I am a teacher of a first grade class at Darmstadt American Elementary School. We have been discussing and studying about our presidents in our first grade class.

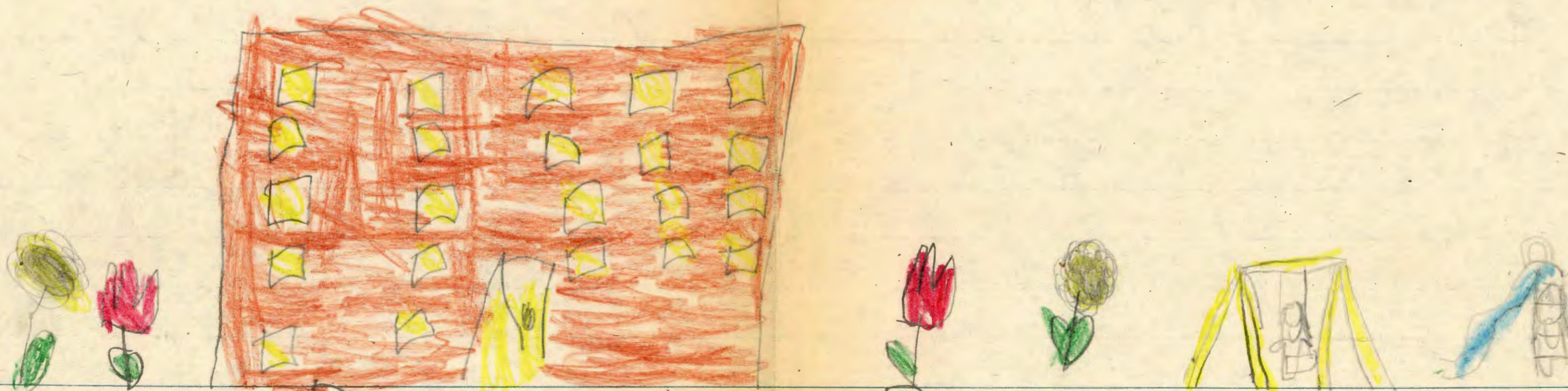
My students are very interested in this area, and in particular are anxious to learn about you, our current president.

Regarding the attached, this is the kind of thing we get often just before an international trip, but try to avoid getting committed to. First of all, we are not in control of the guest seating at the European Parliament; the Parliament itself is, and as you can imagine, demands are big. We will probably get a small allocation. The US Embassy usually wants as many seats as it can get for families and employees of the Embassy; we are seeking seats for people traveling with the President, etc. So to even ask for these 30 seats, regardless of the slim chances of getting them, might not be wise from our viewpoint. Then, if we did get them, to commit them to this group is something we might regret once we determine our own needs.

Sorry for a long explanation, but I know you probably feel bad in not being able to respond positively to these requests. In this case, I suggest that this group be told that we are not in control of the guest seating, and that they should contact the Parliament directly, or the US Consul General in Strausborg.
