Dear Mr. Hazeika:

This in in response to your mailgram of January 30 with regard to Father Alfonsas Svarinskas who has been arrested in the Soviet Union because of his religious activities. Our Government deplores the harsh and unjust treatment of religious believers by the Soviet regime, and the Department of State attempts to follow such cases as closely as possible. We shall continue to take every appropriate opportunity to call for an end to Soviet persecution of religious believers and to bring such abuses of human rights to international attention. Father Alfonsas Svarinskas' arrest for religious activities marks him as yet another victim of the recent Soviet crackdown on religion. It is the most extreme action taken thus far against religious leaders in the Baltic. It is not, however, an isolated incident.

Unfortunately, the Soviet Government has not been responsive to our efforts, nor to those of other concerned Western governments and independent human rights organizations. Despite their nominal assent to a number of international agreements containing guarantees for religious freedom, the Soviets persist in maintaining that incarceration of "criminals" on essentially religious grounds is an exclusively internal policy matter. While we condemn such arbitrary and inhumane behavior, and have often made this known to Soviet officials, our ability to alleviate prisoners' circumstances in any direct fashion, such as securing the release of specific individuals, is sadly very limited.

We appreciate your group's interest in those imprisoned in the USSR because of their religious activities, and we will ensure that the Soviets know that the issue of religious persecution is a matter of deep concern to the American people and their Government.

We, the Lithuanian Americans of Brockton, Massachusetts assembled this 12th day of February, 1984, at St. Casimirs Church Hall to commemorate the restoration of Lithuania's independence, do hereby state as follows:

That February 16, 1984 marks the 66th anniversary of the restoration of the independence to the more than 733 year old Lithuanian State;

#### Dear Ginte:

I am responding to your November 28 letter to Walter Raymond regarding the arrest of Lithuanian Catholic priest, Jonas-Kastytis Matulionis. The Department of State has been monitoring his case since his November 9 arrest on unspecified charges.

The U.S. Government has consistently condemned Soviet persecution of Christians and other religious believers. Such measures are contrary to the human rights provisions of the Helsinki Final Act, and we have strongly called for Soviet compliance with their own undertakings in that agreement. In bilateral exchanges with the Soviets, we have made it unequivocally clear that their abuses of individual rights have a serious detrimental effect on U.S.-U.S.S.R. relations.

Unfortunately, the Soviet Government has not been responsive to our efforts or to those of other concerned Western governments and independent human rights organizations.

The Soviets persist in maintaining that incarceration of "criminals" on essentially religious grounds is an exclusively internal policy matter. While we condemn such arbitrary and inhumane behavior, and have often made this known to Soviet officials, we lack the ability to alleviate the circumstances of prisoners or psychiatric hospital detainees in any direct fashion. We will not give up, however, and intend to persist in our attempts to exercise what influence we have.

Thank you for your expression of concern in the case of Father Matulionis. If I can be of further assistance in this or any other matter, do not hesitate to contact me.

We have learned about the arrest of yet another Lithuanian Catholic priest, Jonas-Kastytis Matulionis.

According to a report in "The Baltimore Sun". Fr. Matulionis was arrested on November 9 after administering last rites to a dying man (see enclosed transcript for additional details).

Issue no. 64 of the Chronicle of the Catholic Church in Lithuania, which recently reached the West, reports that Fr. Matulionis was among the signatories to a greeting issued to exiled Bishop Julijonas Steponavicius on the occasion of his 29th anniversary as bishop. The greeting, dated August-September 1984, was signed by over 90 priests from the Archdiocese of Vilnius.

This same issue states that a poem by Father Matulionis was censored from the 1984 Catholic Calendar-Directory by Commissioner for Religious Affairs in the Lithuanian SSR, Petras Anilionis.

Jonas-Kastytis Matulionis was arrested the first time in 1976, as a lay person, for his association with the Chronicle, imprisoned for nine months in a KGB isolation cell and given a 2 year suspended sentence.

After he graduated from the underground seminary, the interrogations and fines increased. He was summoned for questioning to Vilnius on October 11, 1983 (Matulionis ignored a summons for August 8, 1983) by KGB Colonel Liniauskas. In the course of the interrogation, Liniauskas asked Matulionis how his petitions got into the Chronicle and questioned him about Fr. Sigitas Tamkevicius.

Matulionis served as assistant pastor at Fr. Tamkevicius' parish in Kybartai, Lithuania. Tamkevicius was warned repeatedly by Soviet authorities for allowing Matulionis, "a false priest without registration papers", to function as assistant pastor.

MOSCOW. KGB agents have arrested one of the leaders of the Lithuanian nationalistic Catholic movement, sources said yesterday. The arrrested leader was identified as the Rev. Jonas Kastytis Matulionis, a man of about fifty who took priestly vows after graduating from an underground theological seminary.

According to sources, Father Matulionis had just administered last rites for a dying man on November 9th, when he was picked up by agents of the KGB, the Soviet Union's secret police. Father Matulionis, who had been under surveillance for days before his arrest, has been linked to the Chronicle of the Catholic Church in Lithuania, a clandestine publication distributed to believers in the Baltic Soviet republic. A translated version of the journal is edited in Brooklyn, New York, by the Rev. Casimir Pugevicius, a former Baltimorian.

In 1976, Father Matulionis was arrested for his Chronicle-related activities and spent nine months in KGB enforced isolation. Later he was accused by authorities of being an impostor since he had studied by correspondence and had not graduated from the officially approved Kaunas theological seminary. "Our Pope John Paul II attended just such a seminary", replied Father Matulionis. "I am a priest".

He had first considered a musical career but was expelled from a conservatory for singing in a church.

The Chronicle, which has been appearing since March 1972, is one of the mouthpieces of the religious nationalistic turbulence in Lithuania, a largely Catholic republic bordering on Poland that was annexed by the Soviet Union at the outset of World War II. During the nearly twelve years that the Chronicle has been published, dozens of pepole have been arrested for working for it and distributing it. The continuation of the Chronicle, even after much of the secular human rights movement in the rest of the Soviet Union was stamped out, tends to indicate that Lithuania's Catholic underground movement has successfully resisted KGB efforts to penetrate it.


