Dear President Reagan:

As president of the A. Philip Randolph Institute, a national black trade union and civil rights organization, I am writing to urge you not to sign the proposed revision of Executive Order No. 11246. The proposed revision would eliminate the requirement that numerical goals, statistical proof of racial or sexual bias be kept by contractors who do business with the federal government.

While our organization, which has 180 affiliates in 37 states, has always opposed "quotas" per se, we strongly support flexible goals and timetables which have proven to be effective barometers for determining civil rights compliance. Clearly, without some reference to numerical indications and statistics, it would be impossible to determine whether government contractors have, in fact, been seeking out, hiring and promoting qualified blacks and other minorities.

Mr. President, signing the proposed revision of Exective Order No. 11246 would threaten to unravel 20 years of progress in the struggle for racial and sexual equality. It would also send a deeply disturbing message to our members and the black community --- that your Administration is completely insensitive to the goals and spirit of affirmative action. Thousands of companies, many of them among the nation's largest, are bound by present affirmative action requirements because they do business with the government. Relieving them of these obligations would have far-reaching and negative consequences on efforts to produce needed improvement in employment of blacks, other minorities and women.
