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

# World War II bitterness reaches many hearts

In view of the Reagan-Bitburg controversy. I've been wondering. Do you suppose itmight be as difficult these days to be an innocent German as it is to be an embittered Jew?

Let me tell you about my cousins.

They — a boy and a girl — were almost exactly my age. Their family, like mine, immigrated to the United States in the late 1920s, before, I think, Adolf Hitler was ever heard of. My parents and I moved to Texas. They and their parents remained in New York City. After the Wall Street crash of 1929 and the advent of the Great Depression, their family had a very tough time of it in Manhattan....

However, my cousins' maternal grandparents in Germany were fairly well off. "Why don't you send the children over for a few months, or for a year or so, to live with us while you get on your feet?" they very kindly suggested to their daughter. And so the children were sent back to Germany for an indefinite period.

The Depression dragged on. The children's stay in Europe dragged on. The boy was recruited in the Youth Movement. Hitler got louder and meaner. My aunt and uncle become alarmed. They struggled desperately to save the money to bring the kids back to New York. The day before the right ship was to sail, transportation between the two countries was stopped.

What I tell you is only what I heard as a youngster, what I remember from letters within the family. I went to high school and college, in safety, in Texas. My cousins lived in Hamburg, in the midst of the Hitler mad- den," a disheveled caricature of a man

ness and the Big War. I don't know what kind of young people they grew up to be, but I know they came from a background of good, honest, decent people.

My girl cousin, who was the older of the two, fell in love, as a very young girl, with a dashing German officer. I don't know what kind of an officer he was, what kind of a unit he was in, but I think he was a regular fighting man because I know he was captured and was a prisoner of war for quite a long time.

Married, young, and frightened, my cousin Agnes had two small children and lived with them in an apartment house in Hamburg — 75 percent of which was bombed out during the war. Every night (or was it also day?), when the bombings occurred, she fled, trembling with fear, into the basement with her babies.

For a very long time after her husband was captured, she had no word of his whereabouts. Was he dead? Was he alive? Was he lying injured in some foreign city, in some > foreign hospital? Was he a prisoner? If so, of what army? Was he being treated humanely? Would she ever see him again? How could she support her children?

One day, when she was out in the "gar-

stopped by her gate. He ascertained her name and then pressed a scrap of paper into: her hand. It was a message from her husband: He was alive, a prisoner in Italy.

My Karl was of course drafted in the German army at a very young age. He was in the army for a very long time. He was a plain, garden-variety foot soldier. And he was sent to the Russian front.

He was captured on the Russian front. And when the war was over somehow these German soldiers were not sent home. If my memory does not deceive, Karl had not been sent home two years after the armistice. When he finally reached his native city again, it was as one of hundreds of German soldiers, believed dying, who were dumped on trains and shipped back. His legs were in such terrible condition that he would have died had his sister not nursed him back to health.

Both of my cousins have been in the United States as citizens for years now, one in the Midwest, the other in upper New York. We met only a time or two after they got here, and we had trouble communicating. They seemed so nice, but they found it hard to speak about the war, and I kept searching their faces, wondering if these were the kind of people who could inflict, or condone, the Nazi cruelties that made me vomit when I heard of them. We were never able to speak frankly of the past we had not shared.

I think of my cousins sometimes now. Through no choice of their own, they were sent to Germany at a terrible moment in history. Is is possible that they, too, like some of my Jewish friends, were innocent victims of Hitler? Could one of them, had fate been even more unkind, have been buried in acemetery like, say Bitburg?

I equate your proposed visit to a German WWII cemetery with the raising of the Vietnam flag in Washington during the 70s by the hippies.


It is an insult to all civilized people who fought against the nazi beast and particularly to the memory of those courageous Americans—and their families—who never came back.

Dear Mr. President:

The Holocaust was the single-most dehumanizing event in history – yet we are still suffering from racial and religious prejudice, exemplified in the murder of my personal friend, Alan Berg, a talk show host in Denver, by white supremacists.

Do you realize how insulting your action is in agreeing to visit the graves of individuals who contributed to the Holocaust?

