TALKING POINTS FOR KISSINGER BRIEFING

THE LATE SENATOR HENRY JACKSON OBSERVED THAT WHATEVER POLICY OPTIONS ARE OPEN TO THE UNITED STATES IN CENTRAL AMERICA, IGNORING THE PROBLEMS OF THE REGION IS NOT AMONG THEM. THE COMPLEXITY AND SEEMING INTRANSIGENCE OF THE PROBLEMS OF CENTRAL AMERICA INSPIRED THE FORMATION OF A BIPARTISAN COMMISSION TO REPORT ON BOTH THE LONG AND SHORT TERM PROSPECTS FOR THE REGION.

FACED WITH A CRISIS, AMERICANS HAVE ALWAYS BEEN ABLE TO PUT PARTISAN POLITICS ASIDE IN THE NATIONAL INTEREST. DURING THIS ADMINISTRATION, THIS APPROACH HAS ALREADY BEEN USED TO TACKLE THE PROBLEMS OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY SYSTEM AND THE MX MISSILE.

THE CENTRAL AMERICAN CRISIS, BECAUSE THE REGION IS SO CLOSE TO HOME, REQUIRES THE IMMEDIATE ATTENTION OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE. THE PRESIDENT FEELS THAT THE WORK OF THE NATIONAL BIPARTISAN COMMISSION ON CENTRAL AMERICA HAS BEEN AN ENORMOUS HELP NOT ONLY IN ALERTING THE AMERICAN PEOPLE TO THE IMPORTANCE OF THE REGION, BUT IN FORGING THE BIPARTISAN CONSENSUS NECESSARY TO ADDRESS ITS PROBLEMS.

IT HAS ALWAYS BEEN AND REMAINS THE POLICY OF THIS ADMINISTRATION TO PROMOTE DEMOCRACY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IN CENTRAL AMERICA: DEMOCRACY SO THAT THE VOICES OF ALL THE PEOPLE CAN BE HEARD, NOT JUST THOSE WITH GUNS: REAL ECONOMIC GROWTH, SPURRED BY THE PRIVATE SECTOR, SO THAT MODERNIZATION CAN TAKE PLACE WITHOUT THE HEAVY BURDEN OF DEBT THAT FACES OTHER LATIN AMERICAN STATES.

THE PRESIDENT DEMONSTRATED HIS COMMITMENT TO THESE GOALS BY SENDING THE COMMISSION'S BEST IDEAS TO CONGRESS AS THE CENTRAL AMERICA DEMOCRACY, PEACE AND DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE OF 1984. WE URGE PROMPT CONSIDERATION OF THIS PACKAGE BY CONGRESS.

PRIOR TO ASSUMING HIS PRESENT DUTIES, MR. DAM WAS THE PROVOST OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO.

IN 1971, MR. DAM SERVED AS ASSISTANT DIRECTOR FOR NATIONAL SECURITY AND INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS OF THE OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET. IN 1973, HE WAS NAMED EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE CABINET-LEVEL COUNCIL ON ECONOMIC POLICY.

MR. DAM IS ALSO A MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CHICAGO COUNCIL ON FOREIGN RELATIONS AND A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL ON FOREIGN RELATIONS IN NEW YORK.

HIS BOOKS INCLUDE MOST RECENTLY THE RULES OF THE GAME: REFORM AND EVOLUTION IN THE INTERNATIONAL MONETARY SYSTEM (1982) AND ECONOMIC POLICY BEYOND THE HEADLINES (1976) WITH GEORGE P. SHULTZ.

AMBASSADOR LANGHORNE MOTLEY - INTRODUCTION

AMBASSADOR MOTLEY WAS BORN IN BRAZIL AND ATTENDED SCHOOL THROUGH HIGH SCHOOL IN BRAZIL. HE GRADUATED FROM THE CITADEL IN CHARLESTON, SOUTH CAROLINA.

