Luxembourg dedicates soldier's monument

Some 70 veterans of the Battle of the Bulge were invited by the "Studies Circle of the Battle of the Bulge" to attend the official inauguration of a monument to the American soldier in the Luxembourg Ardennes town of Clervaux Sunday. The cold and the rain did not prevent the Crown Prince and Princess of Luxembourg, the Prime Minister, several other government members, U.S. Ambassador John E. Dolibois, countless other high-ranking civilians and military, as well as thousands of people directly affected almost 40 years ago from attend the ceremony.

The dedication started with a parade of 1944 vintage U.S. jeeps and other military vehicles, led by the U.S. Air Forces in Europe Marching Band. The numbers and names of the companies, battalions, and regiments involved in the battle were written on the vehicles. With tears in his eyes, one former company commander got into a jeep marked "CO C, 27th Armoured Infantry Battalion" saying, "I never dreamed I'd be in this seat again."

Clervaux Mayor Michel Wehrhausen welcomed all the guests to the ceremony. Addressing the U.S. veterans, he said it was very satisfying to see that so many of them had crossed the ocean to participate in the inauguration of their monument. Camille Kohn, CEBA president, thanked everyone involved for the success of the monument dedication, including the USAFE Band, which enhanced the event with their professional music. He recalled the events of December 1944, the Battle of the Bulge, and assured the American people that the sacrifice of their soldiers would never be forgotten.

Pierre Werner, Prime Minister of Luxembourg, reminisced about the exile of the Luxembourg Royal House and government in the U.S. during World War II. He underlined the unalterable friendship between the two countries, and assured the veterans that as long as they lived, they would have a home in Luxembourg.

After the monument was unveiled by Luxembourg Crown Prince Henri and his wife, Princess Maria Theresa, His Excellency John E. Dolibois, U.S. Ambassador to Luxembourg, read a personal message from President Ronald Reagan. In that message, President Reagan expressed his appreciation for the dedication of the monument, and pledged continued friendship between the two countries. The ambassador stated that he considered the monument to be "a symbol of courage for the defense of freedom and human rights."

Concluding the ceremony, a veteran, speaking for all his comrades, read a moving poem and dedicated the American soldier monument to "those who died and to those who are still living."

Barons clip Hawks 51-9 Sunday

The Barons offense and defense tied Continental Sports Conference records Sunday while Freddie Miller ran for 202 yards downing the Hahn Hawks 51 to 9.

It was a good day for the Barons' defensive backs as they combined to pick off eight Hawks passes tieing the 1981 Rhein Main Rockets and the 1982 Sembach Tigers. Bobby Winn led the way with three interceptions taking one of them 36 yards for a touchdown. Danny Estes pulled in two and Manley Johnson, Chris McKinstry and Charles Woodfolk had one each.

On the other side of the line, it was the Barons offense taking charge of the line amassing 403 yards rushing in 68 attempts. The 68 rushes tied the CSC record held by the 1980 CSC Champion Bitburg Barons.

It took just two plays for the Barons to find paydirt as quarterback Dan Muchler pitched the ball to Miller, sprinting outside for a 48-yard touchdown. The try-for point was no good and the Barons led 6 to 0.

The Hawks' first score of the day came when the Barons were forced to punt from their own 22-yard line. The snap from center got caught by the strong wind and sailed over Ricky Sather's head into the end zone. Sather wisely downed the ball in the end zone giving the Hawks the safety and two points. The score at the end of the first period, Barons 6, Hawks 2.

The Barons put the game away in the second period tacking 32 points to the scoreboard. The first TD

facemask, the Barons had the ball first-and-goal at the Hawks' 6-yard line. From that point Fredrick Highsmith ran for 3 yards before the Hawks tightened up holding the Barons on the next two downs. The Barons, going all the way, gave the ball to Highsmith who charged into the end zone for six points. Highsmith then split the uprights making the score Barons 21 Hawks 2.

On the ensuing kick off, Highsmith booted the ball through the end zone for the touchback giving the Hawks the ball at their own 20-yard line. On their first play Winn found a loose ball and recovered it at Hawks' 17-yard line. Ray Ransom came on as quarterback and on first down handed off to Gregory Benjamin hitting out for 6 yards. On second-and-fourth from the 11, Ransom dropped back to pass and found Dale Binkley alone in the end zone for the TD. Highsmith tacked on the PAT and the Barons led 28 to 2.

Less than three minutes later Winn hauled in his second Hawks pass and ran it 36 yards for the first defensive tally of the season. Highsmith was again good on the point after. Barons 35, Hawks 2.

The Barons final tally of the first half came when the drive stalled at the Hawks' 9-yard line. Once again Highsmith was called upon, this time for a 25 yard field goal. Barons 38, Hawks 2 at the half.

The Barons came out smoking in the second half putting together an 11-play drive to the Hahn 6 before the ball was fumbled away in the end zone. Fear not. Enter "Big D". The Hawks put the ball in play at the 20 and on third-and-nine from the 21, Winn picked

masterminded another 11-play drive that featured the power running of Bob Sweeny and Highsmith coupled with a 19-yard pass completion to Michael Kinney. On fourth-and-goal from the one, Muchler called his own number and punched it in on a quarterback-keeper. Ricky Turner split the uprights this time giving the Barons a 51 to 2 lead.

The Hawks' only touchdown of the day came as the result of two long passes from quarterback A.J. Jones to wide receiver Silk Eddings. The first one was for 53 yards and then came the 30-yard touchdown with just 2:17 left on the clock. Rick Womer added the extra point and the final was Bitburg 51, Hahn 9.

Saturday the Barons take on the Ramstein Rams in what could be the most important game of the season. The Rams are coming in with a 3-0 record and a big rout over the Rhein Main Rockets Sunday. The Barons are currently 2-1 and looking better than ever. It promises to be a hard-hitting contest so come on out and support the Barons. Game time is 1 p.m. at Barons Stadium.
