Dear Mr. Bouchadekh:

I am replying to your cable to President Reagan in which you expressed concern on behalf of the Association of Rights and Freedoms of the Maghrebis and in the Maghreb about the September trial of Islamic fundamentalists in Tunisia.

As you know, a special state security court was constituted to try 90 fundamentalists, including the leaders of the Islamic Tendency Movement (MTI) and six men allegedly involved in the bombings of four tourist hotels. The accused were charged with attempting the violent overthrow of the state, collusion with a foreign power (Iran), and inciting the population to revolt and murder. After a month of sessions and a lengthy deliberation, the court convicted 76 of the 90 defendants and sentenced seven to death -- two in custody who admitted to carrying out violent acts, and five in absentia. Fourteen were acquitted. President Rachid Ghannouchi received life at hard labor, and the other defendants found guilty received sentences varying from two years in prison to 20 years at hard labor. Tunisia, to the extent that the government distinguished between violent crimes and political activities, the verdicts were welcomed. The Tunisian government announced November 7 it had decided to postpone indefinitely the pending trials of two recently arrested activists who had been at large.

For its part, the United States Government has deplored the use of violence, such as the planting of explosive devices at tourist installations. At the same time, we have also urged that a distinction be drawn between criminal violence and peaceful political opposition. We shall continue to do so. Thank you for your expression of interest in this important question.
