Trinindad and Tobago

SUBJECT: Background on Trinindad and Tobago

Prime Minister A.N.R. Robinson's National Alliance for Reconstruction (NAR) swept to victory in the December 15, 1986, national election. Despite the promise shown in the electoral campaign and overwhelming popular support for the NAR, Prime Minister Robinson's Government has started with a wimper.

Robinson has faced some unanticipated political problems generated by what some are calling Robinson's vindictiveness. Shortly before President Ellis Clarke was replaced by Noor Mohammed Hassanali, Clarke made several controversial appointments. As a result, Robinson has proposed constitutional changes curbing the President's limited powers. Because of a press leak of the Scott report on narcotics corruption, Robinson was forced to publicize the report which contained damaging allegations against many individuals. As a result, Robinson has been accused of slandering members of the former government.

Basdeo Panday, the Minister of External Affairs, visited Havana during the week of April 20 for the UNCTAD preparatory meeting. He does not yet appear to have formed a view on how to deal with the Cubans, Nicaraguans or Libyans; but his inclination is to have contacts with everyone. Ambassador Krys has an excellent rapport with Panday and should be able to encourage moderation.

The NAR won the election on a campaign to revive the economy and to eliminate corruption. Trinidad's economy has been in a tailspin for the last several years primarily because of the steep fall in oil prices. The current economic problems were compounded by economic mismanagement during the oil boom years of the 1970s when wages rose without corresponding productivity increases, agriculture deteriorated, and imports rose dramatically. Beginning in late 1985, the PNM sought to revive the economy by a major devaluation in December 1985 which made Trinidian exports competitive and reduced imports. The devaluation together with import restictions cut the rapid outflow of foreign exchange, but did not turn the economy around.

Robinson has a strong economic team which has produced good rhetoric, but few tangible results. It may be too early to expect results from the government, but if the apparent inaction continues for the next six months, Robinson may lose his ability to make significant economic changes.

Relations with Trinidad & Tobago are good. We have few outstanding bilateral issues to worry about.

T & T have cooperated in drug efforts and during boom times have helped its poorer neighbors not blessed with oil.

The Embassy has good access to GOTT Prime Minister Robinson; in fact, Amb. Gargano has an appointment with him within a couple of days of his arrival.

On the economic front, we will begin shortly negotiations with GOTT on a Tax Information Agreement. T & T do not take much advantage of the Caribbean Basin Initiative. It does have economic/financial problems caused by low oil prices, but they are not nearly as serious as those of most of Latin America and the Caribbean.

One underlying issue involves some Trinidadian suspicion about U.S. motives in T & T. There is a pervasive belief that the U.S. military has a legal right to return to bases we gave up after WW II (and a satellite facility) in the '70s. State and DOD have drafted a legal opinion that we have no, repeat no, residual rights. State believes you would be the appropriate person to deliver the message on your trip. You may wish to discuss this with Amb. Gargano.




