWISH VICTIMS OF THE CONCENTRATION CAMPS AND GAS CHAMBERS; AND THE AMERICAN AND ALLIED VETERANS OF WORLD WAR II WHO FOUGHT AND DIED IN AN EFFORT TO PUT AN END TO THE NAZI TERROR.

SEEN IN THIS LIGHT, THE DECISION IS INSENSITIVE AND DESTRUCTIVE OF THE ANNOUNCED PURPOSE OF YOUR VISIT.

WE URGE YOU TO VISIT DACHAU SO THAT JEWS AND OTHER VICTIMS OF NAZISM ARE APPROPRIATELY MEMORIALIZED. WE URGE YOU NOT TO VISIT A WORLD WAR II GERMAN MILITARY CEMETERY. RECONCILIATION SHOULD BE WITH PRESENT DAY GERMANY, NOT THROUGH THE MEMORIALIZATION OF GERMAN SOLDIERS WHO DIED IN SUPPORT OF A REGIME, THAT, IF IT HAD WON, WOULD HAVE DOMINATED A WORLD OF UNIMAGINABLE HORROR.

Dear Mr. President:

We recently wrote to you in an effort to encourage you to include a visit to a Nazi death camp on the itinerary of your trip to West Germany.

We are now writing to express to you in the strongest possible way our shock and sadness that you have added to your itinerary a visit to the Bitburg cemetery where you will lay a wreath in memory of those buried at Bitburg. Due to the atrocities which occurred at the Battle of the Bulge and the massive participation of the German SS, we believe that a visit to Bitburg by an American President is unwarranted and would be most unfortunate. We see such an act as dishonoring our living and dead Veterans of World War II and their families and reducing in significance the magnitude and devastation of the Holocaust and the millions who died brutally and mercilessly by German hands. There is no valid or responsible reason why you, the President of the United States, should honor the dead of the Third Reich who were responsible for atrocities beyond the human imagination. There are some events of such horror and magnitude that they cannot and should not be forgotten regardless of the passage of time. The Holocaust is certainly such an event when, as you know, over eleven million people including six million Jewish men, women and children were brutally murdered by the Nazis. We strongly urge you, Mr. President, to restructure your itinerary so as to omit the Bitburg visit and to include an event commemorating the Holocaust.


Dear Mr. President:
