Icahn Presents Case For His Texaco Plan

No One but Icahn Gets to Be Leader Of His Legal Team in Texaco Fight

Many takeover lawyers cross the line between legal adviser and business strategist. But not when they work for Carl

"Carl creates his own strategy," says Theodore Altman, a key member of his legal team in the Texaco proxy fight. "My job is to tell him what the law is and what's permissible and impermissible."

Some of that he would remember from his first job, at the Securities and Ex-

change Commission. Mr. Icahn found Mr. Altman some time later at the firm of Gordon Hurwitz Butowsky Weitzen Shalov & Wein, which the investor retained in 1981 when his regular law firm had a conflict. Soon Mr. Altman had guided Mr. Icahn through takeover bids for Dan River, Marshall Field and Phillips

Petroleum. Not successful bids, but profitable ones.

When you work for Mr. Icahn, there's always plenty of work. "The types of things Carl does are so sensitive and come under such scrutiny," the 46-year-old Mr. Altman says, "that he relies upon lots of legal advice."

For some of it, Mr. Icahn is looking to a lawyer he hadn't even met six weeks ago: Raymond L. Falls Jr., of Cahill Gordon & Reindel. Mr. Falls got the call on the recommendation of Mr. Icahn's usual choice for high-stakes litigation, Dennis Block of Weil, Gotshal & Manges, who had a conflict. Mr. Falls heads a team preparing a defense against Texaco's charges that the raider violated securities laws. Mr. Icahn has countersued, accusing Texaco executives of bad management and hiding information from shareholders.

Mr. Falls has drawn little press notice,

but he is hardly a newcomer to the takeover game. "He's the best-kept secret we've got," says Gerald Tanenbaum, a Cahill Gordon partner. "He's one of five partners here I consider brilliant." In the past Mr. Falls, 59, has helped engineer Goodyear's repulsion of Sir James Goldsmith and Telex's successful defense against Asher Edelman.

The lawyer who spends the most time with Carl Icahn is general counsel Gary Duberstein, 33. It isn't always easy, both admit.

But at least they have the same biological clock. Just like his boss, "Gary doesn't like to start his day early, but he works late into the night," says Stephen Jacobs of Weil Gotshal, where Mr. Duberstein once was an associate. "And he knows how to stay cool and calm when Carl starts planning out in eight directions all at once."

There's "no question," Mr. lcahn agrees, that part of Mr. Duberstein's job is protecting him from his own indiscretions. "I get overly involved sometimes and start to say things I shouldn't," Mr. Icahn says.

Let's listen in for a moment on a legal discussion between the most famous investor in the world and his counsel:

"No, Carl, don't say that - it's libelous," Mr. Duberstein says, interrupting a tirade by Mr. Icahn.

"But it's true-he's a jerk," counters Mr. Icahn.

"You'll wind up in court," Mr. Duberstein savs.

"I don't care. I want to say it-and I'll pay to say it," Mr. Icahn declares.

Mr. Duberstein shrugs in resignation. But five minutes later he is back on his boss's case, saving, "Carl, don't. . . . "

"At times I'm demanding and sometimes I get exasperated," Carl Icahn concludes. "But if you can get along with me, it can be a lot of fun.'
