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PROPOSED TALKING POINTS FOR NATIONAL SECURITY ADVISOR'S MEETING WITH SYG CARRINGTON CABINET ROOM, 2 APRIL 1987

- -- Thank you Mr. President. I believe we all appreciate the value and importance of NATO to our national security. Let me also assure you, Lord Carrington, that we all appreciate your efforts to keep the Alliance moving forward -- in both political cohesion and military preparedness.
- -- Efforts to promote armaments cooperation enhance both the political and defense cohesion of NATO. We all recognize the dynamic nature of the threat NATO faces, and the requirements to deter that threat.
- -- Will (Taft), you have been as deeply involved as anyone in carrying out the US part of armaments cooperation. Could you share some of your perspective with us?

 [After presentation by Deputy Secretary Taft]
- -- Lord Carrington from your vantage point as Secretary

 General, would you care to comment on how this effort is

 progressing?

[After any remarks by Lord Carrington]

- -- Sam (Nunn), the resources the US has available to help prod and stimulate this effort are due in large part to your energetic sponsorship by you and John Warner. Would you like to comment?
- -- John (Warner), what would you like to add?

 [After Warner's comments, if there is no discussion, -- close the meeting]

Administration when I say that this has been a most encouraging exchange. It is a demonstration that NATO is using imaginative and effective ways to achieve needed defense improvements in the most effective possible ways. In addition, it is a prime example of bipartisan cooperation between the legislative and executive branches of the US Government to demonstrate the central role NATO's health plays in our national security. I thank all of you for your continuing efforts.

-- Cap, DOD has been working vigorously to accelerate defense improvements through cooperative efforts. Do you see any difficulties in continuing to achieve progress in these efforts?

PROPOSED TALKING POINTS FOR THE PRESIDENT CABINET ROOM MEETING 10:20 A.M., APRIL 2, 1987

Ladies and Gentlemen, Members of Congress:

- -- Lord Carrington and I just had substantial discussions about the vitality of the Alliance. One element of that vitality is armaments cooperation.
- -- Congress' contribution in endorsing and funding the co-development program at an initial funding level of \$200 million has opened up new opportunities of benefit to everyone -- especially to taxpayers for a better return on their "defense dollar."
- This endeavor is helping to improve NATO's conventional defense as we move forward in our negotiations on equitable, stabilizing and verifiable reduction of nuclear weapons.

 Also it will help our force efficiency when we begin negotiations with the Warsaw Pact for more stable conventional forces from the Atlantic to the Urals.
- -- As a result of the Nunn/Roth/Warner amendment in the Senate there may well be as many as a dozen Memoranda of Understanding signed in cooperative ventures with Alliance nations. This is a historic first in the Alliance, and will have a profound impact on NATO's conventional defense as well as better return on both US and European taxpayers' defense investment in all Alliance nations.
- -- This amendment has been a model of partnership and constructive cooperation between the U.S. Mission to NATO,

the North Atlantic Council, the Department of Defense, and Capitol Hill, and has received special Senate floor leadership from Senators Nunn, Warner and Stevens.

- either co-sponsors or leaders in promoting this important legislation in the Authorizing and Appropriating Committees. This partnership approach is the best antidote to trends towards defense protectionism on both sides of the Atlantic as well as troop withdrawal amendments.
- The international political framework NATO has set up for stimulating progress in this partnership venture has been remarkable. The newly created reinforced North Atlantic Council meetings of Deputy Defense Ministers includes the French, the first such use of the Council since 1950. This is a very constructive way to encourage closer French cooperation on Defense issues.
- -- This framework has also been a challenge and a stimulant for Europeans to get their house in order, and to eliminate costly weapons duplications.
- -- Our representative at these NATO meetings, Will Taft, is here with us and I understand will have some remarks later.
- -- I am grateful that Lord Carrington has taken personal leadership in this area at NATO and, like him, I am anxious for continued Congressional support for the program. I am sure Lord Carrington will also wish to say a few words.

- -- In sum, we have an excellent model here of both international and bipartisan domestic cooperation aimed at improving our common security.
- -- I deeply appreciate the wisdom and energy of all the parties who have made it work -- many of whom are gathered here today. We would appreciate hearing your views on where we should go next.
- -- Unfortunately, I can not stay, but I would like to turn the meeting over to my National Security Advisor, Frank Carlucci.


