#### I. PURPOSE

To honor the request of Congressman Guy Molinari that an event be held to increase public awareness of children's liver disease.

#### II. BACKGROUND

Guy Molinari is a second term Republican from New York's Fourteenth District (Staten Island). He has been involved with children's liver disease organizations for a number of years and attended the signing ceremony for National Children's Liver Disease Awareness Week last July. At that time he discussed with the President the thought of having a public event on this topic.

Accompanying Congressman Molinari will be two officials of the Children's Liver Foundation (CLF). CLF is a non-profit, volunteer organization which supports children's liver disease research; provides support systems for families; and provides educational material for the public and medical community. CLF was founded in 1975 and now has seventeen chapters throughout the country. The Foundation helped to underwrite the cost of the U.S. Surgeon General's workshop on solid organ procurement which took place last year at Project Hope, Virginia.

Mrs. Maxine Turon is the founder and current President of the Foundation. Mrs. Turon had a daughter born in 1972 with biliary atresia and was given only one year to live. She and her husband looked all over the country for some support organization, and found none. With another couple, they formed the Children's Liver Foundation in 1975.

Mrs. Lourdes Aviles is the immediate past President of CLF and has worked with Congressman Molinari on individual cases and the overall issue of children's liver disease.

Mrs. Aviles has an eight year old daughter who is waiting for a donor to be located so that a transplant can be performed.

Following Question and Answer Period, THE PRESIDENT and THE VICE PRESIDENT and MRS. BUSH proceed to the Blue Room via the south doors of the State Dining Room and the Red Room and take their places in front of the fireplace for the receiving line.

Once the PRINCIPALS are in place, the receiving line will feed from the south door of the State Dining Room into the Red Room, through the south door of the Red Room into the Blue Room, past THE PRESIDENT, THE VICE PRESIDENT, and MRS. BUSH, out the Cross Hall doors, and into the Grand Foyer.

Guests will be escorted in small groups out the North Portico to the Old Executive Office Building for the rest of the day's program. (Favors will be given to guests upon departure from the Residence.)

1:30 p.m. Upon conclusion of the receiving line, THE PRESIDENT, THE VICE PRESIDENT, and MRS. BUSH depart the State Floor.
