

In two separate messages State has forwarded and endorsed the nominations of two new ambassadors to the United States, one from the Federal Islamic Republic of the Comoros, and one from the Democratic Republic of Madagascar.

The Comoros government is a semi-feudal, pro-Western French client state, principally consisting of three small islands off the east coast of Africa. We have a non-resident ambassador and the Comoran Government proposes to accredit their Paris ambassador to Washington. Since Paris is the most important Comoran post, he is presumably one of their best men (little is know of him).

The Madagascar Government, a leftist, Marxist autocratic regime, has been making some moves to conciliate relations with the West in recent months, primarily due to economic backruptcy and the need for aid (and Soviet unresponsiveness to requests for aid). The proposed ambassador is one of the few pro-Western technocrats in the government and State is doubtless correct that this is a positive signal of sorts.

I support State's recommendations in both cases.

RECOMMENDATION: That you approve the two attached Wheeler-Bremer memos indicating Presidential concurrence with the agreement requests.

BIOGRAPHY - Benjamin Razafintseheno

Democratic Republic of Madagascar

Ambassador Razafintseheno is currently the Secretary General of the Malagasy Foreign Ministry. His most recent overseas position was Ambassador to the United Kingdom (1973-1975); he was also accredited to several Scandinavian countries at the time. Razafintseheno is the first ambassadorial nomination proposed for Washington since the deterioration of bilateral relations in 1975. The Government of the Democratic Republic of Madagascar proposed restoring ambassador-level relations in early 1980 and a U.S. Ambassador presented his credentials in November of that year. Razafintseheno is a tested friend of the West, who has wanted very much to go to the United States. His selection is evidence of President Ratsiraka's desire to sustain improving relations with the United States.

Razafintseheno was born in 1926 and has studied law and diplomacy in French universities. From 1961-1970 he held several positions in the Foreign Ministry and in 1971 was named ambassador to Taipei. He returned to the Foreign Ministry briefly before being named to London. Since 1976 he has served in Antananarivo, at one point as a Supreme Court Counselor. In 1968 Razafintseheno visited the United States as a leader grantee.

A thorough search of U.S. Government sources reveals no grounds for objection.

Democratic Republic of Madagascar

Leon Rajaobelina has been Governor of the Central Bank, Madagascar's most important financial institution, for the past ten years. A member of the Central Committee of President Ratsiraka's policical party, AREMA, he is also well connected at the highest political levels. Rajaobelina is well and favorably known to the U.S. Embassy in Antananarivo and to U.S. bankers with whom he has dealt on numerous occasions. He has good working relations and experience with the IMF and World Bank. From 1966 to 1972, Rajaobelina served at the IMF as Alternate Executive Director.

Rajaobelina, 46, was born in Antananarivo. He studied in Paris and was an IBRD fellow in Washington, D. C. In addition to service at the IMF as Alternate Director, he has long work experience in Madagascar's ministries responsible for budget and finance, and was a Director General of Economy in the Ministry of Economy and Finance. Rajaobelina speaks English well, is married and has four children.

Dear John,

At this time of Gramm-Rudman budget-cutting, I wanted you to see the comments of the Inspector General's team concerning the work of my embassy. They praised my efforts to define country goals and make maxiumum use of available resources to achieve them. They judged that I had implemented management by goals and objectives to a degree highly unusual for the foreign service. Especially flattering was the request of the team leader, Mr. Walter Silva, that I write to the Inspector General on my analytical approach to policy-making and resource allocation. He was convinced that such improved methodology would help State in the weighing of priorities and the recognition of trade-offs under present circumstances of stringent budgetary constraints. Is it possible that the door to more rational policy-making is now opening in State?

On a personal note, I'm expecting to hear next week about my background investigation ( my third so far, but this one has taken a long time). Hopefully, the official announcement of my appointment to the World Bank can then be made allowing me to leave here by the end of this month. Perhaps you could have breakfast with me when I arrive back in Washington?

