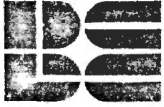

Dear Jim:

The purpose of this letter is to suggest that President and Mrs. Reagan invite - for a private social dinner - the ruling Prince of Liechtenstein, Hans Adam and his wife Marie, as well as Hans Adam's father, the former ruling prince (Franz Josef) and Princess Gina. (See pages 50 and 51 of the white book on Liechtenstein.) They are part of the REAL aristocracy of Europe (legitimate old blood, in other words, related to every ruling house imaginable.)

They could come to the White House early in October of 1985 when they come to New York for the opening festivities of the Prince of Liechtenstein's art collection at the Metropolitan Museum (labelled by John Russell of the New York Times as the greatest private collection of art in existence.)

The history of this family in this tiny country (with the highest standard of living in the world) is fascinating. The Prince and Princess live in one of the most famous castles still in operation, and each year Prince Charles and Princess Diane come for two weeks of skiing. Everything is kept very private and low key. The princely family has always shunned publicity, and I feel they are going to have a rough go of it in the U.S. when they come for their collection opening. IBM and Brooke Astor's foundation are jointly sponsoring the exhibition in conjunction with Prince Hans Adams' foundation.

The Prince is a brilliant businessman, and has opened a banking office in New York, as well as an office in Houston and in Boston. The family lost 75% of their extensive land holdings to the Germans in WWI and to the Russians in WW II. They still have a series of magnificent palaces in Austria, all leased to museums and educational institutions. The Russians are so impressed with their palace in Czechoslovakia, just over the border from Austria, they allow important people to go through it.

The fondest hope of the princely family is, of course, to be honored by an invitation from the Reagans to a private dinner. The Prince has had produced an excellent one hour film on his country and on the collection. If that could be shown in the White House theatre after dinner, their cup would runneth over. Actually their kingdom is so magical, it would fascinate the other dinner guests.

I have been doing some work for FL (Liechtenstein) for a year now, having spent some time there first.

Their schedule in America is filling up, because everyone under the sun is trying to entertain for them in New York. If the Reagans were to ask them to dinner on Monday, October 1st, or on the Friday or Saturday night before, they would be absolutely delighted. From October second on, they will be committed to events at the Metropolitan.

Liechtenstein has no embassy in this country; they use the Swiss embassies for their diplomatic channels, as well as their postal system.

An aside: Carter Brown tried to get the Liechtenstein collection for Washington, but the family decided to let it travel only to one city, and they chose New York.

I know you have a million things on your plate right now. Please forgive my presumptiveness in bringing it up before Christmas, but I know how besieged you will be after Christmas with the Inaugural!


Dear Mr. Bacharach and Ms. Sager,
