When I was recuperating from surgery, late in 1980, you were campaigning for the Presidency in Des Moines, Iowa. My son, Stan, president of SFM Media Services, Inc., in New York, was in charge of your advertisements and media buying.

Through his efforts, the last signed photograph by you was made on the evening of November 3, 1980. 

The purpose of Scouting is to develop in the youth character, citizenship, personal and mental fitness through scouting methods and to this end, the Scouts in this Jamboree contingent have selected to hike two historic trails prior to their entrance to the Jamboree.
