TALKING POINTS FOR KISSINGER BRIEFING

THE LATE SENATOR HENRY JACKSON OBSERVED THAT WHATEVER POLICY OPTIONS ARE OPEN TO THE UNITED STATES IN CENTRAL AMERICA, IGNORING THE PROBLEMS OF THE REGION IS NOT AMONG THEM. THE COMPLEXITY AND SEEMING INTRANSIGENCE OF THE PROBLEMS OF CENTRAL AMERICA INSPIRED THE FORMATION OF A BIPARTISAN COMMISSION TO REPORT ON BOTH THE LONG AND SHORT TERM PROSPECTS FOR THE REGION.

FACED WITH A CRISIS, AMERICANS HAVE ALWAYS BEEN ABLE TO PUT PARTISAN POLITICS ASIDE IN THE NATIONAL INTEREST. DURING THIS ADMINISTRATION, THIS APPROACH HAS ALREADY BEEN USED TO TACKLE THE PROBLEMS OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY SYSTEM AND THE MX MISSILE.

THE CENTRAL AMERICAN CRISIS, BECAUSE THE REGION IS SO CLOSE TO HOME, REQUIRES THE IMMEDIATE ATTENTION OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE. THE PRESIDENT FEELS THAT THE WORK OF THE NATIONAL BIPARTISAN COMMISSION ON CENTRAL AMERICA HAS BEEN AN ENORMOUS HELP NOT ONLY IN ALERTING THE AMERICAN PEOPLE TO THE IMPORTANCE OF THE REGION, BUT IN FORGING THE BIPARTISAN CONSENSUS NECESSARY TO ADDRESS ITS PROBLEMS.

IT HAS ALWAYS BEEN AND REMAINS THE POLICY OF THIS ADMINISTRATION TO PROMOTE DEMOCRACY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IN CENTRAL AMERICA: DEMOCRACY SO THAT THE VOICES OF ALL THE PEOPLE CAN BE HEARD, NOT JUST THOSE WITH GUNS: REAL ECONOMIC GROWTH, SPURRED BY THE PRIVATE SECTOR, SO THAT MODERNIZATION CAN TAKE PLACE WITHOUT THE HEAVY BURDEN OF DEBT THAT FACES OTHER LATIN AMERICAN STATES.
