SUBJ: CARPENTERS SPEECH SEPTEMBER 3.

I talked to our Scheduling office in Washington this morning about the President's address to the Carpenters Union in Chicago September 3. They inform me that they are getting feedback from Congressional people in Chicago that a large number of the carpenters may walk out during the President's remarks because of PATCO.

I told them to feed that information to Donovan's office.

You might want to call Ray to verify this. We should get as much information as possible prior to going in. We will keep you posted if we hear any more.


The names of those who are in our group are listed on the attached sheet. For the meeting, we would keep our group to a minimum, to include in addition to myself:
