

WHITE HOUSE TEA IN HONOR OF GRAND DUCHESS JOSEPHINE-CHARLOTTE OF LUXEMBOURG

The occasion of the state visit to the United States is of genuine importance to the Luxembourg royal family. The last such visit occurred 20 years ago, a short time before the present Grand Duke ascended to the throne.

The Grand Duchess Josephine-Charlotte is a gracious, quiet woman. The sister of King Baudouin of Belgium, she is also related through her late mother, Queen Astrid, to the Swedish royal family.

The Grand Duke and Grand Duchess have five children and three grandchildren, and are proud of their children's connections with the United States. The eldest son, heir apparent Prince Henri, has traveled extensively in the US in his capacity as Chairman of Luxembourg's Economic Development Board. He will join the Luxembourg delegation at the last stop of the state visit, Chicago. Another son, Prince Jean, lives in New York where he is with the W.R. Grace Company. The two daughters are Princess Marie-Astrid and Princess Margaretha, who studied in the United States at Barnard and St. Mary's Notre Dame, respectively. The youngest child, Prince Guillaume, is in university training in Europe.

As head of the Luxembourg Red Cross, the Grand Duchess is interested in public health issues and the welfare of women and children. Her other interests include gardening (she has supervised improvements in the gardens of the royal castle at Colmar-Berg), horses (she has visited horse farms in Kentucky), and travel (she accompanied the Grand Duke on a state visit to China several years ago).

Suggested Talking Points:

- -- I am pleased to know that you will be spending some time in California, our home state, as a part of this visit.
- -- I understand that you were in Los Angeles for the Olympics last summer, and that your travels now will take you to Northern California.
- -- I would be interested to hear about some of your other travel. We have a common experience, I understand, in having visited China.
- -- We were both also at the Utah Beach memorial ceremonies last June.
- -- Luxembourg, I am told, is known for its fine china, produced by the Villeroy-Bosch factory. I would be pleased to hear something about Luxembourg's tradition in the production of china.