Do you realize how you, yourself, promote religious bigotry in this country with your abysmal ignorance of the reasons why religion exists, your lack of knowledge of science and the fact that there is no evidence whatever of the existence of a supernatural deity, by your encouraging Congress to pass laws returning prayer to schools even though there is no evidence that prayer can accomplish anything other than to make the asker of the favor more intellectually lazy than he already may be; from your religious views about reproduction rights of women which are contrary to the biological evidence (for all life is a continuum and nature takes steps to keep populations in balance.)

I live in the area of Brighton, Colorado, where the alleged killer of Alan Berg was employed for a short while in the office of the Primrose and Cattleman's Gazette, a publication which goes to ranchers all over the United States. I protested some time ago its publication of old-time anti-Semitic propaganda. As a Jew, a loyal American, a Humanist, I have been the victim of vandalism done in the name of Jesus Christ by local school children. Your attitude towards those philosophies you do not comprehend is a major contributor to this problem.

You should be ashamed of your ignorance, of your attitudes toward those of us who are not Christians. You should be ashamed, also, of your ignorance of American history, of the reasons why our Constitution is a secular one in which reference to a god or Jesus Christ (whose existence rests solely on the hearsay and contradictory stories of the New Testament) – was not included. You insult humanity worldwide by your action – for white supremacy is the only reason for apartheid – a white supremacy where power over minorities is the prime motivation for its continuance.

With each passing day, Mr. President, I have less and less respect for you. You are in great contrast with Franklin Roosevelt under whom I worked when I was employed in the Office of Secret Service just across from the White House. I think you owe the Jews in America, and the people who support our Constitution, a real apology. We cannot nor should we forget the Holocaust. We should remember it regularly so it will not reoccur:

1D THE RISV. Serry Falwell watch the Academy Awards? And if he dide did he see Dr. Haing S. Ngor, a Acyear-oid Cambodian refugeer accept his Oscar? S. thank God—Buddha—that Fam here tonight. Ngor exulted? Falwell must have slapped his forehead in consternation. Thank who?

Granted there's not an overwhelming number of Americans who call the deity Buddha, but there are about 4 million of them, and the numbers are growing. Many other Americans are Muhammadan or Hindu, and there are many others who pray to no one and nothing at all.

I thought of Ngor because Falwell, who envisions America as a vast private club, has opened his membership rolls to Jews. In the last several months, he's been appearing before Jewish groups, telling them that he repudiates the doctrine that America is a Christian nation. "Now we say Judeo-Christian republic," Falwell has announced. Wonderful. But where does that leave Ngor?

One benefit of Falwell's celebrity is that he has spawned a cottage industry devoted to keeping an eye on him. These Falwell-watchers are in some disagreement about why he's now granting full citizenship to Jews. It might be, as he has claimed, that he got tolerance. Or it just might be, as some suspect, that he looked at the results of the last election and decided to clean up his act. Falwell, after



all, is given almost universal credit for Independence—unalienable.

That was the outcome despite Ronald Reagan's strong support for Israel, his antipathy to quotas and the fact that American Jews, overwhelmingly affluent, benefited from both Reagan's tax-reduction program and the economic boom the president claimed as his own.

Then along came Falwell. At the Republican National Convention in Dallas, he and his cohorts in the Christian right seemed ubiquitous. Over and over, they described America as a "Christian nation," words the president finally uttered himself. That did it. The movement of Jews toward the GOP stalled and then went into reverse. By Election Day, they were back in the Democratic Party and everyone was pointing a finger at Falwell.

It hardly matters for what reason Falwell has now changed his rhetoric and

whether his words reflect what he really thinks. What matters is that Falwel continues to envision America as a quasiste ligious state. Where once it was lust Christian, now it is both Christian and Jewish. The result is the same by any name, such a state excludes it withholds 100 percent citizenship from those who are neither Christian nor Jews and suggests that their rights are dispensed by the majority rather than being — to use the word employed in the Declaration of Independance — unalignable.

History affirms that the American ethics largely a Christian one. But a part of that ethic is secularism: the conviction that religion is basically a personal matter and its public role should be limited.

The best you can say is that Falwell's heading in the right direction. But his new position is not a repudiation of his Christian Nation doctrine, but a modification of it—an expansion not of his tolerance, but of the limited welcome he extends.

But the invitation is not his to offer and in no way changes the nature of America. It is a nation in which the majority of the people are Christians or Jews, and not, as Falwell says, a Judeo-Christian nation. That's a distinction that makes a difference. Americans like Dr. Ngor thank Buddha for it.