Dear Mr. Ambassador:

My colleagues and I have nearly completed our inspection of Embassy Antananarivo and we look forward to our final meeting with you on Thursday. Attached are a copy of the draft inspection report and its annex which includes a consolidated listing of summary inspection findings and recommendations. A final record copy of the report and its annex will be produced in Washington and given appropriate limited circulation. You will be provided a copy for the post's files.

A list of operational findings and recommendations directed to the mission is also attached. These form a part of the official record of the inspection but are not normally circulated outside the Office of the Inspector General. We will be pleased to discuss any of these with you at our Thursday meeting.

I shall not here elaborate on any particular sections of the report. However, I would like to draw your personal attention to some aspects of our findings:

- -- Management of the mission's role in implementing the foreign policy of the United States in Madagascar is outstanding. The dialogue you promoted between the post and the Department on the premises of U.S. policies here has been exemplary.
- -- We were especially aware of the spirit of collegiality that underlies the activities of the post, the participation and cooperation of other agencies of the mission in the analysis of the American role in Madagascar and in the reporting and representational functions of the Embassy, the easy flow of communications in all directions. Clearly, your staff has a high regard for both you and your DCM.
- -- We were impressed by the excellent job done by your DCM, who carries the bulk of the reporting load of the Embassy and who during his tour has frequently served as charge, sometimes for extended periods.

- -- The quality of the post's reporting is excellent in light of the limited resources available to you. Washington end-users have, however, pointed to the need for broader coverage and more rapid communication of certain aspects of the situation in Madagascar. In order to make that possible, we are strongly recommending to the Department that additional resources be made available to you.
- -- For the benefit of your and your DCM's successors, you should consider reducing to writing the post's travel and representational plans as they emerge from your decisions on post objectives.
- -- We have identified several areas in which the absence of rigorous internal controls presents opportunities for waste, fraud, and mismanagement. There may be others which we did not have time to examine closely. The presence of a very capable "rover" administrative officer over the past few weeks has already made some difference though it will take more time than he has available to effect all the corrections needed. He has however already identified virtually all the weaknesses reflected in our findings and is to be congratulated for what he has achieved in a short time. Over the long term, more intrusive attention to internal controls should be given by post management.
- -- In our discussions with your staff we made a number of suggestions that do not appear in the report. In those cases corrective action was taken immediately, making further action unnecessary.

I would stress that the views, opinions, findings, and conclusions contained in the report, its annex, and in the list of findings and operational recommendations attached, are subject to confirmation by the Inspector General. The Inspector General will send you a telegram advising you of any changes in formal or operational recommendations resulting from the Washington review and asking that you begin compliance. Compliance with the formal recommendations will be subject to the procedures described in 2 FAM 134.4 and in the attached "Inspection Compliance Procedures." Your response to the operational recommendations should be in the same format for the formal recommendations, but should be in a separate FI Channel message for the Inspector General.

You are authorized to show the draft report, its annex, or any of the other materials we leave with you to any of the American members of the mission who have a need to know its

contents. However, it may not be released beyond the American personnel of the mission without the prior authorization of the Inspector General. Our overall evaluation of the mission's performance is contained in the body of the report. This written assessment combined with the discussions we have had with you and your staff over the course of the inspection comprise the total product of the team's efforts.

We have been most appreciative of everything you and your staff have done to facilitate our inspection and make our visit a pleasant one.

For the many kindnesses extended to us and the hospitality of the post, we are sincerely grateful.

(U) Post leadership has implemented management by goals and objectives to a degree highly unusual for the Foreign Service. Keeping in mind the overall U.S. interest of strategic denial to the Soviet Union, the Ambassador has developed seven major goals and charted the means of pursuing them. The resulting matrix assigns relative weights to the programs of all U.S. Government agencies as well as to private enterprise initiatives. The entire country team and all Embassy sections are involved in the planning effort and work as an integrated unit.
