Dear Mr. President:

I write to bring to your attention an extremely disturbing report I have just received stating that all the synagogues in Tunis were closed by the Tunisian Government during Rosh Hashanah. According to this report, the government's reason for taking this action was that in view of the tensions resulting from the situation in Lebanon, it felt it was necessary to close the synagogues in order to prevent the possibility that any terrorist acts would be conducted against them.


I urge you to raise the issue of the closing of the synagogues with the Tunisian Government as soon as possible. I certainly support the desire of the Tunisian Government to prevent any terrorist attacks against the Jewish community. However, to the extent that there is a threat to the security of the synagogues in Tunis, it seems to me that the appropriate response is to provide protection to the synagogues rather than to close them.

As you know, this Sunday evening, September 26, marks the beginning of Yom Kippur, the holiest day of the year for all Jews. The importance of ensuring that the synagogues of Tunis be open on that date is, I am sure, clear to you.

I, therefore, respectfully request that the Administration immediately raise this issue with the Tunisian Government and find out if the synagogues in Tunis were, in fact, closed on Rosh Hashanah. If they were closed, I would further request that the Administration urge the Tunisian Government both to permit all the synagogues in Tunis to be open for Yom Kippur and to provide adequate protection for them at that time.

I thank you for your assistance in this matter.



Dear Senator Moynihan:

I am writing in answer to your letter of September 23 to President Reagan about the closing of synagogues in Tunisia during the recent Jewish holy days.

Our Embassy in Tunis reports that the synagogues in Tunisia were open on Yom Kippur and that it had no reason to believe they had been closed during previous days.

It would be uncharacteristic of the Tunisian Government to deny its Jewish community freedom of worship or protection. More characteristic was the appeal for Jews and Arabs to work together which President Bourguiba of Tunisia made on the Islamic holiday of Id al-Adha, coinciding this year with Yom Kippur. The germane portion of his statement reads:

"In a year so overburdened with painful events which have threatened the very foundations of universal ethics, ethics which owe so much to the teachings of the first revealed religion, in this year's Yom Kippur day which coincides with the celebration of Aid El-Idha, I appeal to all Jews to work together hand in hand for peace."



We do not believe that the attached letter from President Bourguiba requires an answer from President Reagan.

The letter acknowledges an earlier message from President Reagan concerning his peace proposals. Although warm and appreciative, Bourguiba's letter raises no specific points requiring a response.

The Tunisians intend to participate in the high-level Arab League delegation due in Washington later this month to discuss Middle East peace with President Reagan. A Presidential letter to Bourguiba might be appropriate immediately after their meeting or during the negotiations on an overall settlement of the Middle Eastern questions which we hope to inaugurate soon.

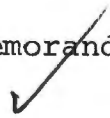