IN THE UNITED STATES AIR FORCE, HE SERVED WITH THE U.S. SOUTHERN COMMAND IN PANAMA DURING WHICH TIME HE TRAVELLED EXTENSIVELY THROUGHOUT LATIN AMERICA.

FROM 1975 TO 1977, HE SERVED AS HEAD OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOR THE STATE OF ALASKA. IN 1981, HE WAS APPOINTED AMBASSADOR TO BRAZIL BY PRESIDENT REAGAN. AND, IN 1983, PRESIDENT REAGAN APPOINTED HIM AS THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF STATE FOR INTER-AMERICAN AFFAIRS.

ROBERT C. MCFARLANE, ASSISTANT TO THE PRESIDENT FOR NATIONAL SECURITY AFFAIRS

PRIOR TO HIS PRESENT POSITION, HE WAS THE PRESIDENT'S PERSONAL REPRESENTATIVE IN THE MIDDLE EAST WHERE HE HAD SERVED SINCE JULY 1983. HE ALSO SERVED AS DEPUTY ASSISTANT TO THE PRESIDENT FOR NATIONAL SECURITY AFFAIRS FROM JANUARY 1982.

IN JANUARY 1981, MR. MCFARLANE WAS NOMINATED AS COUNSELOR, DEPARTMENT OF STATE, WHERE HE SERVED UNTIL COMING TO THE WHITE HOUSE. IN 1979-1981, HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE PROFESSIONAL STAFF OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON ARMED SERVICES. HE WAS A SENIOR RESEARCH FELLOW AT THE NATIONAL DEFENSE UNIVERSITY IN WASHINGTON, DC IN 1977-78.

IN 1976-77, HE WAS SPECIAL ASSISTANT TO THE PRESIDENT FOR NATIONAL SECURITY AFFAIRS. MR. MCFARLANE WAS EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT TO THE ASSISTANT TO THE PRESIDENT FOR NATIONAL SECURITY AFFAIRS IN 1975-76. FROM 1973-75, HE WAS MILITARY ASSISTANT TO DR. HENRY KISSINGER AT THE WHITE HOUSE.

MR. MCFARLANE IS RETIRED FROM THE MARINE CORPS (LT. COLONEL). HE IS A RECIPIENT OF THE DISTINGUISHED SERVICE MEDAL, THE NATION'S HIGHEST PEACETIME MILITARY DECORATION.

IN THE UNITED STATES AIR FORCE, HE SERVED WITH THE U.S. SOUTHERN COMMAND IN PANAMA DURING WHICH TIME HE TRAVELLED EXTENSIVELY THROUGHOUT LATIN AMERICA.

FROM 1975 TO 1977, HE SERVED AS HEAD OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOR THE STATE OF ALASKA. IN 1981, HE WAS APPOINTED AMBASSADOR TO BRAZIL BY PRESIDENT REAGAN. AND, IN 1983, PRESIDENT REAGAN APPOINTED HIM AS THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF STATE FOR INTER-AMERICAN AFFAIRS.

IN 1979-1981, HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE PROFESSIONAL STAFF OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON ARMED SERVICES. HE WAS A SENIOR RESEARCH FELLOW AT THE NATIONAL DEFENSE UNIVERSITY IN WASHINGTON, DC IN 1977-78.

IN 1976-77, HE WAS SPECIAL ASSISTANT TO THE PRESIDENT FOR NATIONAL SECURITY AFFAIRS. MR. MCFARLANE WAS EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT TO THE ASSISTANT TO THE PRESIDENT FOR NATIONAL SECURITY AFFAIRS IN 1975-76. FROM 1973-75, HE WAS MILITARY ASSISTANT TO DR. HENRY KISSINGER AT THE WHITE HOUSE.

MR. MCFARLANE IS RETIRED FROM THE MARINE CORPS (LT. COLONEL). HE IS A RECIPIENT OF THE DISTINGUISHED SERVICE MEDAL, THE NATION'S HIGHEST PEACETIME MILITARY DECORATION.
